

God's Word is a Feast

I've summed up the ministry God has given me on the video *Welcome!* at this link: https://youtu.be/XnVRQw2lhME. In that video I explain about the biblical interpretations the Lord has given me for His people. This is the most thorough and complicated one. Ideally, you should watch the movie *Babette's Feast (1987)* before reading my interpretation of it. The Lord first opened my eyes to it around 2009 while I was working on the chapter called *Table for Two* in the original book *Wake Up!*, which God used as the foundation for the ministry He's given me. I first saw the movie the summer I was born again in 1988. But this time, as soon as He brought it to mind again, I saw a picture of "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) as She is today—which is horrendously dry. It's God's view of His Church. He says "I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead" (Rev. 3:1, NIV). That doesn't necessarily mean dead as in not born again but as in not vibrant, born again but carnal. "Dead" because She's *ineffective*. It's also what Jesus prophesied would end up happening to His Church, the body of Christ, when He said "If people do these things when the tree is green ["these things" referring to torturing and crucifying the Son of God], what will happen when it is dry?" (Luke 23:31, NIV). My testimony, summed up in *Welcome!*, answers the question. And that's just speaking of what the born again do to hurt people, never mind what the lost do! In any case, in order to be able to follow along with my interpretation of the movie, you should watch the movie. Watch it with the subtitles turned on. Watch, listen, and read because God has something to say through *all* of it. So if you know the other languages He'll speak to you through those as well.

The movie is about how a chef knocks herself out coordinating every course of a meal to all but one oblivious dinner guest, doing it as taught by her mentor. Every morsel this chef planned to go into their mouths had been perfectly orchestrated so that with every bite the one who wasn't totally oblivious took, he was increasingly awakened to the mastery of the meal. In turn, he was amazed that no one else was aware of it. That's been my life for two over two decades, both as the chef and as the one who's not totally oblivious. While many *have* been getting enlightened to what's really going on in the world behind the scenes—the deep state, illuminati, New World Order, Agenda 21/2030, etc.—all one and the same thing—very few are actually enlightened to what's been going on with the body of Christ and what God has been doing behind the scenes. Ironically, the ones who should be the most enlightened seem to be the most asleep! It's the same thing that happened 2000 years ago so that Jesus "marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel" (Matt. 8:10, KJV). He found more faith in a Roman centurion than in the people who had been given the promises. Similarly, since I wasn't raised in a Christian home I'm kind of like that Roman.

However, the Executive Chef's ultimate aim—speaking of Jesus—is that *everyone* at the Table (the born again) take in every morsel for *all* its worth, because the one who devoured it as such (the general) was still at a loss not having the *fellowship* that would have made the meal at the Table what it was meant to be. Though a meal fit for royalty, the guests are royally dead *asleep*. This is exactly how it is in real life as I enjoy Chef Jesus' delicacies at the Table surrounded by the Oblivious Ones! God says to the "born again" (John 3:7, KJV), "Ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood...that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light" (1 Peter 2:9, KJV). But that's not what the majority of the body of Christ has been doing for most of Christian history as summed up with the timeline. Rather than "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ" (2 Pet. 3:18, KJV), the body of Christ as a whole "did not listen or pay attention; [so that] instead, they followed the stubborn inclinations of their evil hearts. They went backward and not forward" (Jer. 7:24, NIV)



God's Interest in Food. The Lord has expressed His interest in food throughout the Bible, as we see with the following passages:

O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him. (Ps. 34:8, KJV).

For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink (John 6:55, NIV).

Feed my sheep (John 21: 17, KJV).


Therefore, through the ministry He's entrusted to me (Hab. 2:2-3 below) He's acting as the Executive Chef and using me as His Sous Chef, like in the movie where Papin acts as the Executive Chef/Holy Spirit/Jesus and Babette acts as chef under his leading, his Sous Chef. It's basically what Jesus did when He walked the earth. "Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. [He was the Executive Chef since He made thousands of loaves out of a few.] Then he gave them to the disciples [His culinary staff], and the disciples gave them to the people" (Matt. 14:19, NIV). It's what *all* born again should be doing.

Habakkuk 2:2-3, KJV The LORD answered me, and said, Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may run that readeth it. For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry.

Since the Lord initially led me to believe He had called me to write the original book, *Wake Up!* for my former acquaintance, a woman from Indianapolis named Laura Walker—who I thought would enlighten others—looking on the web for a picture to insert in the book for her concerning the movie, I found a blurb that read something like this:

A story about two pious sisters...a meal fit for royalty in commemoration of a father [read Father], prepared by a devoted maid with a mysterious past, for the lucky few.

Since that parallels reality, in awe of Him, I clicked on another blurb and read that the movie was "enough to make a man re-evaluate his life" and immediately thought of many so called pastors who need to do just that, which should be clear to the born again with this graphic. And it's only for "the lucky few" since "narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it" (Matt. 7:14, KJV). Except in reality it has NOTHING to do with *luck* but with God who "worketh all things after the counsel of his own will" (Eph. 1:11, KJV).




Obviously, the Lord was saying *Follow Me*. So I ended up watching the movie dozens of times, and I'm sure that if I watched it again, He'd *still* show me more! (Editing this again in 2021 I found that to be true.) In fact, I haven't included all of the connections I've made since there are so many. It's just as John wrote. "There are also many other things which Jesus did, the which, if they should be written every one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that should be written" (John 21:25, KJV). That statement is true because "all things were created by [God, specifically speaking of Jesus], and for him" (Col. 1:16, KJV). Therefore, in the same way that you could take the most powerful telescope *and* the most powerful microscope and keep seeing more ordered detail, you can take *any* resource or situation and see increasingly more detail pointing to God's hand on it. The level of detail is never ending!

So as with all the biblical interpretations the Lord has given me for secular resources, this movie represents the personal relationship all elect can have with Christ as well as the relationship the Church, His soon to be Bride, the current BRAT, the body of Christ (Beauty Run Amuck Today), actually has with Him. She looks like a whore because that's how God views her (Jer. 3:3 in the graphic) since He, "our Maker is [our] husband" (Isa. 54:5, KJV). But since She's a "joinheir...with Christ" (Rom. 8:17, KJV) and, therefore, rich beyond measure, She's become a *royal* BRAT! It's essentially the same problem Satan ran into. God says of him "Thine heart was lifted up because of thy beauty, thou hast corrupted thy wisdom by reason of thy brightness" (Ezek. 28;17, KJV). Beauty, power, wealth, whatever we have an abundance of tends to corrupt us because, unlike God, we're *un*holy.



The Ages. God knows for how long this has actually been the case, but it appears that for centuries, at least, the body of Christ has focused on only two ages, this one and the afterlife, having lumped the next two along with the end of the ages together. I've summed up what Scripture reveals in this graphic and walk through it in *God's Plan: A Vision for the Body*.



Elect vs Non-Elect





"Vessels of mercy...afore prepared unto glory" (Rom. 9:23).
"Chosen...in him before the foundation of the world" (Eph. 1:4)



Unable to come to Christ.

"Of old ordained to this condemnation" (Jude 4).
"Vessels of wrath fitted to destruction" (Rom. 9:22).

Jesus is Knocking. If you're elect, a vessel "afore prepared unto glory" (Rom. 9:23, KJV) for this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT), whom Jesus refers to as His "sheep" (John 10:16, KJV), Jesus is the lover of your soul (Song. 5:2 & Rev. 3:20 below). Therefore, you should humbly watch the movie with faith in God having become born again, which you do by obeying Him since "the Holy Spirit...God has given to those who obey him" (Acts 5:32, NIV). You need to be like Samuel, the child (Mark 10:15 below), when he waited to hear from God and said "Speak, for your servant is listening" (1 Sam. 3:10, NIV). You need to *allow* Christ to minister to you because He will *not* invade your space if you're not interested in what He has to say. He can tell.

Song 5:2, KJV I sleep, but my heart waketh: it is the voice of my beloved that knocketh, saying, Open to me...my love, my dove.

Revelation 3:20, NIV Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me.

Mark 10;15, KJV Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein.

And just as it is with the Bible, every born again individual who is no longer being a "hypocrite" blinding him or herself with "beams" (Matt. 7:5, KJV), you'll see yourself in more than one of the characters, and will also see the Lord in more than one of the characters. And the closer you walk with Him, the more you'll see—the more confusing it is to write about! Therefore, I've divided this text into the following five sections:

Part One: The Cast

Part Two: Preparing for the Feast

Part Three: The FeastPart Four: After the Feast

Part Five: When the Guests are Gone

While there's some overlap, this is the clearest I've been able to make it. I've also used pictures from the movie to help people connect the dots.

About the Author. Do a little research on Isak Denison, aka Karen Blixen, and you'll see that there is nothing to suggest that she had any relationship *whatsoever* with Christ. She seems to have been like the typical unbeliever today, having bought into a mixture of Catholicism and all the other religions for a form of spirituality that appeals to man—a god of her own image. However, since "all things were created by him, and for him" (Col. 1:16, KJV) the Lord God was pleased to use this woman who *didn't* know Him to write a message of truth, love, and hope for the few who'll actually take Him seriously. It's only for a *few* "because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and **few** there be that find it"(Matt. 7:14, KJV). At His command, since "all things were created by him, and for him" (Col. 1:16, KJV), this story was made into a movie to help a generation wake up, roll up them sleeves, and start *cooking* because it's as He says "Feed my sheep" (John 21:17, KJV). May *you* turn out to be one of those servants.

PART ONE: THE CAST

All the characters from the real world are represented in the movie:

- Satan, the leading antichrist, a fallen angel;
- Father, Son, and His Spirit;
- Spiritual professionals and other Christian leaders;
- Followers of Christ;
- The lost; and
- Angels.

The Father/Pastor

The congregation, representing Christianity as most currently know it, treat this man as the Father, even calling him their Master, when he actually represents Satan, the leading antichrist. It's just how most of Christianity's leaders in reality represent Satan since "even now are there many antichrists" (1 John 2:18, KJV). They represent Satan because the institutional church system is not of Christ, summed up with the pyramids. And that's because Satan is "the god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV). That's why, as revealed in the graphic of the video, all denominational leaders bow to the pope who worships Lucifer, what Catholics like to call the Devil.





The institutional church doesn't just function like a business, it mirrors the satanic New World Order!

in the movie has his own sect, a denomination, which is in itself a lie since "there should be no division in the body" (1 Cor. 12:25, NIV). And the supposedly "faithful" worship him more than Jesus as prophesied in reality since "all the world [has] wondered after the beast" (Rev. 13:3, KJV). These professing Christians essentially view him as if he's God Most High since that's what Satan set out to do, "be like the most High" (Isa. 14:14, KJV). They do it because they haven't actually paid attention to what Jesus said. For one thing, we're supposed to "take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV). For another, we're in a brutal spiritual war with "spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph. 6:12, NIV). Again, God prophesied that this is what the body of Christ would do when He warned us that there would be a



great falling away from the truth before His return. Scripture says "Be not soon shaken in mind...as that the day of Christ is at hand...for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first" (2 Thess. 2:2-3, KJV). We've fulfilled it. God nails that point through my testimony. And it's obvious by the fact that we're supposed to "be...all of one mind" (1 Pet. 3:8, KJV) yet we're divided by tens of thousands of denominations according to Gordon-Comwell Theological Serminay. If there were only two denominations we'd be in rebellion and there's clearly more than two: Baptist, Pentecostal, Presbyterian, Brethren, Amish etc., to the tens of thousands!

Therefore, if you can't see that the body of Christ is in *outrageous* rebellion against Christ, you are spiritually blind. If you want to actually see what God is doing and hear what He's saying to the body of Christ you need to be honest. That's key because Jesus says "I am...the truth" (John 14:6, KJV) and "the devil...is a liar" (John 8:44, KJV). Every single time we're not being honest we're honoring Satan and "giv[ing] the devil a foothold" (Eph. 4:27, NIV). It's what the body of Christ has been doing for most of the past 2000 years!

So this man in the movie is cold, self-centered, arrogant, condescending, and downright wicked. He's like all "hireling[s who] care...not for the sheep" (John 10:13, KJV). Whether they realize what they're doing or not—some do and some don't—they are all actually serving Satan as his "ministers" (2 Cor. 11:15, KJV) to one degree or another since that system belongs to Satan. And since the truth of God's Word doesn't change, modern day hirelings are just like the Pharisees who "loved the praise of men more than the praise of God" (John 12:43, KJV). Try holding them accountable to God's Word and you'll see that first hand. My 22 year testimony reveals that they *all* reject the truth when confronted with it. But, according to God, at some point—in God's "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV)—that will change for some of them.

And knowing the body of Christ would honor hirelings more than Him, Jesus warned us saying the following:

Beware of the scribes, which love to go in long clothing, and love salutations in the marketplaces, And the chief seats in the synagogues, and the uppermost rooms at feasts [and the discount they get from the government, for example, like 501c3]: Which devour widows' houses, and for a pretence make long prayers: these shall receive greater damnation (Mark 12:38-40, KJV).



Except the literal translation doesn't call it *damnation* but "more abundant judgment" (Marl 12:40, YLT). Damnation, as you can see with the web definition, has an eternal connotation to it when that's not what God is saying. It's a bad translation provided for us by "hireling[s who] care...not for the sheep" (John 10:13, KJV), the Bible translators.

As their so-called pastor, he—and hirelings in general—keeps his daughters (representing elect church-goers) to himself rather than letting them grow and develop as God meant for them to do. And they're not even *his* daughters. They are our heavenly Father's children, his only on loan since he represents the "ruler of this world" (John 12:31, YLT), Satan—a position God allowed Satan to have since no one can do *anything* without His permission. Jesus said, for example, "Apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5, KJV). He wasn't just talking about humans since "in him we [all] live, and move, and have our being" (Acts 17:28, KJV). Therefore, when Jesus walked the earth "the devils besought him, saying, If thou cast us out, suffer us to go away into the herd of swine. And he said unto them, Go" (Matt. 8:31-32, KJV). He gave them permission.

And God said "Let both grow together until the harvest" (Matt. 13:30, KJV). "Both" refers to elect and non-elect which are further broken down into human and supernatural beings. Therefore, in the movie as in real life, the man joins hands with the Catholic just like Protestant leaders do by bowing to the pope as you saw on the graphic on the previous page for the video someone else made. It's what they do in all those ecumenical gatherings. In turn, God continues to say to the body of Christ, "I have this against you: You tolerate that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophet. By her teaching she misleads my servants" (Rev. 2:20, NIV). That "woman" in this case is the Catholic mother. I walk through it elsewhere. She's not "The Mother Of Harlots" (Rev. 17:5, KJV), but a mother of harlots.

And yet, the man named his daughters after reformers. It was a good lie—"and no wonder, for Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light. It is not surprising, then, if his servants also masquerade as servants of righteousness. [But] Their end will be what their actions deserve" (2 Cor. 11:14-15, NIV).

Since Satan won't be able to enter God's kingdom until after he's paid his dues at the end of the ages (Isa. 14:12; Rev. 14:11 & Isa. 27:1-5 below)—unlike what the body of Christ has been teaching for most of Christian history—he tries to keep others from getting into God's kingdom by using his "ministers" (2 Cor. 11:15, KJV). Therefore, God says to them "Wo to you...hypocrites! because ye go round the sea and the dry land to make one proselyte [one convert], and whenever it may happen—ye make him a son of gehenna twofold more than yourselves" (Matt. 23:15, YLT). While Gehenna has been translated by the unfaithful hirelings into *hell* in most Bibles, it's more like hell on earth since Gehenna was a place on earth. Hell as we've been brainwashed to think of it does not actually exist according to sound doctrine—covered in *God's Plan: A Vision for the Body*. The only real hell is that which men create on earth. However, Scripture is clear that dishonoring Christ has *very severe* consequences both during this life and after it.

Isaiah 14:12, NIV How you have fallen from heaven, morning star, son of the dawn! You have been cast down to the earth, you who once laid low the nations!

Revelation 14:11, YLT The smoke of their torment doth go up to ages of ages [referring to Satan's and all who served him].

Isaiah 27:1-5, YLT Leviathan—a fleeing serpent, And on leviathan—a crooked serpent...he doth take hold on My strength, He doth make peace with Me.

Being the most arrogant of God's creations having been made the most beautiful (Ezek. 28:14-17 below), Satan gets a kick out of breaking hearts. You see it in the movie right after he delivered the Dear John letter to Papin. He's laughing to himself. Leaders of the institutional churches do this for Satan, break people's hearts, as his "ministers" (2 Cor. 11:15, KJV) because they sin like crazy, turn a blind eye to sin and corruption among professing Christians, and chase away those of us who hold them accountable. "Knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them" (Rom. 1:32, KJV). They know it's worthy of death since "the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23, KJV) and they themselves preach it. Yet they nevertheless "eat the bread of wickedness, and drink the wine of violence" (Prov. 4:17, KJV). Woe to them!



Ezekiel 28:14-17, KJV Thou art the anointed cherub that covereth; and I have set thee so: thou wast upon the holy mountain of God...Thine heart was lifted up because of thy beauty, thou hast corrupted thy wisdom by reason of thy brightness: I will cast thee to the ground, I will lay thee before kings, that they may behold thee.

Therefore, their "mouths must be stopped [since they] subvert whole houses, teaching things which they ought not, for filthy lucre's sake" (Titus 1:11, KJV). They've made a *career* out of supposedly serving God when that's the exact opposite of what Jesus modeled and taught and what the New Testament teaches, as with this passage. "Unlike so many, we do not peddle the word of God for profit. On the contrary, in Christ we speak before God with sincerity, as those sent from God" (2 Cor. 2:17, NIV). Those of us who serve God out of a pure heart do it without pay, like Babette in the movie.

The Father/Pastor's Prayers. The pastor represents Satan and all who've compromised their faith by joining hands with darkness. The body of Christ was warned "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?" (2 Cor. 6:14, KJV). The answer is *none*. So this man, along with his congregation, *recites* prayers that have truth sprinkled in them but which run dry since "God heareth not sinners" (John 9:31, KJV). We know the prayers of most hirelings and their congregants in the real world have run dry since most of them haven't matured in Christ. If they had the body of Christ today would resemble the Church of Acts, summed up in the graphic. And we're not that!

The First Christians were Highly Empowered by God because they Obeyed Him as Individuals and as a Group

- They spoke in languages they hadn't studied (Acts 2:4-6);
- . They healed the sick (Acts 3:2-7);
- . They raised the dead (Acts 9:37-41);
- They drove out demons (Acts 16:16-18);
- . They witnessed boldly (Acts 4:4);
- . They prayed for their attackers as they killed them (Acts 7:58-60);
- . They enlightened thousands at a time (Acts 7:58-60);
- Their shadows provided healing (Acts 5:14-16);
- Unbelievers admired them (Acts 2:47);
- They beamed around like in Star Trek (Acts 8:39-40);
- They were full of wisdom (Acts 6:3);
- . They were full of generosity (Acts 4:34-35); and,
- . They were full of joy (Acts 2:46).

Lorenz Lowenhielm

At different times, in different scenes, Lorenz (all unruly looking in the picture) represents either of the following: elect so-called church leaders, the "hireling[s who] careth not for the sheep" (John 10:13, KJV); "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) as a whole; and the Lord Jesus Christ.



Disgracing the Name of Christ. Representing both the body of Christ as a whole as well as elect but not terribly enlightened leaders within the institutional churches, Lorenz disgraces the uniform he wears being "a [bad] soldier of Jesus Christ" (2 Tim. 2:3, KJV). He doesn't just dishonor himself but makes it so that "the name of God is blasphemed among [the lost] through [him and those like him, the hypocrites], as it is written" (Rom. 2:24, KJV). He makes his whole team look bad, all those soldiers who represent the body of Christ. He's immature, reckless, thoughtless, brutish, ungrateful, self-centered, and exceedingly irresponsible, in uniform. Today's Christian leaders, along with the entire body of Christ, also 'wear a uniform' in that they call themselves *Christian* or *believers*. Those labels work like a uniform since everyone knows that we professes to know the One true God. And that rude burp he gives pretty much sums it up. *That's* the level of respect the body of Christ currently gives Christ.

So while some of these people in the movie representing reality *are* born again, they're apostate/backslidden/prodigal to one degree or another—mostly to a very high degree (with the exception of Babette and Erik). And many of them are not actually born again while being elect. And some of them aren't even elect but servants of Satan *purposely* deceiving the people, covered in some of my other material. All professing Christians today, professing believers, fall into one of the following three categories:

- 1. Not actually born again, not Christian;
- 2. Born again but backslidden; or
- 3. Born again follower of Christ.

And since I haven't been able to get through to *anyone* in over two decades it's clear that God is saying there are very few actual followers of Christ in the world today. However, you can follow someone, in this case Christ, closely, not so closely or even at quite a distance. For example, I could follow someone so closely I'm touching them. But, at the other extreme, I could follow them by moving to France four months later. And since the body of Christ is divided by tens of thousands of unbiblical denominations, it's like that's how far we're following Christ as if there are tens of thousands of miles between us and the Lord!

Christ and the Leading Antichrist. Lorenz's uniform represents both Christ and the leading antichrist, Satan. He represent Christ since we have been called to function as an army to "fight the good fight of faith" (1 Tim. 6:12, KJV) "suffering, like a good soldier of Christ Jesus" (2 Tim. 2:3, NIV). However, our fight is *spiritual*. "We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against...spiritual wickedness in high places" (Eph. 6:12, KJV). Therefore, "the weapons of our warfare are not carnal" (2 Cor. 10:4, KJV). Our main weapon is "the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God" (Eph. 6:17, KJV). Members of the body of Christ will win their battles by learning to wield this Sword, the Word of God, as God has me demonstrating throughout this ministry. And Lorenz's uniform represents the "man of war: the LORD is his name" (Ex. 15:3, KJV)—who is not Lord God but Lord Satan the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV). I


cover it in detail in *Satan Exposed: Rightly Dividing the Word*. "For the Son of man is not come to destroy men's lives, but to save them" (Luke 9:56, KJV). Not having gotten in the habit of "bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, KJV), the body of Christ has been deceived to think that Jesus is a "man of war" (Ex. 15:3, KJV) when "God is light, and in him is no darkness at all" (1 John 1:5, KJV). War is *very* dark since it does stuff like this picture. Can you honestly picture Jesus telling His disciples to level a town so that children are killed or left to die a slow death fending for themselves? No! This is the work of Satan and those who serve him because "him that had the power of death, that is, the devil" (Heb. 2:14, KJV). God gave him that power for the "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT) to fulfill His



higher purposes. Essentially, He's revealing human depravity along with His goodness, covered in God's Plan.

Refusing to Repent. Notice Lorenz's response when his friend gives him sound advice at the card table. He couldn't care less. He says "Eh" as in *Lay off*. It's how the hirelings respond to God—along with the rest of the body of Christ—as He has people like me reach out to them, trying to *help* them. They are "foolish...and ignorant...beast[s] before [Him]" (Ps. 73:22, KJV). I can make that sweeping generalization since God has had me reaching out to professing Christians around the world for over two decades and the response has always been the same.

Under God's Judgment. Because of his reckless and thoughtless behavior, his father (representing God, the Father) sends him away on punishment. It's what God has done to the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) as a whole. He says "The showers have been withholden, and there hath been no latter rain [other than a trickle]; [because] thou [born again] hadst a whore's forehead, [and] thou refusedst to be ashamed" (Jer. 3:3, KJV). This is revealed by both Christian history and my 22-year testimony which I summed up on my *Welcome!* video.



So while the body of Christ is under God's judgment (along with the rest of the world)—since "judgment must begin at the house of God" (1 Pet. 4:17, KJV)—He also says "For a small moment have I forsaken thee; but with great mercies will I gather thee" (Isa. 54:7, KJV). It's what He's being doing for decades so that many have been waking up to some of the sins of the world and/or of the body of Christ. And the ministry He has entrusted to me reveals "great mercies." While it seems to humans that God has abandoned us, even to born again Christians as if He's forgotten us for a *really* long time, it is "a small moment" (Isa. 54:7, KJV) because "one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day" (2 Pet. 3:8, KJV).

Enlightened Yet Still Self Absorbed. Being self-absorbed, just like the majority of the body of Christ—and just like the lost—Lorenz builds his life on himself. While having had a "mighty vision" as we're informed in the scene right after he encounters Martina with the milk pail—in other words, having been informed of the Gospel message—he spends most of his life treating God as a god who enables him to manipulate circumstances and people for his own gain and glory. This is what most of the body of Christ has historically done since "all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's" (Phil. 2:21, KJV) while professing to love Christ. It's evident by the current state of the Church and world. He even says the exact words of what the majority have done, focused on their careers. Born again Christians have been able to do this because, like Lorenz in the movie, they initially put some effort into honoring God so that they became born again since "the Holy Spirit...God has given to those who obey him" (Acts 5:32, NIV). However, like Lorenz they were actually still more interested in the world when Scripture says "Be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God" (Rom. 12:2, KJV). This graphic sums up what we were supposed to do.

So while you wouldn't think people like Lorenz and most of today's born again are actually born again because of the things they say and do as compared with the new covenant Jesus made with His life, God "put[s] his Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come" (2 Cor. 1:22, NIV). Unlike what many teach, Scripture tells us that once God has given us His Spirit He doesn't remove it when we rebel, so that we cannot become unborn again. However, the born again who don't grow in Christ will have wasted their time on earth as we see Lorenz has done in the movie. In the end, staring at himself with all his medals, he recognizes that it was *all* "vanity." None of it actually meant *anything*. And that's because when God tests our works after this life is over, everything we did




that was not part of the "good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in" (Eph. 2:10, KJV) will burn even if what we did was actually a good work. Scripture clearly says "whatever does not proceed from faith is sin" (Rom. 14:23, ESV). Therefore, the born again soul will "suffer loss" (1 Cor. 3:15, KJV). And in the worst case scenario enter the next age "saved...though only as one escaping through the flames" (1 Cor. 3:15, NIV). These people will get to experience the Lord's millennial reign, a time about which Scripture says Scripture says "they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years" (Rev. 20:4, KJV), but having barely escaped through the flames they'll have *nothing* to show for themselves. It'll be so bad God describes it as if walking around naked. He says "I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eyesalve, that thou mayest see" (Rev. 3:18, KJV). Since you can be born again yet get saved as by fire, you can end up naked and/or with eyes that do not see very well. It's what's happened to most of the body of Christ historically as God is proving through this ministry in which He has me refer to the work of many. So it's not as if I'm saying I'm the only one who can see anything spiritual. In fact, everyone can see some, including the lost (except they don't interpret it correctly).

Rather than "fight the good fight of faith" (1 Tim. 6:12, KJV) the majority of the born again have historically been *helping* Satan fulfill his desires of being "like the most High" (Isa. 14:14, KJV) and of deceiving the nations, "for by [his] sorceries [a]re all nations deceived" (Rev. 18:23, KJV). Because, if the born again were honest, they'd admit that the time they give Christ as compared to the time they give Satan, "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV), isn't even as much as the pie chart representing a 24 hour day.

For example, my husband who professes to believe in Jesus and who God showed me is actually born again, spends most of his time working for the Department of Defence (DOD). In fact, if he had discernment he *wouldn't* work for the DOD since "we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against...spiritual wickedness in high places" (Eph. 6:12, KJV). So while everyone needs to make a living, and he's providing for his family by working for the DOD, he could use his PhD brain to serve God. Neither does he spend his free time in a way that reveals Christ is even a part of his life. Because if he did, being that I'm his wife, I would know about it. Though that hasn't always been the case, just as it wasn't in the movie for Lorenz. In the beginning Lorenz kept coming for services. Yet with each visit God became increasingly less significant to him which happens very quickly in real life, as in the movie.

And the reason it happens is because, as in the movie, he saw how insignificant he was among the congregation. These people are as cold as ice! Therefore, when he's choking rather than express concern they give him dirty looks! And as a "Black" man in a "mixed" marriage, that's pretty much the reception in the so-called churches. So in the movie he says he's discovered how cruel this world can be because of *their* manner. And that's exactly how it is because even born again Christians are as cold as ice—no matter what your skin tone (since I'm not "Black")—when they're supposed be expressing love. In fact, they're the only ones with ability to express genuine love being that "God is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV). Genuine love comes from God and only born again Christians are connected to Him. The born again are the only ones in the whole world who have the ability to express genuine love. And they don't.





And the fact that my husband is a nice man as far as men go, fools him, just like many professing and born again Christians are fooled by their "nice" behavior or worldly success—just like Lorenz fooled himself in the movie (along with the congregation). Except if being nice and/or successful in this world were all that's required by God to not fall into condemnation, Jesus wouldn't have needed to go to the Cross since lost souls can be very nice when they want to be as well as successful. Neither would God have had the New Testament written for us if submission to Christ wasn't required. Jesus says "Whoever has my commands and keeps them is the one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show myself to them" (John 14:21, NIV). God is revealing through this ministry how He has shown Himself to me, especially through these biblical interpretations. And how many people online do you know who are doing this?! Again, Scripture clearly says that "there is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit" (Rom. 8:1, KJV). Christ "gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works" (Titus 2:14, KJV). And, again, those works are the "good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in" (Eph. 2:10, KJV) not so-called good works which honor the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV) and improve our standing here on earth. God's good works improve our standing in His kingdom, the millennial reign of Christ, and do NOT honor the god of this world.

And eventually all born again will see—either during this life or after it—that their "nice" behavior wasn't actually all that nice. Scripture says "some men's sins are open beforehand, going before to judgment; and some men they follow after" (1 Tim. 5:24, KJV). But sooner or later it will all be out in the open "for there is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed, or hidden that will not be made known" (Matt. 10:26, NIV).

Using Christ while Being Used by Satan. Like most Christians, especially those in leadership, Lorenz uses Christian jargon to impress people. And they're impressed because "man looketh on the outward appearance [when] the LORD looketh on the heart" (1 Sam. 16:7, KJV). Having historically ignored the war we're in with "the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph. 6:12, NIV), most professing Christians take other professing Christians at face value, impressed by their use of Christian terms and phrases and/or by their involvement in so-called Christian activities—just as long as those people aren't holding them accountable.



However, Jesus clearly warned us in the following passage that you can even prophesy and perform miracles while not actually being born again:

Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven. Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity (Matt. 7:21-23, KJV).

Lost servants of Satan can prophesy, cast out devils and perform miracles because their "coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders" (2 Thess. 2:9, KJV). And you don't have to be purposely serving Satan to get used by him since we all get used by him. "For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, and hating one another" (Titus 3:3, KJV). And, again, you can be born again and worldly, serving Satan. The only way to make sure we *don't* get used by Satan as a born again Christian is by "casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bring...into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor 10:5, KJV).

And none of us has done that. Not even close.

Letting Satan Reign. Representing Christ—a gentleman who does not force Himself upon anyone—this officer (Lorenz) stepped aside and left the woman he loved. He says "He's the benefactor, your father. I understand." Satan is the "benefactor" since he's "the ruler" (John 12:31, YLT) and "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV). In reality, Jesus stepped aside and allowed His Beloved, the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV), to have an affair with his rival, Satan, accepting Her will since She did just as the Israelites did so that the Lord said, and still says, "They have rejected me, that I should not reign over them" (1 Sam. 8:7, KJV). Christ stepped aside and allowed Satan to reign knowing the Father's plan

for the ages, that in the end everyone who has ever lived will become like Him and all will submit to God the Father and, therefore, love one another, as we're informed (at least somewhat) in the following passage:

For he [Jesus] must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet. The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death...And when all things shall be subdued unto him, then shall the Son also himself be subject unto him that put all things under him, that God may be all in all (1 Cor. 15:25-28, KJV).

Essentially, God is revealing through our actions that the born again have *still* behaved just like the Israelites and Pharisees who did not have His Spirit within, "for all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's" (Phil. 2:21, KJV). While lying to themselves, the born again, for the most part, have only loved the Lord as long as it hasn't been too inconvenient for them when being a follower of Christ is the most inconvenient way of life there is! And that's *especially* true in our day since we're practically at the end of this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT).

Because God "does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities" (Ps. 103:10, NIV), in the movie, Lorenz represents Christ when he tells the woman he loves that he's leaving to spend his life "beyond the mountain and the sea." While God does not ever leave the born again having said to us "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you" (Heb. 13:5, NIV), He has temporarily left us as a group until we see Him again in a fresh outpouring following this revelation and genuine repentance. Jesus said "Ye shall not see me henceforth, till ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord" (Matt. 23:39, KJV)—not until the born again admit when people like me are coming to you in the name of the Lord. In other words, He has left the body of Christ until the "latter rain" (Joel 2:23, KJV), the peak of which is the time of the two witnesses as we're told in the following passages:

He shall come down like rain upon the mown grass: as showers that water the earth (Ps. 72:6, KJV).

I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days [3½ years], clothed in sackcloth (Ps. 72:6 & Rev. 11:3, KJV).

The "two witnesses" are not two people but the born again who were originally Hebrews or Gentiles. God has given us the "Holy Spirit" to be His "witnesses" (Acts 1:8, NIV). I cover it elsewhere in my material.

Achille Papin

In different scenes Achille Papin represents one of the following four different characters: Jesus, the holy Spirit, the Father, and also the weakness in the born again.

Papin is Catholic. It's odd that God would use a Catholic to play Him, but as Papin clearly reveals during the scene where he introduces himself to the pastor, he's only "papist" in the most nominal sense, just as *most* Catholics, born again Christians, Muslims, and Jews are nominal. Except for a few zealots, the majority in all the religions are only slightly committed to their faith. It's the reason the majority of the world's elect have historically fallen for false prophets. Not having taken God *seriously* they left themselves wide open to Satan's deceptions so that many elect have historically had—and will continue to have—their name *erased* from the book of life. God says "He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the book of life" (Rev. 3:5, KJV).





And while it's a bad thing that most professing Christians don't really know the One they profess to believe in, it's a *good* thing that most of the lost don't really know what they believe either. Because, when a remnant of born again Christians finally repents and fully honors Christ, as prophesied (Rev. 11:3 below), it will be easier for the lost elect to come around since they're not really *committed* to the wrong side. And all the trials we'll be facing—"great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time" (Matt. 24:21, KJV)—will help motivate them.

Revelation 11:3, KJV I will give power unto my two witnesses [born again Jews and Gentiles], and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days [3½ years], clothed in sackcloth [genuinely repentant].

Papin as Jesus. Representing the Lord, Papin longs for more even though He has it all. It's as He said, "All things that the Father hath are mine" (John 16:15, KJV). In other words, Christ is like Adam before Eve when God said "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him" (Gen. 2:18, KJV). The Lord's "help meet" is the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV), the soon to be Bride of Christ. (She's supposed to be *helping* Him!) So when Papin discovers Philippa drawn to the meeting house by her voice, He



thanks the Father for her and longs to make her a lady, *the* Lady (Eph. 5:25-27 & Isa. 54:5 below). He knows that 'love will unite them' since "God is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV), which *is* what happens in the end of the movie when you read between the lines and also what will happen at the end of this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT).

Ephesians 5:25-27, KJV Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it; That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish.

Isaiah 54:5, KJV For thy Maker is thine husband; the LORD of hosts is his name; and thy Redeemer the Holy One of Israel; The God of the whole earth shall he be called.

Representing Christ, entering the meeting house having heard Her voice, Papin/Jesus is full of love for the Bride the Father has promised Him, as well as being filled with gratitude to the Father for Her. The role played by Papin is the song of Solomon as he comes knocking while she's in bed—"asleep" (Matt. 25:5, KJV)—and takes a bit too long to wake up, which is exactly what's happened as revealed by my walk of the past two decades, as well as Christian history:

I sleep, but my heart waketh: it is the voice of my beloved that knocketh, saying, Open to me, my sister, my love, my dove, my undefiled: for my head is filled with dew, and my locks with the drops of the night. I have put off my coat; how shall I put it on? I have washed my feet; how shall I defile them? My beloved put in his hand by the hole of the door, and my bowels were moved for him. I rose up to open to my beloved; and my hands dropped with myrrh, and my fingers with sweet smelling myrrh, upon the handles of the lock. I opened to my beloved; but my beloved had withdrawn himself, and was gone (Song. 5:2-6, KJV).

Get up and put on your running shoes because He's a Catch! *The* Catch! We've been told to "run, that ye may obtain" (1 Cor. 9:24, KJV). And it's what she does in the passage. We read that "the watchmen that went about the city found me...I charge you, O daughters of Jerusalem, if ye find my beloved, that ye tell him, that I am sick of love" (Song 5:7-6, KJV). And He says "Ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart" (Jer. 29:13, KJV).

His Rejection. Out of fear for lacking faith and devotion, the girl in the movie (Phillipa) rejects Papin, who represents the Lord. This parallels how the body of Christ rejects God's prophets, which is to reject Him since Jesus says "Whoso shall receive one such little child in my name receiveth me" (Matt. 18:5, KJV). Therefore, the opposite is true. Reject one of His children and you reject Him. And the New Testament says "there is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear" (1 John 4:18 below). But because the body of Christ has not matured in Christ, they do not have "perfect love" and therefore fear anyone saying something different than what they've been taught. Except what the body of Christ has been taught by the hirelings doesn't actually line up with the new covenant! And the majority don't realize it because they don't "take captive [hardly any of their] thought[s]...to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV).




Having rejected Papin, who represents Jesus, the world—for the most part—has been left without His highest voice on earth—the one with "beautiful...feet...that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things! (Rom. 10:15, KJV), and hands by which to genuinely *minister* to people (Matt. 25:45 below), as well as a mouth by which to speak words of truth and wisdom (Luke 6:45 below).

Matthew 25:45, KJV [Jesus said], Inasmuch as ye did it not to one of the least of these, ye did it not to me.

Luke 6:45, KJV A good man out of the good treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is evil: for of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaketh.

Instead, the *main* voice heard in the land/the world is the pastor's (the antichrist's). *That* voice and image of God is the primary one that exists today and which has existed for most of this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT)—a cold, self-centered, jealous, shallow, wicked version of the truth, of Jesus who is "the truth" (John 14:6, KJV). Because, Satan set out to "be like the most High" (Isa. 14:14, KJV). And, as prophesied, "all the world wonder[s] after the beast" (Rev. 13:3, KJV) including the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) to one degree or another since She's apostate, also called prodigal or backslidden.



That being the case She believes false doctrines like the one about God sending most of the people He created and for whom He gave His life on the Cross to eternal burning hell when "God is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV) and "in him there is no darkness at all" (1 John 1:5, NIV). I summed it up with this graphic and cover it in *God's Plan*. Not having taken God as seriously as we should have, the born again have historically been massive hypocrites with increasingly more beams in their eyes *blinding* them (Matt. 7:5 in the graphic). And Jesus says "Hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly" (Matt. 7:5, KJV). Preaching a gospel of eternal burning hell for most of the people God created is not the "gospel of peace" and neither can it *honestly* be considered "good news" (Matt. 4:23, KJV).




Papin as the Spirit. God's voice on earth, that of His Spirit, is quite subtle and played by Papin. You get the subtle effect of it when he writes in the letter to the sisters saying "Babette can cook" when not only can she cook, she's a genius at what she does, the best in her trade. While it's the most important thing about her it's only one short sentence buried among several pages. It's like the treasure Jesus spoke about when He said "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field" (Matt. 13:44, NIV). Had the people in the movie and members of the body of Christ in reality been discerning they would have found out *decades* earlier about Babette's culinary genius. And that again parallels my testimony and ministry since no one else is interpreting God's Word in secular resources. It's also what all mature born again should be doing. In any case, the Spirit works things out among the brethren, God's body throughout the world, as we've been informed:

The Spirit of truth...guide[s] you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come. He shall glorify me [says Jesus]: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew it unto you (John 16:13-14, KJV).

Receiving from Him and showing it to you is what the Lord has me doing as led by the Spirit.

So, again, you see Papin used like the Spirit in the movie especially concerning Babette. She's led to the sisters/the body of Christ by him and is also encouraged by him. Therefore, Babette lives out the life she was meant to live—at least somewhat—in spite of the deadbeat Christians on her path. And that's my personal testimony. My life parallels Babette's from the movie, spiritually speaking, serving without pay and without being admitted into the group of so-called believers for years, more than two decades (so far). In other words, the body of Christ has totally ignored God's teaching concerning the body! If you say anything to them that doesn't line up with the lies they believe even though it lines up with Scripture, they—at best—blow you off.



In Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. Romans 12:5, NIV **Papin Means Father.** In many languages Papa means father, and in Spanish (my native language) Papi means Daddy, so it's what I called mine until he died when I was eleven. And *Papi* sure looks like *Papin*. Speaking to the born again, the New Testament says "because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father" (Gal. 4:6, KJV). Jews call the man *Abba*. Americans *Daddy*. Latinos call him *Papi*. And in the movie He's Papin.

Papin as Our Weakness. Achille Papin also represents our *Achilles* heel, one's vulnerable spot. God's Spirit *is* that because we can't see Him. Also, because of God's grace. Focusing on God's grace the body of Christ, rather than fear God which is "the beginning of wisdom" (Prov. 9:10, KJV), fear men—are more concerned with what men think of us—since we can see them. God has been **so gracious** to us by having forgiven our sins through Christ that, rather than take Him seriously, ironically, we've ignored Him! We've been like the nine lepers in the following passage who took the healing/salvation and ran with it, ignoring their need to show their gratitude:

There met him ten men that were lepers, which stood afar off: And they lifted up their voices, and said, Jesus, Master, have mercy on us. And when he saw them, he said unto them, Go shew yourselves unto the priests. And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were cleansed. And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God, And fell down on his face at his feet, giving him thanks: and he was a Samaritan. And Jesus answering said, Were there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine? There are not found that returned to give glory to God, save this stranger (Luke 17:12-18, KJV).

God's grace has worked like our Achilles heel. Because God has been so gracious, we've trampled over Him and, for the most part, taken Jesus for granted! And doing it while professing to love Him! We're appalling.

While men can kill us, Christians mostly fear they'll make fun of us! Like the Jews who "fear[ed] the people" (Matt. 21:26, KJV), born again Christians also fear the people. Yet God, who we *should* fear since He can do us more damage to us than mere humans by handing us over to Satan (1 Cor. 5:5 below)—we *don't* fear. And He sure enough is making fun of us through this ministry! (Ps. 2:4 below). A good example of that is with the video and song *Needing Getting* by OK Go, the official video, summed up in the graphic. The Lord has had me interpret the whole song in the booklet *Needing Getting*—for which I may or may not make a video.

1 Corinthians 5:5, NIV Hand this man over to Satan for the destruction of the flesh, so that his spirit may be saved on the day of the Lord.

Psalm 2:4, YLT He who is sitting in the heavens doth laugh, The Lord doth mock at them.



OK Go - Needing/Getting - Official Video








The Sisters

The two sisters represent Christianity, more specifically so called mature Christians. I'm thinking Martina represents professing Christians who aren't actually born again, those who'll one day hear "I never knew you: depart from me" (Matt. 7:23, KJV)—if they don't soon get right with God and become born again. She was able to give Lorenz a "mighty vision" so that, spiritually speaking, he became born again because that's how it works. God uses all of us *in spite* of us, for the most part. Therefore, you can get enlightened to the truth and become born again in that apostate system called Christianity and through those "hireling[s who] careth not for the sheep" (John 10:13, KJV) since they preach the truth even though it's mixed with lies. It's something of what Paul was getting at when he wrote "I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway" (1 Cor. 9:27, KJV). You can preach the truth while not actually personally knowing the Truth, the Man, God's Christ. Again, it's what He said in the following passage in that many will have prophesied, among other things, and yet be cast away, told to depart:

Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven. Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity (Matt. 7:21-23, KJV).

And Philippa represents the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) those who are actually born again. Together they represent *leaders* within the body of Christ. It's what Jesus said. "Let both grow together until the harvest" (Matt. 13:30, KJV). And according to several prophecies, covered throughout my material, and summed up with this graphic, we're just about there, just about at the time of the Lord's return, the harvest.



Leaders within the Body of Christ. The sisters represent the myriads of people who have taken leadership roles in both the institutional and house churches just because they have a family history in ministry, they've gone to seminary, they've been around longer than others, they have a following, or just felt like it.

In contrast, the biblical way of becoming a leader within the body of Christ is by way of God's leading. He says "No man taketh this honour unto himself, but he that is called of God" (Heb. 5:4, KJV). It involves prayer and fasting so that God enlightens you, and/or being selected out of those who are *obviously* filled with His Spirit as revealed in the following account:

It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the word of God in order to wait on tables. Brothers and sisters, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them and will give our attention to prayer and the ministry of the word." This proposal pleased the whole group. They chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit; also Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas from Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them (Acts 6:2-6, NIV).

Or, like Saul, God may stop you in your tracks, as we see in this passage:

Saul, yet breathing out threatenings and slaughter against the disciples of the Lord...And as he journeyed, he came near Damascus: and suddenly there shined round about him a light from heaven: And he fell to the earth, and heard a voice saying unto him, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? And he said, Who art thou, Lord? And the Lord said, I am Jesus whom thou persecutest: it is hard for thee to kick against the pricks. And he trembling and astonished said, Lord, what wilt thou have me to do? And the Lord said unto him, Arise, and go into the city, and it shall be told thee what thou must do (Acts 9:1-6, KJV).

The New Testament also says the following:

If a man desire the office of a bishop [translated as *overseer* in the literal version], he desireth a good work. [An overseer] then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behaviour, given to hospitality, apt to teach; Not given to wine, no striker, not greedy of filthy lucre; but patient, not a brawler, not covetous; One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity; (For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?) Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into the condemnation of the devil. Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without; lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil (1 Tim. 3:17, KJV).

Martina. Her heart was so hard and her eyes so blind that she didn't even realize the lover of her soul—her soul mate—was wooing her for an entire season. Only after Lorenz left did she consider that maybe someone very special had gone. Having been insensitive to Lorenz, who represents Christ, she spends her whole life *going through the motions* of good works, rather than actually 'living' and fulfilling her calling, just like "the Pharisees and lawyers [who] rejected the counsel of God against themselves" (Luke 7:30, KJV). Like them she professes to know God and considers herself faithful—just like most professing Christians. So while she thinks she has it all, every now and then she gets pangs of doubt as you see throughout the movie. It's like how most professing Christians go through the motions of playing at church rather than actually *being* the Church, and must surely question every now and then if there's not something they're missing! (Or maybe they're too asleep/too worldly to even notice that much!)

Even as they clear the table at the very end of the movie, Martina is *still* **very** slow to grasp it all, they both are—and *that's* how it is. God has made the point since He's had me following Him through the churches and Christian groups for over three decades reaching out to them for over two decades and I've yet to be able to get through to *anyone*. While some at first seem to get it, they haven't because the Word God gave me about it is that they will "run" with the vision (Hab. 2:2-3 below) and no one has yet done that. Since we've been so unfaithful as a group we're under God's judgment so that it hasn't yet been His "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV).

Habakkuk 2:2-3, KJV The LORD answered me, and said, Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may run that readeth it. For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come.



Philippa. She also turned the Lover of Her Soul away too afraid to trust Him. But soon after having rejected Him she realizes that no one would *ever* love her as He did. Like her sister, she rejected the most important Man of her life. Notice her face as this dawns on her. And check out the look her 'beloved' father/pastor gives her. *There's* love a la BRAT (Titus 3:3 below). It's NOT love!

Titus 3:3, NIV Being hated and hating one another.

Yet, like her sister, she won't grasp the depths of what she's done until she's wasted most of her life and dines at the table on the feast prepared by the Chef's right hand, Babette. Even then it takes her a while. And that's how it's playing out in real life.

As the soprano, Philippa is God's highest voice on earth so that she represents the more mature born again. Yet she ends up singing only among her little group of carnal unbelieving 'believers' whose increasing quarrels eventually completely drown out her voice—again, representing God's Spirit among the body of Christ today. We've nearly TOTALLY drowned Him out since we "nullify the word of God [by]...our tradition[s]" (Matt. 15:6, NIV) and lack of love. That's made very clear by my testimony summed up on the *Welcome!* video. Just look around! If the body of Christ was actually *alive* we'd be even more vibrant than they were 2000 years ago—and *no one* could claim that!

Voice Lessons. As in other places the audio and subtitles don't exactly match. In any case, in the very beginning of her lesson Papin/the Spirit tells Philippa/God's Girl something like *if she does precisely as He tells Her She'll save souls and comfort the poor*. Keywords: **if** and **precisely**. In reality Jesus said "Obey everything I have commanded you" (Matt. 28:20, NIV). "Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give" (Matt. 10:8, NIV).

Continuing her lesson, this scene is the Lord wooing His Church, His Beloved, the scaredy-cat BRAT. Watch it alone. Watch it prayerfully. Catch every nuance of emotion and expression of both parties—and let the Lord minister to *your* soul (Zeph. 3:17 below). Download the lyrics of the song: "La Ci Darem la Mano" Lyrics and Translation (liveabout.com). The point is that the Lord comes on strong and His Girl has been too afraid—being too self-absorbed—to submit to Him.







Zephaniah 3:17, KJV The LORD thy God in the midst of thee is mighty; he will save, he will rejoice over thee with joy; he will rest in his love, he will joy over thee with singing.

Notice also how the father/pastor/antichrist sits in the next room with the girl/representing the body of Christ praying *against* this union. *WAKE UP!* (Rev. 3:1, NIV).

"Walk[ing] not after the flesh, but after the Spirit" (Rom. 8:1, KJV), while God had me *parked* here during the first edition of the writing of this interpretation, I watched the movie *Dan in Real Life (2007)*, a romantic comedy. Like all resources for those who have "eyes that see" (Luke 10:23, NIV), the whole movie parallels what's taken place. So during the talent show one of the couples does a spoof on this very scene from the opera. And throughout most of the Dan movie, as with reality, the girl is with the wrong guy who gets all of his best lines from the right Guy. It's Jesus in Real Life! Because, Satan set out to "be like the most High" (Isa. 14:14, KJV).

Dear John. Though Philippa rejected her lover he still longs for her. It's how the Lord's Girl has rejected Him from day one as we see with the following passages:


The Pharisees and the experts in the law rejected God's purpose for themselves (Luke 7:30, NIV).


He did not many mighty works there because of their unbelief (Matt. 13:58, KJV).

Some are already turned aside after Satan (1 Tim. 5:15, KJV).

But He still wants Her/us.

However, the father/pastor, under Satan's rule, is more than happy to see the flame put out, as we witness in *Babette's Feast* by his joy in having delivered the *Dear John* letter. It's like how so-called pastors get a laugh out of kicking out genuine servants of Christ from their meetings, as we saw in 2015 with the Freemason John MacArthur (clearly laughing). JOHN MACARTHUR CONFRONTED BY A FALSE PROPHET AT GRACE COMMUNITY CHURCH, CA 8-16-2015 / SO4J-TV - YouTube. (Naturally the person who uploaded the videos has it wrong.) It's what Paul wrote about in the following passage. "Diotrephes, who loves to be first…even refuses to welcome other believers. He also stops those who want to do so and puts them out of the church" (3 John 9-10, NIV). Except the "church" isn't those institutional buildings but "the assembly" (3 John 10, YLT), the *gathering* of born again believers wherever that might be.





Un Vrai Diner (An Authentic Meal)

The Sisters decide to honor the anniversary of their father pastor's birth—the man they revere as their Master—with a "special" tea. It's how harlot leaders don't see the need to pour out of themselves for Christ or His flock, or Christians for others, or parents for their kids, or friends for each other. Being self-absorbed most people, the born again included, are quite happy with mediocrity when it comes to loving others. It's like Philippa in the movie who wants to continue to only *offer others the basics*. Similarly, today's Christians fight tooth and nail to keep things just as they are, totally blind to the fact that what they're doing is honoring Satan and his ways.



In contrast, *knowing* Papin/God, that He wants our very best (Mark 12:30-31 below)—it's only the two greatest commandments!—Babette makes the meal into a feast. As Christians know and preach, God's wants it *all!* Moreover, He *deserves* it all!

Mark 12:30-31, KJV Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.

Always mindful of God's promises (John 14:26 below), Babette goes *all* out, not because of what she'll get in return, but to please Him (Col. 3:23 below) and because that's how He's wired her (and all of the elect). She knows that by fulfilling His desires *we* get fulfilled (Ps. 37:4 below). Rather than simply *throw something together* like the tea the sisters had in mind, Babette prepares not only a *meal* but a royal feast (1 Pet. 2:9 below). Genuine love goes *all* out, as Jesus and the first disciples modeled for us.

John 14:26, KJV The Comforter, which is the Holy [Spirit], whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you.

Colossians 3:23, KJV Whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men.

Psalm 37:4, KJV Delight thyself also in the LORD: and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.

1 Peter 2:9, KJV Ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

They Lack Love and Grace. Notice the level of love expressed by the father/pastor and the rest of the congregation as they respond—or don't respond—to the maid who drops the tray, and then again when Lorenz chokes on his food. ZERO! Because, "Love is patient [and] love is kind...[and] it is not easily angered" (1 Cor. 13:4-5, NIV). Love also helps others. The born again are supposed to be showing *everyone* love including our "enemies" (Matt. 5:44, KJV). Yet as my testimony and the history of the Church reveals we don't even express it to our own brethren!

Called to "not [get] easily angered" (1 Cor. 13:5, NIV) but rather be "patient" (1 Cor. 13:4, NIV), today's body of Christ gets INSTANTLY angered, just like the lost. Try holding a professing Christian accountable, especially one in so-called leadership, and they'll come at you so hard and fast you won't even know what hit you! It's been going on for quite a while as Jeremiah testified (Jer. 11:19 below)—except the born again should have been different!

Jeremiah 11:19, KJV I was like a lamb or an ox that is brought to the slaughter; and I knew not that they had devised devices against me, saying, Let us destroy the tree with the fruit thereof, and let us cut him off from the land of the living, that his name may be no more remembered.

Neither are they helpful as God has me revealing through my testimony when we've been called to "do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers" (Gal. 6:10, KJV). The body of Christ is just the opposite. Today's Christians are *super* carnal behaving *exactly* like the lost—making it clear that they're either not actually born again or else mere babes in Christ who care more about their own opinions than about what God is saying and doing. Like the Pharisees who did not have God's Spirit within, the body of Christ as a whole today is much more interested in the surface level—and that's especially true for those in so-called Christian leadership.

And the fact that today's professing Christians are super short tempered isn't just my opinion. It's what God prophesied would happen, in the following passage:

Mark this: There will be terrible times in the last days. People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good, treacherous, rash, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God—having a form of godliness but denying its power. Have nothing to do with such people (2 Tim. 3:1-5, NIV).

Today's Christians seem to think this passage refers only to the lost when it speaks of the born again as well. As Jesus said "Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold" (Matt. 24:12, NIV). And so it has. My personal testimony proves it since it's obvious that I'm a born again Christian and yet this is how Christians respond when I've obeyed the Lord to hold them accountable. They're not exactly "slow to become angry" (James 1:19, NIV). And Melissa Dykes from Truthstream Media makes the point on a video entitled *Do You See What I See?* She says something like the following:

At this point I really think I could make a video about *Why I like the color blue* and there would be people whose brains would explode. They'd have a total meltdown and it would ooze out their ears. They'd get totally unhinged because I like the color blue.

Human beings are in the worst shape today that we've *ever* been! Yet, in order to get through the trials coming our way successfully, "great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time" (Matt. 24:21, KJV), we need to be in the best shape possible! And for that "you must be born again" (John 3:7, NIV) and a close follower of Christ.



Their So-Called Ministry. Both sisters spend their time and funds doing so-called "good" works, ritualistic praying, reading things *other* than the Bible, and idolizing an antichrist who they view as their "master." In turn, their relationship with God *and* with each other is as good as "dead" (Rev. 3:1, KJV). That's how it is today with the body of Christ in reality as God has revealed through the testimony and ministry He's entrusted to me—and in *many* other ways as well. These people have supposedly been born again for decades yet notice the baby food and dry nothings they still say—and call it ministry. That's Sunday morning all across the world—for the most part—and among Christian groups throughout the week, either spiritually "dead" (Rev. 3:1, KJV) or "such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat" (Heb. 5:12, KJV).

And it's the same among the lost. While they reject Christ they constantly talk about *praying* and *spirituality* in a way which doesn't even make sense, "for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction" (Matt. 7:13, KJV).

So while they do good works like feeding the poor and homebound, which is a good thing to do, Jesus did not leave the body of Christ to primarily focus on that, which most professing Christians in real life don't even do. Let's be honest. The Great Commission—the working orders Christ left for us—is to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them…and teaching them to obey everything [Jesus]...commanded" (Matt. 28:19-20, NIV).



The Congregation

Following are some of the key points in the movie which parallel reality.


They are Catholics at Heart. While they're a supposedly *reformed* congregation, they have Jesus hanging on the Cross when "He has risen" (Matt. 28: 6, KJV), which is pretty much the point! The Cross is a symbol of where Jesus went for us, but He didn't *stay* there! And while Protestant churches don't typically have crucifixes, they treat Him as if He's dead and buried, revealed by their lack of obedience. They also reveal it by idolizing those men they call pastors who bow down to the popes. Again as someone else captured on this video! All Denominations Bow Before the Pope - YouTube. As in real life, these people are shallow, mindless, idolaters of the leading antichrist.

They Elevate Man & Humiliate Man. In the movie, just as in reality, rather than honor "Jesus the author and finisher of our faith" (Heb. 12:2, KJV) they give the pastor the credit for being a supposedly holy man when "there is none righteous, no, not one" (Rom. 3:10, KJV). That being the case, Jesus warned us saying "Be not ye called Rabbi [as in do not use a title]: for one is your Master, even Christ; and all ye are brethren" (Matt. 23:8, KJV). Yet professing Christians use their calling as if it's their title, as with Prophet so and so or Apostle so and so, or Pastor so and so—as if we're supposed to bow down to them. Then they rebuke you when you don't bow down to them as if you're subhuman and they're gods.





The scene when the maid drops the tray while they're having their meeting parallels today's scripted services. Again, spiritually "dead" (Rev. 3:1, KJV) like someone summed up with this graphic which I tweaked with the snoozes to make it more realistic. Since none of those people sitting there are typically allowed to speak, if they did it would produce the same reaction as they had with the maid—like when the henchmen in John MacArthur's meeting house booted out God's prophet. This type of setting leaves next to zero room for the holy Spirit, the One it's all supposed to be about. As Jesus says, "You nullify the word of God for the sake of your tradition" (Matt. 15:6, KJV).



They Look to Human Leadership. Rather than look to Almighty God and His Word for direction, as when the two argue about their past adulterous affair, they look to one of the sisters to lead them. In reality, I've seen this repeatedly over the past two decades as God has had me hold Christians accountable and, while they agree with what I'm saying, they immediately run to their pastor for approval. But since the man is a "hireling [who] careth not for the sheep" (John 10:13, KJV) he naturally does NOT approve of sound doctrine and those idolaters follow him ignoring the fact that we've been called to be followers of Christ, Jesus having said "Follow thou me" (John 21:22, KJV).

Like the majority of professing Christians today, the congregation cares more about dishonoring their human leaders than about dishonoring their Lord so that Jesus continues to say "How can ye believe, which receive honour one of another, and seek not the honour that cometh from God only?" (John 5:44, KJV). The answer is that they don't really believe in Jesus beyond the surface level—if that. Jesus is their ticket out of hell and that's pretty much it. Unless, of course, there's an emergency situation. The majority of Christians today focus more on *that* the pastor preaches rather than on *what* he preaches—or what he's doing. Or what *they're* doing.

However, a small fraction have started waking up to different aspects of the Truth, thanks to God. "For it is God which worketh in [us] both to will and to do of his good pleasure" (Phil. 2:13, KJV).

They *Recite* **God's Word.** Scripture says that "the devil...from the beginning...abode not in the truth" (John 8:44, KJV). Being the Father of Lies (John 8:44 below), he loves to use God's Word as was revealed to us when "Jesus...was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil" (Luke 4:1-2, NIV) and "the devil...[repeatedly] saith...for it is written" (Matt. 4:5-6, KJV). Satan and all who serve him as professing Christians, use God's Word. But they twist it. We've *all* done it for not being in the habit of "bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, KJV).

John 8:44, KJV Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it.

Therefore, Satan has made these people—the body of Christ—not only ineffective but deaf, dumb, and blind. In a word, "dead" (Rev. 3:1, KJV). God has allowed it to help a remnant *see* that's what we are as a group. God says "My people would not hearken to my voice" (Ps. 81:11, KJV) so that "[most] of them of understanding [have fallen], to try them, and to purge, and to make them white, even to the time of the end" (Dan. 11:35, KJV).

So while Satan temps and deceives us, we're the ones who *choose* to sin and let him deceive us by not taking our thoughts captive to Christ. Scripture says "each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed. Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death" (James 1:14-15, NIV)—unless they repent. And "death" can mean physical death; spiritual death (as in not being born again); or being born again but spiritually *ineffective* as with all who will get "saved; yet so as by fire" (1 Cor. 3:15, KJV).

Their Prayer Life and Fellowship is Dry. As with the body of Christ in reality, the congregation in the movie *knows* the words of life, truth and power, but they don't pay attention to what they're saying or doing, or to the One who has given them these awesome promises. They have the faith *to* pray (if you could even call it that!), but not to believe God will actually *answer* their prayers. For example, in the movie, they often sing about God not giving a child who begs for bread a stone, and yet they, who are supposedly the faithful, eat slop. So while being the community of the supposedly faithful who know God Almighty, they live like crap and barely know each other when they've been together for years. You see the same take place throughout the body of Christ in reality, especially in the institutional so-called churches. People sit next to each other for years and yet barely know each other beyond being acquaintances. And even their friendships only run surface level deep since they don't honor the Truth.

It's even true in many of our homes, mine being a prime example. While God revealed to me that my husband is born again and we've known each other for over four decades, we don't actually know each other at all! Because, to get to know him I'd have to leave Jesus behind or he would have to further open his heart to Him. And, apparently, neither of us is willing—and only one of us should be. And, according to the Bible, it's not me. I discern that after a remnant repents, which I'm guessing will be among ex Eagle Church members, people we once sort of knew, he'll also come around because it's as Jesus said "A prophet is not without honor except in his own town and in his own home." (Matt. 13:57, NIV). It's just like Jesus' own brothers didn't believe in Him until *after* His resurrection. Look into it. Whether I'll be dead or alive when my husband, and Lord willing my children, come back around, I don't know. And it doesn't really matter to me. All I care about is that which ever way it happens it's sooner rather than later.

The fellowship most of today's Christians have isn't any more than what the lost have. While it might seem rich and deep at times, put to the test it fails miserably. There are loads of testimonies about it on the web. The best example I've ever heard of was in a documentary. There was an arsonist who was finally caught. It turned out that when he was born the nurse had dropped him so that he'd experienced some kind of brain damage. But they never informed the family of the incident. Had they informed them, the boy would have gotten the help he needed. And when he was caught, because of the damage he had done, the family was ostracized by their congregation, their "Christian" brethren, when those were the people who should have been there *for* them. Instead, they hurt them more than anyone else. And that's how it is. The body of Christ is doing the most damage today when we should be bringing the most healing.







They Lack the Joy of the Lord. From the very beginning and throughout the movie until the *very* end, you can see in their faces their lack of joy in the One they profess to know and worship. Just *look* at their faces, not just in the movie but in the people with whom you actually worship God. For the most part, it's like they're fulfilling a dreaded duty! It's not until after eating the feast prepared for them by Babette that they finally walk in "the joy of the LORD [which God says] is...our strength" (Neh. 8:10, KJV). You can see genuine joy in the man's face as they sing around the well at the very end of the movie. Through the feast prepared by Babette, who represents the most mature Christian in the group and who actually *knows* Papin/the holy Spirit better than them, the congregation is finally transformed. And that's how it will work out for a remnant when God finally opens up this ministry at His "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV). I'm not being proud as I get accused, but spiritually discerning.



They are Babies in Christ. Those who are actually born again today, just like in the movie, are like "newborn babes" (1 Pet. 2:2, KJV). After *decades* of meeting together, they still talk about the very *basics* of the faith, not even getting that right, wondering if God will forgive them when the New Testament clearly says that "if we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9, KJV). Attend a Christian gathering where there's discussion, as with a small group meeting or house church meeting, and you'll quickly realize how little they actually know God's Word. Except to be aware of that you have to know it well yourself.

They're Proud. Rather than "study to shew [themselves] approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15, KJV) or "examin[ing them]selves to see whether [they] are in the faith" (2 Cor. 13:5, NIV), the body of Christ has **assumed** to be right with God when we're not—making Jesus look like a fraud to the lost. Like in the movie, the congregation thinks *very* highly of themselves as the "true faithful" since they attend services. Yet the truth is that they have been **extremely** lazy, cold, and *self*-centered—**un**faithful—as it is in real life so that God says "[Your services] are a trouble unto me; I am weary to bear them" (Isa. 1:14, KJV). "Your meetings do more harm than good" (1 Cor. 11:17, KJV)—which is *obvious* by the state of Christianity worldwide along with the horrendous state of the world.

And even while this is obvious, Christians still refuse to repent! "Therefore the showers have been withholden, and there hath been no latter rain; [because we, as a group, have] a whore's forehead, [and] refusedst to be ashamed" (Jer. 3:3, KJV). So while we're in desperate need of the "latter rain" (Joel 2:23, KJV) today with everything going on in the world, the body of Christ is preventing God from fully pouring it out on us!



They Bite and Devour One Another. Lacking genuine *devotion* to God, in time, the members of the congregation show their true colors—carnal—and "to be carnally minded is death" (Rom. 8:6, KJV). When held accountable for their sins, their hearts are cold and unrepentant "for their heart was hardened" (Mark 6:52, KJV), "hardened by sin's deceitfulness" (Heb. 3:13, NIV). True, God forgives us based on Jesus' work on the Cross, but

repentance and acts of faith are *required*. Scripture says "blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city" (Rev. 22:14, KJV). Therefore, we're told the following:

Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like (James 1:22-24, NIV).

As in reality, instead of repenting they play The Blame Game for their adulterous affair, and are severely divided, when God warned us saying "If ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another" (Gal. 5:15, KJV). While Christians were called to be united as *one* having been told to "be of one mind" (2 Cor. 13:11, KJV), for instance, we're divided by tens of *thousands* of denominations and the "hireling[s]" (John 10:13, KJV) constantly preach about those *other* churches and how wrong *they* are—totally blind.

However, as they dine at the Table and drink what the Chef has prepared for them—equivalent to the material the Lord has had me put together since Jesus is "the Word" (Rev. 19:13, KJV) who has said "my flesh is meat indeed, and my blood is drink indeed" (John 6:55, KJV) "Feed my sheep" (John 21:17, KJV)—their hearts are softened and they start correctly thinking of *others* as more important than themselves. Because, genuine "love worketh no ill to his neighbour: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law" (Rom. 13:10, KJV).

Babette

Having suffered brutally, Babette is helped by Achille Papin/the Spirit who leads her to the Sisters/Christianity. He leads her to them since Christians were left with the responsibility of helping both the lost and the members of the body of Christ. The New Testament says "as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers" (Gal. 6:10, NIV). Jesus says "Freely ye have received, freely give" (Matt. 10:8, KJV). "Receive her in the Lord, as doth become saints, and may assist her in whatever matter she may have need of you" (Rom. 16:2, YLT).

But since they don't walk in the Spirit, when they open the door to her they keep her standing *in* the Storm "for we wrestle...against spiritual wickedness in high places" (Eph. 6:12, KJV).

In turn, God has the following rebuke for the body of Christ today just as He did for the Jews, especially those who call themselves leaders:

Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You shut the door of the kingdom of heaven in people's faces. You yourselves do not enter, nor will you let those enter who are trying to (Matt. 23:13, NIV).





That's how it is for billions today. We've gotten the exact same reception so we've ended up totally worn out as revealed by the look on the poor woman's face. And we've left the younger generations no possibility of taking Him seriously as revealed with the two examples on my *Welcome!* video. What apostate Christianity has helped them believe is that Jesus is WHATEVER we want Him to be! *Not* Someone to be taken seriously.

As it is in the movie, today's "believers" don't know what to do with people like Babette who aren't *like them* since they're filled with the Spirit (speaking of Babette) and actually "walk in the Spirit" (Gal. 5:16, KJV). Having made the Lord's "assembly" (Matt. 16:18, YLT) into a Country Club they *call* church, they don't actually know "God [who] is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV) either at all or very well.

Therefore, they don't know *how* to love. They're shallow, self-centered, and downright ignorant. Though given clear directives (Gal. 6:10 & John 13:35 below), the Sisters—representing the body of Christ—stand there staring at Babette even though she's ready to pass out. Then, finally having let her in, they don't know *what* to do. *Should I wipe her brow? Offer her tea?*

Galatians 6:10, KJV As we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.

John 13:35, KJV By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.

And while Babette was discouraged to the point of suicide, it did *nothing* for them! They have no compassion whatsoever—which is my testimony as shared in my material. It's only after they've been fully assured that she'd work for *them* for **free**, do they "accept" her as *their* subhuman subordinate. They treat her as *their* servant (who they don't pay) and they don't even eat with her! She's *NOTHING* to them other than someone they can *use*. And that's how Christians treat Christ and, therefore, His servants—as many who've left the churches have found out. Other than one wipe of the brow and a cup of tea, they never comfort or encourage her even though they know her whole family has been killed and that she's lost *everything*. These cold, deadbeat Sisters, just like the real body of Christ, never even *consider* that as a daughter of the King she was led there by the Spirit for a higher purpose and had gifts to offer their little group since that's what the trials were for, as their Bible says:

God...comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God (2 Cor. 1:3-4, KJV).





Not in the habit of reading God's Word, they can't connect even the *preschool* dots. And, again, that's my testimony. In the movie we see them reading some worldly paper *while* the storm rages and you hear the sound of thunder which points to Satan since Jesus said "I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven" (Luke 10:18, KJV). I'm not making connections that aren't there as you can *see* by this excerpt from the following document, for example: <u>Microsoft Word - Satanic and Occult symbols updated May 2018.docx (squarespace.com)</u>.



	famed by Aleister Crowley who wrote the guide to witchcraft and satanic worship. Crowley so hated God that he named himself '777' (666 was already taken). Crowley's instruction to his followers was that they learn to speak, write, walk backwards as a means to open themselves to hear from the demonic realm
15 4/	Satanic 's': Presents as a 'lightning bolt.' When kicked out of Heaven, Lucifer fell to the earth as a lightning bolt. In satanic circles, this symbol represents 'the destroyer'. This 's' has also been used by the Nazi Germany 'SS' police as well as the once popular 70s-80s heavy metal ban, Kiss.

They don't even consider her to be a daughter of *their* King. She's an outsider, and *their* servant, so they talk down to her as if she has brain damage like when they teach her how to cook. Yet she's an *expert* at cooking, something they obviously know absolutely NOTHING about. It's exactly how it is in the churches and among the body of Christ as a whole. "Desiring to be teachers of the law; [they] understand...neither what they say, nor whereof they affirm" (1 Tim. 1:7, KJV). Unless you're a *member* in that so-called church *and* in the "in" group—lobotomized to their level—you're not considered right with God. Except, they have it backwards!



So while the congregation enjoys the benefits of Babette's culinary gifts for free for over a decade while they totally ignore her as a sister in the Lord, rather than learn from her and enrich each other's lives, they *stifle* her who walked more closely with the Spirit/Papin than any of them. As we learn at the end of the movie, she actually *knew* him whereas they had only *met* him. And God says, "Quench not the Spirit. Despise not prophesyings. Prove all things; hold fast that which is good" (1 Thess. 5:19-21, KJV). God gave us people with different gifts "for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ" (Eph. 4:12, KJV). Yet today's body of Christ is so proud and lacking discernment, they only allow those who are approved by the hirelings who don't even care for the sheep (John 10:11-13 below) to "serve" in the so-called church which doesn't even represent biblical Christianity! And the house churches work the same way. You have to be accepted by them and their standards rather than God's. It doesn't matter to them that the Christ has accepted you.

John 10:11-13, KJV [Jesus says] I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep. But he that is an hireling...careth not for the sheep.

So while Babette's new life is dry and empty, she would rather work for zero wages and for "friends of Papin," people who barely befriend the Lord's commands or her, than "dwell in the tents of the wicked" (Ps. 84:10, KJV). It's the lesser of the two evils since the lost don't even acknowledge Christ as Lord. Therefore, because of how the Sisters are/how the body of Christ is as a whole in reality, she lives a meager fraction of the life she could live if only the Sisters were *real*, if only they had the slightest bit of discernment. Again, that's my testimony.

Contemplating her plight, tears in her eyes, she sits alone year after year after year, *while* it rains, meaning, while the spiritual storm rages on (Eph. 6:12 below). I cover it from beginning to end through milestones in *Satan's Reign: A Timeline*. However, being the "good shepherd" (John 10:11, KJV) Jesus allows her to see Him here and there (as He walks by her window), letting her know He *is* tending His pasture having said "I will build my church" (Matt. 16:18, KJV)—which is again how it is. Encouraged and empowered



at the slightest sight of Him, she consistently presses on because that's what the born again have been called to do. As Paul said "This one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ" (Phil. 3:13-14, KJV).

Ephesians 6:12, KJV For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

In contrast, the body of Christ today *focuses* on their past experience with God using that as a sign that they're "following" Him. Or else using their worldly success as a sign of it. They totally ignoring the actual meaning of the term *follow* or the fact that we're not supposed to be "entangled in civilian affairs" (2 Tim. 2:4, NIV).

Unlike them, Babette is a frugal, hard working, and discerning servant of God so that everything and everyone she encounters is enriched by her as she makes the most of the resources God provides. The Bible says:

Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. But his delight is in the law of the LORD; and in his law doth he meditate day and night. And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper (Ps. 1:1-3, KJV).

That being the case, even before the feast they all knew Babette cooked a thousand times better than the Sisters. But *no one* ever encouraged that or bothered to find out about it, at all. Nothing. And, again, that's how it is. Like the Israelites, today's body of Christ is so self-absorbed and focused on the world that they don't even think of what God might be doing through those around them even when He specifically has us intercept their path calling them to repentance Jesus having said "Behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes" (Matt. 23:34, KJV). Or if it does cross their mind they immediately assume God had them cross their path so that they could help that person, ignoring what that person is actually saying to them even though it lines up with Scripture! It's what the Israelites did again and again in the Old Testament, ignored the prophet (Jer. 7:27 below) and then when it went bad for them they decided to obey God, only it was too late (Jer. 2:27 below).

Jeremiah 7:27, KJV Therefore thou shalt speak all these words unto them; but they will not hearken to thee: thou shalt also call unto them; but they will not answer thee.

Jeremiah 2:27, KJV They have turned their backs to me and not their faces; yet when they are in trouble, they say, 'Come and save us!'

Thankfully for us, however, today we are under the new covenant of grace so that it's not yet too late—though extremely close. God says "After thy hardness and impenitent heart treasurest up unto thyself wrath against the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God" (Rom. 2:5, KJV)—unless you repent.

Unlike the sisters/body of Christ, *knowing* how the world works in that "the wicked are like the troubled sea, when it cannot rest, whose waters cast up mire and dirt" (Isa. 57:20, KJV), and that God is watching so that "he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him" (Heb. 11:6, KJV), Babette does *whatever* needs doing while living as an outsider among them, as she knocks herself out serving them (cooking, shopping, cleaning) making the most of *their* money while they don't even pay her, knowing that it all belongs to God who says, "Whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men" (Col. 3:23, KJV). "Be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord" (1 Cor. 15:58, KJV)—unlike worldly labor which is in vain since it will burn when God tests it by fire (1 Cor. 3:11-15 below). Supplied continuously through God's Creation since "every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father" (James 1:17), Babette makes the most of the resources available to her to the glory of God and for their benefit, knowing it will work out best for her in the end as she "obtain[s] a better resurrection" (Heb. 11:35, KJV), which Phillipa finally understands at the *very* end. In fact, not until the very last scene in the movie, which appears to be just how it's playing out in real life.

1 Corinthians 3:11-15, KJV For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if any man build upon this foundation gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble; Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is. If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward. If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire.



Babette knows how the world works because of the trials she suffered. Likewise, as shared someone on my Welcome! video and in more detail in my personal testimony books, I have also known since before I became born again how the world works since, for example, my family/clan was ruined (for us) because of a military coup which happened at the same time that my father was dying of cancer. Those trials impressed me to take God more seriously. They gave me that "hunger and thirst for righteousness" about whom Jesus says those people are "blessed [and] shall be filled" (Matt. 5:6, KJV).

So even though Babette has gone all out to bless them, after 14 years she is *still* an outsider among them since they worship the wrong Christ, the *anti* one being that "all the world wonder[s] after the beast" (Rev. 13:3, KJV) and "all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's" (Phil. 2:21, KJV). Not quite like them, they consider her only good for the blessings she provides. Again this reflects my testimony since after more than 30 years of being a born gain Christian I'm still all by myself day after day since I would have to reject the Lord to join the body of Christ. It's like David lamented "Lover and friend hast thou put far from me, and mine acquaintance into darkness" (Ps. 88:18, KJV). It's also what we're told about the genuinely faithful in Hebrews 11, what's known as the Hall of Faith. "They were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them...[D]estitute, persecuted and mistreated—the world was not worthy of them" (Heb. 11:16 & 37-8, NIV).

The Meaning of Her Name. Looking up Babette's name in Hebrew, I learned that it means my God is oath; my God is satisfaction; my God is a vow. Representing the born again, Babette has had an oath made to her by God, an oath which fully satisfies—a vow she/we must keep to be fully satisfied. Having lived up to her name/her calling, Babette is fully satisfied in the end even though she has nothing material left and has completely worn herself out. She knows she has done her best and knows Papin/Abba/God knows this as well, and appreciates it since our "Father which seeth in secret himself shall reward [us] openly" (Matt. 6:4, KJV). So she explains to the very slow sisters how there can be no greater joy, as I'm doing through this ministry.



A decade after having first written this interpretation while editing this in 2021, it occurred to me to look up her last name, Hersant. Apparently, I walking in the Spirit because it means *guardian of the sheep* which is the role she plays in the movie and it's the role God has me playing in real life having called me as a prophet for these last of the last days. It also points to Christ in that he is the Good Shepherd, the best herdsman there is and ever will be. And all born again are children of this Herdsman. "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God" (Rom. 8:14, KJV). So while the born again are prodigal today to one degree or another, we are all still His children and led by His Spirit since He's constantly reaching out to us. Whether we have the discernment and conviction to respond biblically is, actually, beside the point. Though it does work out better for us, and for those on our path, if we do.

She Breaks Up Their Quarreling. While it should be the sisters who break up the quarrels among the group since they are the self proclaimed leaders, Babette is the one who breaks it up since she's actually the one who knows the Spirit best of all. She's the most mature one in the group even though they totally ignore her. And that's how it

is. Christian so-called leaders have not been able to stop the quarreling within the body of Christ since they're just like the sisters in the movie. And in His "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV) God will use this ministry, and therefore me, to stop our quarreling—at least among a remnant. While the words are different in the subtitles, in the audio she rebukes them reminding them that they're "a Christian forum." In other words, rather than quarrel we're supposed to be "submit[ting] to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Eph. 5:21, NIV) since it's as Jesus said "By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another" (John 13:35, KJV).



She Always Waits for the Right Time. Since Scripture says "to every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven" (Eccl. 3:1, KJV), God has an appointed time for *everything*. We see that in the Old Testament where He says "the vision is yet for an appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV), for example. We also see it in the New Testament with John the baptizer, for example, who "grew, and was strengthened in spirit, and he was in the deserts till the day of his shewing unto Israel" (Luke 1:80, KJV). We also see it throughout Jesus' life as when He rebuked His brothers saying "My time is not yet here; for you any time will do" (John 7:6, NIV). Any time will do for those who are insensitive to God's Spirit. But those who have spiritual discernment do like Babette who always waited for just the right time:



- She waited to enter the meeting room.
- She waited to enter to speak to them.
- And at *just the right time* she serves a specific drink to go with a specific food.

And Scripture says "they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint" (Isa. 40:31, KJV). Waiting on God is pretty huge and clear concept revealed throughout the Bible. It's *all* about waiting on God since He's The Leader.

She Wins the Lottery. This is a huge misunderstanding in the body of Christ today so that I cover it in *Election: One of the Biggest Blinders*. What God has done in reality is like a lottery in that **He** decided who would be elect or non-elect summed up with the graphic. In contrast, Christianity as you know it speaks of having "accepted" Christ as if He's the One who needs our acceptance when it's us who needs His! And a key point is that we're talking about this age. Having ignored "the coming ages" (Eph. 2:7, NIV), Christians (both real and delusional) have shoved all sorts of prophecies into this age when some of them belong to the coming ages. I walk through it in *God's Plan*. Essentially, we've taken God and His ways shoved this square peg into a round hole *losing* much of the Truth.






According to Scripture, there are two types of people in the world, "vessels of wrath" (Rom. 9:22, KJV) sometimes referred to as non-elect and "vessels of mercy" (Rom. 9:23, KJV) commonly called elect. And within the elect group of humans there are those who become born again and those who don't. But the difference between non-elect and elect is that the Father draws the elect to Christ whereas He doesn't draw the non-elect. Jesus says "No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him" (John 6:44, KJV). Apparently, during the "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT), the Father is only drawing the elect to Christ having worked it out this way to reveal to humanity—by the end of the ages—the condition of all of our hearts which is "desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV). Humans are so wicked that even when we've become born again we still behave like the lost in *many* ways. Therefore, God is revealing His amazing grace since at the end of the ages everyone who has ever lived—no matter how wicked they've been—will have been transformed and become like Christ. Again, I cover it in *God's Plan*.

Focusing on the elect, unlike Moses, John Newton, and Fanny Crosby, there are 'lottery winners'—elect—who we *don't* yet know by name, but who we'll get to know quite well over the next thousand years, speaking of those who became born again during this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT). During the millennial reign of Christ we'll get to know all born again lottery winners a million times better than we ever knew our own siblings or spouse during the best times of our relationships during this evil age (1 Thess. 4:16-17 below). And they'll all be 100% enjoyable to be with 100% of the time, as will we (1 John 3:2 below). *Thank you Jesus!*


1 Thessalonians 4:16-17, KJV For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.

1 John 3:2, KJV Now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is.

Yet there are many *more* elect souls who, having won the lottery, never cashed in their ticket! They refused to take God seriously. And here's where it gets confusing because "it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure" (Phil. 2:13, KJV). Somewhere there is a *very* fine line between our will and God's will, the place where He steps on our will and convicts us to do His will. If He didn't none of us would have become born again because "there is none righteous, no, not one" (Rom. 3:10, KJV). That's why Jesus says—contrary to what Christianity teaches—"Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you" (John 15:16, KJV). So I summed up the fine line with this graphic. Since I don't know where that line is I've only narrowed it down to this space between those two lines, what's technically called *the grey area*.



So concerning the elect and the lottery, God has also decided *how much* each lottery winner gets, so to speak. He decided what our calling, our role in the body of Christ, would be. So there are different parts or members of the body of Christ summed up with this cool graphic someone else made (to which I added my own head for Christ), and there are also different positions summed up in Ephesians 4:11-16 which I've broken down into God's Mission Statement.



You [born again] are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. 1 Corinthians 12:26, NIV



In the movie Babette has won a huge sum—more savings than anyone has in that village. It has absolutely NOTHING to do with her just as it is in reality. The look on her face, in my opinion, is how all high winning spiritual lottery winners look. It's not a look of pride because they have such a high calling, but of shock and fear because of the responsibility attached to it. It's like Moses' reaction in the following passage:

Pardon your servant, Lord. I have never been eloquent, neither in the past nor since you have spoken to your servant. I am slow of speech and tongue." The LORD said to him, "Who gave human beings their mouths? Who makes them deaf or mute? Who gives them sight or makes them blind? Is it not I, the LORD? Now go; I will help you speak and will teach you what to say." But Moses said, "Pardon your servant, Lord. Please send someone else" (Ex. 4:10-13, NIV).



Instead, today's so-called prophets, pastors, apostles, and evangelists use their calling as a title and acts as if everyone is supposed to bow down to them. Some even actually have others kiss their hand, just like the popes!

And, just as it is in real life, it's clear in the movie that they weren't pleased because of Babette's winnings. In spiritual terms, Christians *don't* "rejoice with them that do rejoice, [or] weep with them that weep" (Rom. 12:15, KJV). While they should have wept with her when told of what had happened to her family, they didn't. And neither are they happy for her when she finds out she won ten thousand francs. In both cases, all they could do was think of themselves, which is exactly what the majority of today's body of Christ does since "because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most [has] grow[n] cold" (Matt. 24:12, NIV).

I read somewhere that 10,000 Francs (in 1871) would equal about \$60,000 in today's dollars, taking inflation into consideration. Feb 27, 2014

Rather than being *happy* that God is doing a work among them, who so need it, their hearts are resentful. Yet if they had been right with God they would have been *thrilled* that God had stepped in. They would have been like Jonathan who actually had the 'right' to be jealous about David, since he was the king's son, but he wasn't at all, as we're informed. "Jonathan loved him as his own soul" (1 Sam. 18:1, KJV). Compared to the relationship, aka love, the crown meant NOTHING to him! And that's how it should be.

Proof of Her Calling. In the movie Babette shows them the winning lottery ticket as proof. Jesus having said "I send unto you prophets" (Matt. 23:34, KJV), in reality God has had me proving His calling on my life from the very beginning which was in the late 1990s with Eagle Church in Indianapolis. He's had me proving it by always having me back up everything I'm saying with Scripture as with this letter and by how I live my life. Yet, as in the movie (though for a longer period in real life) for over two decades (14 years in the movie) not one professing Christian has been able to tell that God is using me as a prophet! While some *have* verbally stated this truth, they've nevertheless blown me off, *ignoring* what God has told us about His prophets—that we're to *listen* to them. We're supposed to "test the spirits" (1 John 4:1, NIV) and "take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV)—so it's not like I'm saying obey everything, or even *anything*, I say. I'm saying that God has gifted me in a way that can help the body of Christ when we function biblically which is, again, by "submit[ting] to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Eph. 5:21, NIV). If that first congregation God led me to, Eagle Church in Indianapolis, had taken God seriously, the last two decades would have worked out so differently for the entire world! Except He knew they wouldn't. That's the point. God is proving how desperately wicked we humans are even while born again.





And since Jesus said "No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him" (John 6:44, KJV), it should be clear as crystal by my material that I'm a true prophet of God! So here's a little Food for thought:

- I work for zero pay and "do not peddle the word of God for profit" (2 Cor. 2:17, NIV);
- I have been willing to be hated, ridiculed, and severely isolated for two decades, like Christ who said "The servant is not greater than his lord. If they have persecuted me, they will also persecute you" (John 15:20, KJV).
- I dish out money (my husband's money, without his complaint) as needed to obey the Lord *submitting to my husband as I do to the Lord* (Eph. 5:22);
- I'm trusting God will fulfill His promises *living by faith rather than by sight* (2 Cor. 5:7).
- I've been praying for people who've deeply hurt me and my family for over two decades (Matt. 5:44);
- While sick of this set up, I've kept taking down the books and videos from the web as the Lord has further enlightened me in order to fully honor Him and help His people by editing the material to better reflect the Truth.

If you think I'm a prophet, please e-mail at notmocked@gmail.com explaining what I should or shouldn't be doing according to Scripture that would reveal I'm a true prophet. Obviously, if I'm a false prophet I won't do it but I'd like to know. Because, as I understand Scripture a false prophet would not be doing the things I've been doing. No one has ever told me what I'm doing wrong, at least nothing biblical. The 'best' they do is throw their unbiblical opinions at me, seriously twisting Scripture while also refusing to have an actual discussion. "Submit[ting] one to another" (Eph. 5:21, NIV) is not reflected by one person lording over the other. And Jesus clearly says "The Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you" (Matt. 20;25, NIV).

What to do With Her Winnings. In the movie you see Babette take a little time out—not long at all—to contemplate what to do with her unexpected winnings. She almost immediately makes up her mind to host the feast for this group who don't even accept her, *knowing* it will cost everything she has. She's like the woman in the following passage while the congregation in the movie, who represent the body of Christ, are like the Pharisees:

Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on." (Mark 12:41-44, KJV).


And according to the two greatest commandments, what Babette did is what *all* lottery winners/elect of God should have done. And, therefore, all the most true of the body of Christ. As the lottery winner, Babette spends all she has—money, time, energy, and talent serving God by serving others—people who don't even genuinely care for her. Yet she does it out of love for God and for them (Mark 12:29-31 in the graphic) having been told by Papin/the Spirit, that in doing so she *fulfills* her destiny "for we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in" (Eph. 2:10, KJV). She also pays for it herself because it's like David said. "I will not sacrifice to the LORD my God burnt offerings that cost me nothing" (2 Sam. 24:24, NIV). To give a "sacrifice" that cost you nothing would be like giving someone a birthday gift which you stole. It would be an insult.



As she explains at the end of the movie, Papin, representing God's Spirit, told her, and she understood, that He is aware when she gives her all and that her labor is *not* in vain. That's because "the Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels; and then he shall reward every man according to his works" (Matt. 16:27, KJV). Having learned from Him Who said "Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls" (Matt. 11:29, KJV), Babette does whatever it takes in lowly service to accomplish His will for His glory. He has informed her that "Whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men; Knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ" (Col. 3:22-24, KJV). *Genuinely* loving her Lord, she's willing to give her all even if it means giving her very last penny and ounce of energy. She was willing because she was focused on what He did for her on the Cross as well as "the coming age...the life that is truly life" (1 Tim. 6:19, NIV). Most Christians haven't been willing to do what Christ requires because they're focused on *this* life. "The care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and [it has] become...unfruitful" (Matt. 13:22, KJV). That's why 2000 years into it the body of Christ is still super immature:

Though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God's word all over again. You need milk, not solid food! Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness. But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil (Heb. 5:12-14, NIV).

And this is exactly how it plays out in the movie and in real life. Today's body of Christ can't distinguish good from evil since they still preach the doctrine of hell and adamantly defend it when you try to show them their error! (Though that's not true for all, thank God!)



So maybe this graphic will help you focus properly. According to God's view of reality that x/this life just keeps getting smaller and smaller. It's not even worth a drop in the bucket. Since eternity never ends, the bucket gets bigger and bigger and bigger without end!

PART TWO: PREPARING FOR THE FEAST

Babette

Having won the lottery and made up her mind to use her funds, talents, and gifts—all she's got—to honor Papin (the Lord), Babette sets out to prepare "un vrai dîner français." In the real world this translates into genuine communion with God and man. So I've summed up the difference between what the congregation/body of Christ is doing and what Babette and I are doing with this graphic. The born again who will be able to down what I'm feeding them need to remember that "solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil" (Heb. 5:14, NIV). So, for one, thing you have to be honest. For another, you have to "take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV).



And if you feed someone else who seems to be born again and they don't 'get it,' it's because they're not spiritually mature and possibly not even born again. It doesn't matter what you say or how you say it, they're *not* going to get it. So you need to move on—as led by the Lord. When Christians do actually evangelize, they have a tendency to pound the truth down people's throats so that we've earned the nickname of Bible Thumpers. However, we're only supposed to reach out to others as led by the Lord and let Him do the thumping. For example Scripture says the following:

A vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us (Acts 16:9, KJV).

A certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard us: whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul (Acts 16:14, KJV).

Did not our heart burn within us, while he talked with us by the way, and while he opened to us the scriptures? (Luke 24:32, KJV).

Neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow (1 Cor. 3:7, KJV).

What our so-called spiritual leaders have done is what the government and doctors have done concerning physical food by feeding us lies and pills when they should have been promoting a whole food plant based diet, which some are now doing. Forks Over Knives - Official Trailer - YouTube. And the reason they've fed us lies is because Satan is the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV) and he's "a liar, and the father of it" (John 8:44, KJV). Everyone who is not a follower of Christ automatically gets used by him. So while the doctors who are preaching and practicing the truth may or may not be born again, that's how it works since God is the One who is in *ultimate* control so that He "worketh all things after the counsel of his own will" (Eph. 1:11, KJV). In other words, "He maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matt. 5:45, KJV). It's the essence of God's *grace*.

And what a testimony about Satan being the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV) in that we have stores full of aisles upon aisles of trash they call food. It's mostly trash because rather than nourish our bodies they make us get cancer, diabetes, and other such illnesses. It's all garbage which the majority of us have gotten *addicted to* having been raised on the Standard American Diet with very appropriate acronym of SAD. But "but be of good cheer; [Christ has] overcome the world" (John 16:33, KJV). For those who are interested, excellent resources are *The McDougall Program for Maximum Weight Loss* or *The Starch Solution* by John A. McDougall, M.D. Basically, split your plate between half starchy vegetables and half non starchy vegetables, eat til satisfied and only eat when actually hungry and you will lose weight *and* be able to maintain the loss while also living a healthier life. There are loads of testimonies online of people getting off their meds for good having adopted this whole foods plant based (wfpb) lifestyle. And just about everyone's story is the same. They tried every diet under the sun, lost weight, and gained it back—plus more. Until they tried this.

She Needs their Permission. In the movie Babette has to get the sisters' permission in order to serve the feast. And that parallels reality. Over the past two decades the Lord has had me reach out to everyone: Christian leaders, so-called lay leaders, "regular" Christians, and the lost. And *no one* has had ears to hear! It's too much for the lost to believe that one person is right when they're saying something completely different from what *everyone* they know is saying *and* what every Christian they're aware of is saying. God never meant for them to have to take that big a leap of faith. However, among the body of Christ, being idolaters, they all look to those so-called leaders who feed them lies. And among professing Christians who who don't know you, when held accountable to God's Word they *always* assume the worst of you. That's been my experience for two decades. On the other hand, Christians who do know you at least somewhat, think very lowly of you because familiarity breeds contempt. On top of that, there's also the problem Jesus informed us about and walked in Himself, that "a prophet is not without honor except in his own town and in his own home" (Matt. 13:57, NIV). What it comes down to is what Jesus said "This is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds [a]re evil" (John 3;19, KJV).

Therefore, connecting all the dots, I'm thinking God is going to open up this ministry in His "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV) with someone who sort of knew me and knew the first hirelings the Lord had me address at Eagle Church in Indianapolis Indiana. Someone, possibly more than one, who wasn't a hireling but was also more interested in God than the norm, people normally referred to as leaders or elders in the institutional churches. And since it's now been proven beyond a doubt that Ravi Zacharias was not a godly man, and since he was strongly connected to Eagle as the hireling Kerry Bowman's mentor, it should be easier for someone in that congregation who was something of a leader to be honest. Especially with everything that's gone down in the body of Christ and in the world over these past two decades. And unlike me, those hirelings (speaking of Kerry Bowman and Eric Simpson) would actually listen to that person, especially if it's a male since Christian men are so bigoted not just concerning race. They should at least be willing to hear that person out whereas they can't seem to be able to hear *anything* I have to say. When in person, they (and most others the Lord has had me reach out to) were too busy talking over me to even be able to hear what I was saying even though Scripture says "Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry" (James 1:19, KJV). I can't remember who it was, pretty sure it was Kerry Bowman, who even got mad at me because I was taking notes while he was speaking. But, I didn't want to be rude and interrupt him. Again, it's what Scripture says. "To the pure, all things are pure, but to those who are corrupted and do not believe, nothing is pure. In fact, both their minds and consciences are corrupted" (Titus 1:15, NIV). Another guy yelled at me because I was looking (and praying) while he was speaking. God gave me a brain with ears. I can listen and pray at the same time. It's pretty amazing. Anyhow, if that person was respected among the community, someone like Bryan Brenner, it would help them all the more since today's Christians walk by sight rather than by faith.

As it is in the movie with Babette, outsiders aren't genuinely respected among "Christian" groups. And because these groups are such outrageous idolaters, I discern it's going to take repentant hirelings to really get the ball rolling in the right direction. So it's like I need their "permission" to serve the feast—for God to fully open up this ministry—which will be a catalyst in bringing the body of Christ into the peak of the "latter rain" (Joel 2:23, KJV). That's what He's revealed to me and, therefore, what I believe, by faith.

A Request from the Heart. Babette referred to her request to serve this feast as a prayer which came from her heart, and that's how it is in reality. This is a request/prayer I've been making for over two decades and which comes from my heart because it's from God. Even our biblical prayers come from Him since "we do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us" (Rom. 8:26, NIV). Since "there is none righteous, no, not one" (Rom. 3:10, KJV), every decent thought, which includes our prayers, *has* to come from God. As Jesus says "apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5, NIV). Unlike most, I actually *get it*.

She Doesn't Wear a Crucifix. Unlike the congregation who has a crucifix hanging in their meeting house, Babette's necklace does not have Christ still hanging on the Cross. That's because "He has risen!" (Mark 16:6, NIV). So in reality I don't bow down to anyone but my Lord who's known by most as Jesus Christ, unlike those so-called Protestant denominational leaders.





She's Forgiving and Accommodating. The following directives of Christ are what sets His disciples apart from those of all other religions, "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you" (Matt. 5:43-44, KJV).

Therefore, Babette reveals that she's living up to God's calling when she's informed that a general who served in Paris in his youth would be at the feast. Generals carry out wars. Therefore, this general would have been either directly or indirectly responsible for all of her loss and heartache. Still, having connected all the dots, she nevertheless immediately welcomes him *and* gives him the VIP treatment. And that's how it is in reality since I'm still praying for and either directly or indirectly reaching out to those generals, most specifically Eagle Church leadership where this ordeal for me began. If the indirect sources don't wake up to themselves *then* I'll reach out to the so-called pastor Kerry Bowman and Eric Simpson directly. They were the one leadership team God gave the opportunity to get to know me and my family over the course of several years. And Jesus says ""If ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses" (Matt. 6:15, KJV).



She Believes in Her Provider. Knowing the Lord and His Word well, Babette is certain that there will be enough food for everyone. Because, "[Jesus] took the seven loaves and the fishes, and gave thanks, and brake them, and gave to his disciples, and the disciples to the multitude. And they did all eat, and were filled: and they took up of the broken meat that was left seven baskets full" (Matt. 15:35-37, KJV).

However, in the real world that's not the problem. It's not that the born again don't know or don't believe what Jesus did and can do. The problem is that today's Christians are too proud and, therefore, much more interested in their own plans and opinions. "For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's" (Phil. 2:21, KJV). It's been a historical problem that's grown worse with time so that today it's worse than it has ever been before. It's a pretty big problem! And I'm thinking it's part of the reason God is allowing Satan to go to town on us so that we'll be experiencing "great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world" (Matt. 24:21, KJV). It'll help at least some to humble themselves before God. We already see something of that taking place in other countries as with the following video: People Pray on Streets for Jesus to Heal Their Land - YouTube.

The Congregation

As in reality, these extremely unfaithful people view themselves as being "the faithful."

Used by God and By Satan. Besides the congregation there are a few other characters who are part of the body of Christ. The shopkeeper and Erik represent those who are part of the body yet not sold on *the program*. They exist somewhere out there in the real world because God says "Thou hast a few names...which have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with me in white: for they are worthy" (Rev. 3:4, KJV). Right now they have little interest in the end time views, battles with "our" rights, or the many debates that go on within the body of Christ since God says "Avoid foolish questions, and genealogies, and contentions, and strivings about the law; for they are unprofitable and vain" (Titus 3:9, KJV). These people just take God at His Word (more than others) doing what they're told, like children. But not having grown much in Christ, they also get used by the antichrist since he's the "ruler of this world" (John 12:31, YLT) which currently includes the Church since God said "Let both grow together until the harvest" (Matt. 13:30 below) "both" being the elect and non-elect. And, again, the elect group includes born again and those who aren't born again. These born again servants are helpful at their own growth level. In fact, if it weren't for them Babette would have *zero* human help since she gets none from the congregation. And that's pretty much how it's worked for me in the real world. But since stuff is online I can use their material. There's just no fellowship with anyone.

For example, my husband who professes to be a believer doesn't pray with me or talk to me about the Lord, or about anything, other than chit chat now and then. However, he's been funding my life for our entire marriage of 30+ years which includes the work the Lord has me doing to "feed [His] sheep" (John 21:17, KJV). There are also many people God has me link to in my material who further expand on different points. Then there have always been Christians, weak as they were, *helping* me along—at least somewhat. The problem has been that because they've been so weak in their faith, they've quickly turned on me. You can see that take place in the movie as well with the shop keeper when Babette comes back to town with the turtle and other feast ingredients. Being immature in the faith, his opinions weren't grounded on the Word of God so that, like the rest, he's "tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive" (Eph. 4:14, KJV). Concerning Babette, someone he knew and respected, he essentially joins the crowd in "call[ing] evil good, and good evil" (Isa. 5:20, KJV). The only servant in the movie who didn't do that was Erik. And I've yet to come across such a person in real life though I know one day I will since God has told me that the "vision" is for "an appointed time" when some will "run" with it (Hab. 2:2-3, KJV). Or else I'll die never having come across such a person and God opens up this ministry after I'm dead. Either way, "for to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Phil. 1:21, KJV). And God knows I'd much rather die than stick around here with the likes of these types of "Christians." After so many years of this I'm feeling like Jesus when He said "O faithless and perverse generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I suffer you?" (Matt. 17:17, KJV).





As with those who are afraid of people of other cultures, or of people of color, or of people with disabilities, or whatever's different, rather than make the effort to build on common ground, the body of Christ along with so-called Christians who aren't actually born again put out a cold shoulder, honoring the antichrist rather than Christ when we've been called to "love one another" (John 13:35, KJV) including our "enemies" (Matt. 5:44, KJV). Or else they're very quick to hug you while actually being cold—being two-faced. And, according to God, "a double minded man is unstable in **all** his ways" (James 1:8, KJV, my emphasis). As in the movie, if you're unwilling to play Satan's game of fake love and spirituality, you're the one who gets blamed as serving Satan. It's how they treated Jesus.

- **His Family:** "Even his own brothers did not believe in him" (John 7:5, KJV).
- **His Friends:** "His friends...went out to lay hold on him: for they said, He is beside himself" (Mar, 3:21, KJV).
- **The Leaders:** "The Jews answered him, "Aren't we right in saying that you are a Samaritan and demonpossessed?" (John 8:48, NIV).
- **The People:** "The people answered and said, Thou hast a devil: who goeth about to kill thee?" (John 7:20, KJV).

And Jesus said "Remember the word that I said unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord. If they have persecuted me, they will also persecute you; if they have kept my saying, they will keep yours also" (John 15:20 KJV). So that's how it plays out in the movie and how I know—by faith—it will play out in my life as well. Persecution comes first, then a change of heart. At least among some. And for Jesus it really came after He died and was resurrected since, even though He had a following while He lived, "the hour c[ame]...that [all were] scattered, every man to his own, and...le[ft] Him] alone" (John 16:32, KJV).



They've Got it Backwards. Even though they've known Babette for fourteen years and she's obviously been a blessing to all of them, accustomed to eating slop and in the habit of lying to themselves—being carnal—they buy into the notion Satan whispered in their ears, that she's a witch because of the feast she's preparing, while viewing themselves as being "the faithful." It's the same thing they did to Jesus saying "He casteth out devils through the prince of the devils" (Matt. 9:34 below) while they viewed themselves as being holy even though they repeatedly attempted to "kill him" (Matt. 26:4, KJV). It's also what they did to Rhoda when she told them Peter was at the door. They said "Thou art mad" (Acts 12:15, KJV) while they were being hypocrites praying for Peter to be released. And when Paul was trying to get through to them they said "Your great learning is driving you insane" (Acts 26:24, NIV). So it's what they've done to me for over two decades summed up with the graphic. "God is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV). Had these people, the body of Christ, actually gotten to *know* the Lord beyond the mere acquaintance level, they would not have been afraid because "there is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear" (1 John 4:18, KJV). Neither would they have walked in pride since "God resisteth the proud" (James 4:6, KJV).

Because they're idolaters, they confuse God's goodness with Satan's wickedness and vice versa "call[ing] evil good, and good evil...put[ting] darkness for light, and light for darkness" (Isa. 5:20, KJV). We clearly see that in the movie with their treatment of Babette. And we clearly see it in reality with the false doctrine of hell. And at God's "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV) a remnant of the body of Christ, at least, will see it concerning their treatment of me summed up on the Welcome! video. History repeats itself repeatedly because those who profess to know the One true God—first Hebrews now Christians—call "good evil" and vise versa for "not knowing the scriptures, nor the power of God" (Matt. 22:29, KJV), as with the Salem witch trials portrayed in *The Crucible* (1996). Professing Christians who don't walk in the Spirit help Satan so that they become his "ministers" (2 Cor. 11:15, KJV). They help Satan and demons fulfill their desires of hurting the Lord and His people. It's what the body of Christ is has been doing in increasing measure for most of Christian history. As Jesus says "He that is not with me is against me; and he that gathereth not with me scattereth abroad" (Matt 12:30, KJV). "In returning and rest shall ye be saved; in quietness and in confidence shall be your strength: [but] ye would not" (Isa. 30:15, KJV).

In short, both in the movie and in reality, they've viewed the "cup of salvation" (Ps. 116:13, KJV) as evil! As servant of the "most High" (Isa. 14:14, KJV) Babette is doing what Jesus did (as am I) when He said "This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me" (1 Cor. 11:25, KJV). And He also says through Paul "Whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord" (1 Cor. 11:27, KJV). And, again, the body of Christ has been drinking the cup of the Lord unworthily for most of Christian history! Therefore, while called to be "the light of the world" (Matt. 5:14, KJV) to bring healing and growth, because we *haven't* walked in the truth as a group, the whole world is facing "great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time" (Matt. 24:21, KJV).



They Give Her the Silent Treatment. Rather than *address* their concerns they choose to be silent. It's what they've done to me as God informed me they would do when He called me to start speaking up to the body of Christ in the late 1990s, using the following passage as one of those by which He led me:

They hearkened not unto me, nor inclined their ear, but hardened their neck: they did worse than their fathers. Therefore thou shalt speak all these words unto them; but they will not hearken to thee: thou shalt also call unto them; but they will not answer thee. But thou shalt say unto them, This is a nation that obeyeth not the voice of the LORD their God, nor receiveth correction: truth is perished, and is cut off from their mouth (Jer. 7:26-28, KJV).

The body of Christ today has done worse than our fathers because we've had more advantages. We've had God's Spirit within, the completed Bible, *and* modern technology. Not only is the Bible available for us online with search engines so that we can carry it in our back pocket or purse at all times, just about every resource ever written is online or readily available!







As in real life, they reveal their immaturity because spiritually mature people "demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and...take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV). Being a disciple of Christ is something done actively not passively. Called to "love one another" (John 13:35, KJV) including our "enemies" (Matt. 5:44, KJV) requires that we *communicate*. If they had done that and still thought she/I was a servant of Satan then they still had the responsibility to do much more than simply ignored her. They should have had "nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness, but rather expose[d] them" (Eph. 5:11, KJV). And in the following passage, Jesus gave us very clear directions for how to expose someone's fruitless deeds of darkness:

[Jesus said] If your brother or sister sins, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over. But if they will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If they still refuse to listen, tell it to the church; and if they refuse to listen even to the church, treat them as you would a pagan or a tax collector.

According to Scripture there is a three-step process:

- 1. Address them privately;
- 2. Address them with another brother or sister in Christ; and
- 3. Address them before the entire congregation.

But that's not what the hirelings do. Like the Pharisees they don't "test the spirits to see whether they are from God" (1 John 4:1, NIV) but instead throw their unbiblical opinions at you and either give you their commands by which you can remain among them or send you away in secret. And since the congregation is made up of mere "babes in Christ" (1 Cor. 3:1, KJV) who idolize the hirelings, they get away with it.

They're Blind Hypocrites. They sing of God's bountiful provision while they live in spiritual poverty. One of their favorite hymns—which they sing right after making their vow to lobotomize themselves—says "Never would You give a stone to a child who begs for bread." Yet they live on daily slop and call genuine fellowship, the feast Babette/the Lord's servant, is preparing, a witches' sabbath. Not only is their food drab, everything about them is drab, most importantly their fellowship with God and man. While they've been born again for decades (those who have been), they barely know the Lord. And while they've known each other for decades, they barely know each other! And everyone who has attended the same congregation for at least a year knows that's how it is in reality—unless, of course, you're part of the group that is the most lobotomized—those in leadership roles. What the congregation does in the movie and in reality can be summed up with these graphics.





Fake Communion





So the few who have spoken to me over the years have accused me of holding a grudge and being unforgiving. That's all they can see! Yet if that were true I wouldn't still be *praying* for them after over two decades! Neither would I be doing everything I can to *help* the body of Christ. It's SUPER blind and hypocritical because *they* aren't exactly people of prayer. That's one of the last things the body of Christ is into—and they know it. Ask most professing Christians about their prayer life and they'll admit it's not much. Yet they have no conviction about it whatsoever, or not enough conviction to change. And yet they consider themselves more faithful! Talking to Christians today really is like talking to a corpse. So it's what plays out in the movie at the table when the general tries to communicate with them. They don't understand him *at all!*

Their Focus and Prayers are Off. As you can see by the lyrics to the hymns they sing and their so-called prayers, their spiritual focus is on the next life, as if this life is merely meant for us to "believe" in Christ and live for ourselves. So while that's what most of the body of Christ has historically done in reality, it **TOTALLY** contradicts the Gospel message.

For example, they recite a prayer at the table (as they typically do in the movie and often do in real life) like a bunch of pagans when Jesus clearly says "When ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do" (Matt. 6:7, KJV).



And if they actually *believed* the Gospel message, they would KNOW that their souls will—without a doubt—rise up to serve the Lord. Yet that's what they're 'praying' *for*, not exactly "tak[ing] captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV). Just *listen* to the how they pray in most of the so-called churches and Christian gatherings. It's typically words of men and/or totally self-centered when biblical prayer should be grounded in God's Word and focused on His kingdom. That's how He taught us to pray when the disciples specifically asked Him about it. Jesus said "When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites..."This, then, is how you should pray...your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (Matt. 6:5-10, NIV). It's all about Him and what He's doing! And it's not as if such a prayer will ever be answered when the born again are focused on living for this world. Who else is going to do God's will if not those who have

His Spirit within? Jesus said "If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world" (John 15:19, KJV). Yet today's Christians are so involved in the world and it's ways—Satan's world and Satan's ways—you can hardly tell who's actually born again and it would seem none of the are because God says "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him" (1 John 2:15, KJV). If not for God's grace in that when He gives us His Spirit for having obeyed Him, having strayed from Him after we've received His Spirit He doesn't take it away from us, as we're told in the following passages, for example:

The Holy Spirit...God has given to those who obey him (Acts 5:32, NIV).

For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if any man build upon this foundation gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble; Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is. If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward. If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire (1 Cor. 3:11-15, KJV).

He anointed us, set his seal of ownership on us, and put his Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come (1 Cor. 1:21-23, NIV).

If not for God's grace there wouldn't be *anyone* who's actually born again today considering how the body of Christ has been living and what we've been believing for centuries!

They Don't Engage their Brains. During one of their quarrels you see just how little they engage their brains even after decades of having joined the congregation. The man is so brain dead that even Martina ignores him when he says "God forgives everything...Doesn't He, Martina?"

So while the flock is made up of babes in Christ "though by this time [after decades, they] ought to be teachers" (Heb. 5:12, NIV), they all assume the sisters who represent so called Christians leaders and are hardly more enlightened than they are will be rich in the next life! A great example of this in the real world is with Ravi Zacharias. Most professing Christians didn't even begin to question him until after his death and the extent of his unrighteous life was revealed. (And many *still* defend him!) Another good example was in 2012 with Tom White, the Executive Director of the *Voice of the Martyrs*, the leading ministry reaching out to the persecuted members of the body of Christ. Yet he killed himself because the FBI was investigating accusations against him of child sexual abuse. If he hadn't been guilty he would not have killed himself. Yet another good example is Billy Graham, the Freemason. Had Christians "take[n] captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV) as admonished, they would have seen with much of the material VOM distributes that it doesn't line up with sound doctrine, same with Billy Graham—and *all* the hirelings.











The Lost

I discern the lost in the movie are represented by those they bring meals to, like *Meals on Wheels*. And they're just like the lost in reality—demanding, ungrateful, impatient, scoffers.

Demanding & Ungrateful. You can see how demanding and ungrateful they are with the man Martina brings lunch to as he bangs his spoon up and down and then doesn't even appreciate it. While it's certainly slop that he's being fed—as it is in real life—it's still better than nothing and at least an attempt at helping him. And when it comes to spirituality and getting enlightened to the truth, it's *not* as if anyone owes us anything.

Impatient Scoffers. Grinding the coffee, the carriage driver does a double take as if shocked that so little has been ground and that he has more work to do. So you see him mumble to himself in complaint. It sums up the attitude of the lost who scoff at everything God has given them and at Christians who try to help them saying things like "Where is the promise of his coming? for since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation" (2 Pet. 3:4, KJV). In other words, the Bible is a fairytale since the Lord hasn't yet returned. However, if they actually *read* the Book and took God *seriously* they would see that God's plan for humanity works out best for those who are the opposite of what they're being. "God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble" (James 4:6, KJV).

However, because of his overall attitude I discern the carriage driver in the movie represents a lost soul who gets enlightened to the truth but has no roots, hasn't bothered to do what Jesus said. "Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me" (John 6:45, KJV). To get past his carnality and surface level understanding—and actually become born again—he would have to dine at the table, meaning with Jesus, and not just get fed by His servant. Scripture says "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling" (Phil. 2:21, KJV). This man represents the one who hears the word and receives it with joy but has not root (highlighted) from the parable of the sower in the following account:

When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path. The seed falling on rocky ground refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful. But the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands it. This is the one who produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown" (Matt. 13:19-23, NIV).



And no matter what kind of 'soil' we've had in the past we can *develop* 'good soil' by steeping our heart and mind in God's Word and learning from the Father in order to come to Christ, and then learning from Christ who says "Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls" (Matt. 11:29, KJV). So with everything the Lord has shown me I'd say that we have all been guilty of taking other people's yoke's and learning from them. Because, had the body of Christ done what Jesus told us to do we would not have landed the Church or world in the mess we currently find ourselves. So while He's given me this ministry using many souls to help us grow in Christ quickly, we each still have to learn *from Him* so as not to get derailed. Again, we have to "take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV). That's why have to steep ourselves in God's Word, so that we know what Christ has actually said and done. That's the only way we can separate His voice from Satan's voice in the Bible and in the world, summed up with this graphic and covered in detail in *Satan Exposed: Rightly Diving the Word*.



PART THREE: THE FEAST

Jesus says "My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink" (John 6:55, NIV). He therefore also says "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me" (Rev. 3:20, NIV). Therefore, the biblical interpretation of this movie is all about dining with Him. In fact, having called me as a prophet (Matt. 23:34 & Eph. 4:11-12 below), to "prepare the way" (Matt. 3:3, NIV) for His second coming, His physical return to earth, He's using me like Babette with the ministry He has given me having called me to "write the vision" so that His people can "run" with it at His appointed time (Hab. 2:2-3 below). While Babette prepared a feast of physical food, the Lord has had me prepare a feast of spiritual food since that's the calling, to "feed [His] sheep" (John 21:17, KJV).

Matthew 23:34, KJV Wherefore, behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall...persecute...from city to city.

Ephesians 4:11-12, YLT He gave some [as] apostles, and some [as] prophets, and some [as] proclaimers of good news, and some [as] shepherds and teachers, unto the perfecting of the saints, for a work of ministration, for a building up of the body of the Christ.

Habakkuk 2:2-3, KJV The LORD answered me, and said, Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may run that readeth it. For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry.

The General at the Beginning of the Feast

The general is Lorenz Lowenhielm grown up. Having become born again he nevertheless chose to spend his adult life living for himself. It's what most born again have historically done.

He Holds Himself Accountable. Aged, Lorenz has finally admits that the path he took—though he excelled by worldly measures—was actually empty. It's what God warned us about throughout the Bible. He says, for instance, "How long will you people turn my glory into shame? How long will you love delusions and seek false gods?" (Ps. 4:2, NIV). Living for yourself is to live for Satan since he's the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV). And both he and we are "false gods" because we're not God Almighty. So while the general is at this point somewhat enlightened that the path he chose was lacking, he doesn't *fully* understand until he dines at the Table and eats the food prepared by Papin's friend, Babette. Jesus says to those who believe in Him, the body of Christ, "I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you" (John 15:15, NIV). And since Babette actually took Him seriously, she's been a much better friend to him than all the others. *Fulfilling* her calling—the "good works, which God hath before ordained that [she] should walk in" (Eph. 2:10, KJV)—she's made this feast. And Jesus says "My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink" (John 6:55, NIV). Therefore, the food being served is both physically and spiritually nourishing. It's what truly Christian families should (and could) have been experiencing day in and day out, like a joyful Thanksgiving feast every day! Except we all know that reality is more like how everyone actually celebrates Thanksgiving, a severely dysfunctional family reunion.

A Fight We Can Win. As he dresses for the feast he's afraid that years of victory will end in defeat. And this is how it will play out for the "hireling[s]" (John 10:13, KJV), as well as all born again Christians who've been successful in this world having focused rather than on the Lord. "You cannot serve both God and money" (Matt. 6:24, NIV). In other words, you're either going to live for God or for yourself. And, like the general, most born again Christians have lived for themselves. So while you've had years of victory in this world it's ending in absolute defeat because God's Plan doesn't just concern this life.



But, because of God's grace it will turn out well during this life for those who'll finally repent. You have to be willing to die to yourself as Jesus said in the following passage:

If the grain of the wheat, having fallen to the earth, may not die, itself remaineth alone; and if it may die, it doth bear much fruit; he who is loving his life shall lose it, and he who is hating his life in this world—to life age-during shall keep it (John 12;24-25, YLT).


By surrendering to God we end the war we've been fighting. We need to do like Paul who wrote "I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize" (1 Cor. 9:26-27, NIV). It's a fight we can win when we remember that "whatsoever is not of faith is sin" (Rom. 14:23, KJV). Everything we do things not prompted by faith, by the Lord's leading, will *burn* when He tests our works by fire so that we'll "suffer loss" (1 Cor. 3:15, KJV). So while it may appear like a good work from a worldly perspective, it's actually pointless—a total waste of time!

He's Undiscerning. Not having yet dined at the table, coming into the feast, while his aim is right in helping the woman sit down, he's a bit rough. Just take a look at her face in the movie. Rather than allow her to take her own time he forces her to plop down. That's the body of Christ as a whole today. They think they're so together since they're born again when their version of the Good News is a massive lie. *Great. I'll get to live forever knowing everyone I've ever known and loved—along with most of humanity—will be burning in hell suffering torment FOR THE REST OF ETERNITY. Hallelujah? That's a huge plop! Or rather, flop. You have to be pretty wicked to find a joy in that! And that says it all since the body of Christ has rejoiced in it for centuries! As He says "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV).*

In fact, today there are professing Christians singing about God coming to burn people alive and rejoicing in that, as with the following video: Prince David : YouTube (Jump to 58:40). This is not a servant of Christ but of the antichrist. When Scripture says that "the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men" (2 Pet. 3:7, KJV), that fire isn't coming from God but allowed by God. Big difference. And the following passage makes it clear that it's coming from Satan, aka "the dragon" and "the beast." Moreover, it's because of the body's of Christ's historical unfaithfulness to Christ that the following will take place, is already taking place:

They worshipped the dragon which gave power unto the beast: and they worshipped the beast, saying, Who is like unto the beast? who is able to make war with him?...And I beheld another beast coming up out of the earth; and he had two horns like a lamb, and he spake as a dragon. And he exerciseth all the power of the first beast before him, and causeth the earth and them which dwell therein to worship the first beast, whose deadly wound was healed. And he doeth great wonders, so that he maketh fire come down from heaven on the earth in the sight of men, And deceiveth them that dwell on the earth by the means of those miracles (Rev. 13:4-13, KJV).

This passage is speaking of "the devil...[that] liar" (John 8:44, KJV) who "deceiv[es] the nations" (Rev. 20:3, NIV), who get deceived for not having taken God seriously so that they do the following for which they receive woe, getting burned alive, for example. Scripture says "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness, who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter" (Isa. 5:20, NIV). In contrast, "God is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV) and "light, and in him is no darkness at all" (1 John 1:5, KJV). So the whole thing can be summed up with the following graphics. All those black lines represent false doctrines we've believed as a group for not "bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, KJV).



The Table. Jesus says "Blessed are the eyes which see" (Luke 10:23, KJV). So, unlike the others who seem to be blind to the beauty of the table, as if it's *nothing* compared to the drab life they're accustomed to when it's the extreme opposite, the general who is accustomed to such a setting immediately takes notice. You can see that by the way he looks at the table and then at those around him and back at the table. Then as he sits down you see him acknowledging something unique is taking place which is exactly how it plays out.

For example, he's immediately amazed by the sherry, the best he's ever tasted, and certain the turtle soup is genuine. And the whole meal gets better and better with every bite. As it is in real life, the closer we walk with the Lord the better our relationship with Him gets. It's like the better Jesus tastes since Scripture says "O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him" (Ps. 34:8, KJV). But you don't *stop* tasting! It's like if someone gave you a piece of pie (or whatever food is your favorite of all time), you wouldn't just take one taste and leave it at that. You'd keep eating, probably stuffing yourself. And that's what we *should* do spiritually. We can never get enough because Jesus, the "food" (John 6:55, NIV) is like an endless reservoir "for God gives the Spirit without limit" (John 3:34, NIV).



One of the reasons many who were once interested in Christ stopped being interested in Him—as least in our day—has been because we're living at the bottom of the barrel of the prophesied "falling away" (2 Thess. 2:3, KJV), the great apostasy. Therefore, Christianity today is *overloaded* with lies and carnal people. Separating the lies from the truth and then standing up for the Truth, and Jesus is "the truth" (John 14:6, KJV), is beyond exhausting at this point! And it's what Scripture says, what Daniel prophesied. "He [referring to Satan] shall speak great words against the most High, and shall wear out the saints of the most High" (Dan. 7:25, KJV). Being able to stand firm in the faith going against every grain there is takes a load of effort and conviction, more than most have so that "narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it" (Matt. 7:14, KJV). And among those who do, very few will actually hear Jesus say to them "Well done, thou good and faithful servant" (Matt. 25:21, KJV). Because, it's not as if those who "suffer[ed] loss [and were]... saved; yet so as by fire" (1 Cor. 3:15, KJV) are going to hear that from Him!

So while the man chose to live his life for himself rather than for the Lord "God hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities" (Ps. 103:10, KJV) so that he's not going to totally waste his *entire* life away. As with reality concerning the body of Christ, God is giving the man an opportunity to salvage what's left of his life. At this feast the Lord will remove the blinders from his eyes just as it will be in real life in God's "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV) through this ministry, the "food" He's had me prepare for His "sheep" (John 21:17, KJV). God says "When you did these things and I kept silent, you thought I was exactly like you. But I now arraign you and set my accusations before you" (Ps. 50:21, KJV). "Now" will be at God's "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV).

The Congregation

They're Undiscerning Hypocrites.

Not having taken God seriously these people are blind. They talk of nothing but the surface level and can't understand what the general says to them-at least not until they've spent some time eating the food. Even then it barely sinks in. So while the man says that the food was of no importance at the wedding in Cana it was of great importance because Jesus performed His first public miracle there by turning the water into wine! It's like a so-called elder from Eagle Church in Indianapolis who came to our home and spoke of how we'll still be dealing with racism in heaven! Not according to God's Word since, for one thing, "we shall be like him" (1 John 3:2, KJV). And Christ is not racist having "purchased for God persons from every tribe and and people and nation" (Rev. 5:9, KJV). This is the level of spiritual maturity held by the so-called elders in today's version of Christianity!



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
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And as with the wine at Cana, the general recognizes that this is an Amontillado and the best he's ever tasted. Blind to God's presence because of their intense pride, Jesus rebuked the Jews and teachers of the law as He's doing to the body of Christ today saying "O ye hypocrites, ye can discern the face of the sky; but can ye not discern the signs of the times?" (Matt. 16:3, KJV). The amontillado represents this interpretation and ministry for those who can see, "an extraordinarily complex and interesting" ministry. I'm not being proud but spiritually discerning. As far as I'm aware, no one else is interpreting secular resources as the Lord has me doing. And they're not because the entire body of Christ is made up of outrageously blind hypocrites—to one degree or another.

Seeing Satan's hand hidden in plain sight, as some are, revealed on YouTube, for example, isn't the same thing. Since Satan is the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV) we *should* be able to see his hand and hear his voice all over! That's EASY. Satan is so proud he's *yelling* all over the place. How could you not hear his voice and see his hand?! It's hidden not only in plane sight but in every single layer of this world, this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT).

In contrast, God's voice is *subtle*. To clearly see God's hand and hear His voice, you need to know His Word well *and* you "be still" (Ps. 46:10, KJV). So that's probably the biggest difference between me and the typical born again Christian. God has worked in a way in my life so that I'd have the conviction to "stand firm in [my] faith" (Isa. 7:9, NIV) which has left me from the very beginning quite isolated getting increasingly *more* isolated with time whereas most Christians are just like the world running around super busy like chickens with their heads cut off. And in order to take very thought captive to Christ (2 Cor. 10:5) that thing needs to be *attached*.

Moreover, mature followers of Christ should be able to see the Lord's hand all over the place, which is the point. They don't. Even when it's pointed out to them, they don't get it. It reveals how much we have grieved God because He's the One, the only One, who can remove the blinders. It's like He's been holding them in place, like this graphic and passage. "As they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient" (Rom. 1:28, NIV).



So what's taking place in the movie during the dinner between the general and the others at the table is what has been taking place in reality for me for the past 22 years. It's as if I've been the general talking to the Oblivious Ones at the table, professing Christians, who can't understand anything I'm saying. It's the following passage playing out:

The LORD hath poured out upon you the spirit of deep sleep, and hath closed your eyes: the prophets and your rulers, the seers hath he covered. And the vision of all is become unto you as the words of a book that is sealed, which men deliver to one that is learned [the born again], saying, Read this, I pray thee: and he saith, I cannot; for it is sealed: And the book is delivered to him that is not learned [professing Christians and the lost who are not born again], saying, Read this, I pray thee: and he saith, I am not learned (Isa. 29:10-12, KJV).

They Lie to Themselves and Each Other. While they view themselves as being the faithful lovers of "the truth" (John 14:6, KJV), they're unfaithful *liars*. The whole time while they're eating they lie to themselves and each other that it's not delicious, refusing to comment about it, yet—at the same time—they copy the general so that they can get the most out of it, as with the soup. Rather than continue to use the spoon they drink it down, it's so yummy.

In reality, I—as I'm sure others—have experienced this with the hirelings and other supposedly mature Christians. While the hirelings always rejected what God had me saying to them, they then preached what I wrote to them word for word as if it was something they thought of, revealing that they *knew* it was actually coming from God. Because, like the Pharisees of old, "they love...human praise more than praise from God" (John 12:43, NIV). And, again, they're liars. They "belong to...the devil...for he is a liar and the father of lies" (John 8:44, KJV).

However, if they're elect they'll be given the opportunity to choose to turn their back on Satan as they finally do in the movie. Some while some of them are actually born again, by walking in the carnal lying ways they again turned back to Satan just "as a dog returneth to his vomit" (Prov. 26:11, KJV). Such lovely people.



They're Hearts are Changed. They don't start waking up to themselves until the champagne is served. So while they're very slow to wake up to themselves, as in reality, it begins with the man being honest about how bad he had been. As Scripture says "At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another" (Titus 3:3, NIV). Likewise, people like Kerry Bowman will remember and admit the truth of their past bad actions. Waking up to themselves begins with the champagne because it represents the blood of Christ. God has used two other secular resources to confirm this to me since He's also had me interpret them, the movie *Ratatouille (2007)* and the song *Hotel California* by the Eagles. Jesus said "This cup is the new covenant in my blood" (1 Cor. 11:25, KJV). In *Ratatouille* when they toast to his health the rat gets totally covered in the wine like when Christians talk about being *covered in the blood*. And in *Hotel California* the "pink champagne" is "on ice," meaning that this feast, the "latter rain" (Joel 2:23, KJV) is about to be served and these ice cold hearts among the body of Christ are about to be changed—finally. Again, at least a decent sized remnant. That's the reason a Chef has his servant put the champagne on ice. They're getting ready to serve it.



Special Treatment. Babette gives the general free refills since, speaking of reality, he represents the elect hirelings who've been called to serve as leaders among God's people. It's what the Lord has had me do with certain people over the last two decades. While He's had me reach out to many in writing, for most it was just a letter. However, some got personal books—a detailed explanation of what I discerned God saying. While none of them took it seriously, at one point one of them will getting the ball rolling in the right direction. And as far I'm concerned I've written the last book (which I'm mailing in June of 2021). While it wasn't to an "official" leader in the so-called Church, referring to those institutional buildings, he's a leader in the community (Indianapolis) and, according to a blog I read on his website God had called him as a missionary. I'm speaking of Bryan Brenner.



However, like Lorenz (and the majority of the body of Christ), he took a different route and instead fulfilled his own will as opposed to God's—and focused on this world when God clearly told us not to do that. For instance, Scripture says "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world" (1 John 2:15, KJV). "No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier" (2 Tim. 2:4, KJV). The good news is that "the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable" (Rom. 11:29, ESV). So, like Lorenz, he's getting another chance. Lord willing he'll make the most of it.

And as far as I understand it, the calling of the prophet is essentially as Babette says, to "fill" the "general's" glass whenever it's empty—and it's empty! Scripture says "I wish you all...may prophe[s]y...that the assembly may receive edification" (1 Cor. 14:5, YLT). In other words, we're called to fill the man's glass/prophesy to them "so that the church may be built up" (1 Cor. 14:5, ESV). Focus is on the general/the leader since impact flows down. While Christianity's leaders have been very unfaithful, for the most part, they still know God's Word better than most. So when some of those born again leaders repent, or become born again, they'll have a much more powerful impact than if someone with less Bible knowledge and a smaller following was to repent. They're closely connected to other professing Christian leaders worldwide, many of whom are also elect but either not born again or backslidden. And since they're all so proud, they'll more readily listen to one of their own than someone they view as a mere "lay" Christian—just like they all keep Babette in the movie at a distance while enjoying the fruit of her labor. For example, if the general in the movie had been more awake he would have asked to speak to the Chef to compliment her cooking and found out that it was indeed the one from the *Café Anglais*. But, like the norm, he was much more interested in receiving than in giving.

I'm hoping the general represents two of the actual hirelings from Eagle Church, the only "home church" the Lord ever gave me, Kerry Bowman and Eric Simpson. Both are still acting as leaders with an emphasis on the word "acting" since that system does not represent the actual Church Jesus is building, as revealed with the pyramids at the beginning of this document, for example. If Kerry and Eric were to get enlightened and actually got right with God, it would work out best, not only for them, but for the entire body of Christ as well as for many currently elect lost souls. And I discern it's not just them. At some point at least a remnant of elect hirelings will wake up to themselves and start walking in the truth salvaging what they can of their lives. Had they walked humbly before God and allowed His prophets to fulfill our calling within the body of Christ it would have worked out just as Babette says in the movie. Their glasses would have been constantly refilled—"a good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over" (Luke 6:38, NIV). And since their influence flows down it would have worked that way for the entire body of Christ and lost elect.

But, again, God knew this is how it would work out since all of our hearts are so "desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV).

Babette

Babette remains behind the scenes during the entire movie even though she's the main character. And God has made it *obvious* that I'm a main character. So while the sisters finally spoke to her about her cooking in the end, that was the extent of it. End of story. And I'm hoping that will be true for me as well. In other words, "For to me to live is Christ [what I've been doing], and to die is gain [what I can't wait to do]" (Phil. 1:21, KJV). See ya, Bye. While the "latter rain" (Joel 2:23, KJV) *will* be amazing, it *would* have been exciting to me 20 years ago, even 10 years ago. Not today. I just wanna call it done. But however God actually plays it out, I'm game.

It's All Good. Everything Babette serves is good and the next dish is even better. And that sums up the biblical interpretations as the Lord opened them up to me. However, except for the first one, *Hotel California*, I don't remember the order in which He gave them to me so I've just been putting them back up on my website as I've finished the last edit, making corrections in 2021 to incorporate all the Lord taught me, explained in *Welcome!* Basically, the longer I've walked with Him the more He's revealed, and He revealed the biggest lies we've believed in 2020. And because of all the detail and all my graphics, whenever He's revealed a decent amount it's worked like a ripple effect throughout my material. It impacts everything.





It's a Love Affair. The general says that the Chef at the Café Anglais, Babette, transforms the meal into a love affair. This is like a comparison between mainstream Christianity vs genuine fellowship with Christ so that it's also like this marriage graphic. The born again are mostly left of center when we should all be standing with the Lord as His best friend—His Wife. Babette's feast, like this ministry, represents the difference between the slop the hirelings have been feeding the people and the banquet the Lord has always had available for us. It's a love affair because Jesus, the "food" (John 6:55, KJV) is our "husband" (Isa. 55:5, KJV). And there is nothing better in this life, as far as I can see, than a genuine love affair. So the fact that Christ is the Man in love with us/me...it's as good as it gets! So while my husband in this world and I are like housemates in the spiritual world my Husband and I are like Best Friends. And we're connected by the grief caused by the body of Christ. It's like He holds out the box of tissues for me and I hold it out for Him. But when this "evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT) is finally over there will be no more need for those tissues. Hallelujah! "The Lord God will wipe away tears from off all faces; and the rebuke of his people shall he take away from off all the earth" (Isa. 25:8, KJV).







She's Fought Over. The general explains that in the past General Gallifet had fought for a woman. This was a real general "best known for having taken part in the repression of the 1871 Paris Commune" (*Wikipedia*). Gallifet represents Satan and Babette represents the woman, just as all who reject Christ are "antichrists" (1 John 2:18, KJV) and all born again represent the soon to be Bride of Christ, the woman. Concerning this past duel, Scripture says "there was war in heaven: Michael and his angels fought against the dragon; and the dragon fought and his angels" (Rev. 12:7, KJV). I reveal in *God's Plan* how Michael is actually Jesus. And the dragon is Satan. Christ and the leading antichrist and their supernatural supporting armies—the angels and the fallen angels (aka demons)—had a huge fight. And we're told in the previous verse (and throughout the Bible) what, or rather who, they were fighting about. It was "the woman [who] fled into the wilderness, where she hath a place prepared of God" (Rev. 12:6, KJV).

Since Satan set out to "be like the most High" (Isa. 14:14, KJV) he naturally wants the Lord's Girl for himself. And since God is greater than Satan, whom He created since "all things were made by him" (Col. 1:16, KJV), He protects the woman, the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV). And she's a *beautiful* woman because She carries the Good News (Rom. 10:15 below)—at least that's true among those who are actually awake—and it's a big part of the reason Satan wants her. Gallifet, who represents Satan, would risk his life for her because, while he *ruined* her life, he wants her for the goods she provides. And, again, that's not only how Satan behaves, but how all who serve him behave including those professing to serve Christ, especially the hirelings.

Romans 10:15, KJV How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!

And as one of God's prophets who He's using to "prepare...the way of the Lord" (Matt. 3:3, KJV) for His second coming, my life experience reveals that I've been fought over by Christ and the antichrist, summed up on the *Welcome!* video. Prophets are Christ types and that's how it works. Read the Bible.

In different ways all three women—Phillipa, Martina, and Babette—represent the woman, the body of Christ and soon to be Bride of Christ. As Babette, She was led by the Spirit/Papin into the wilderness—this dinky little town in the middle of nowhere—where she had a place prepared for her by God. As the sisters, though barely awake, they received as coordinated by the Spirit since God "worketh all things after the counsel of his own will" (Eph. 1:11, KJV). All three are friends of Papin/God. However, Babette proves to be a much better friend to Him than either two even though they're considered to be the acceptable and mature Christians.



So in the introduction letter Papin gave Babette at the very beginning of the movie, which she gave to the sisters, he wrote that when he thought of Martina and Phillipa he *recalled the perfume of wild lillies of the valley*. This flower is associated with the Lord's return, which is what God is getting at through this ministry and biblical interpretation. And the reason Papin/God recalled "wild" lillies is because that's what the body of Christ is, so wild She resembles "a prostitute" (Jer. 3:3, NIV).

Over the centuries, the **lily of the valley** has developed many **meanings**. The fragrant white flowers are often associated with traditional feminine values such as motherhood, purity, chastity and sweetness. ... The **lily of the valley** is also seen as a symbol of humility and a sign of Christ's second coming. May 1, 2018

Why She's So Valued. Babette is highly valued by both generals—Lowenhielm and Gallifet/the Christ and the antichrist—because she can cook. Since she *genuinely* values God's word—unlike these deadbeat Christians who represent the majority of the body of Christ, the meals she prepares don't look and taste like mud but like a love affair. And, again, there's nothing better than that in this life! And that's all the more true when you're talking about having a love affair with our Creator! As the most faithful and enlightened elder, Babette represents Her Majesty, the Queen, more than the others. And we're talking about a *queen* since in God's eyes the body of Christ is already married to the "King Of Kings" (Rev. 19:16, KJV) since, unlike us, He stands outside of time. It's already a done deal from His perspective. And the "collected sermons" She reads refer to the Bible, this Book made up of a collection of 66 works written by humans as directed by God.



She Cooks Flambé. Babette cooks flambé because it's as John said, whom God used to prepare the way for Christ's first coming. "He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16, NIV). They experienced the extent of this fire baptism 2000 years ago when "at that time there was a great persecution against the church" (Acts 8:1, KJV). And an even greater persecution—a greater fire baptism—has been prophesied for the last of the last days, "great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world" (Matt. 24:21, KJV). That's because it will parallel the greater outpouring of God's Spirit through the "latter rain" (Joel 2:23 below). God says the first outpouring/first rain was only "moderate" compared to what He'll be doing at the very end of this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT). And while there are "many antichrists" (1 John 2:18, KJV) we've been informed that before the Lord's return not only would there be a falling away from the truth (2 Thess. 2:2-4 below)—which the body of Christ has fulfilled—there



would also arise "that man of sin" who Daniel prophesied about saying that "he will speak words against the Most High and wear down the saints...and they will be given into his hand for a time, [two] times, and half a time [3½ years]" (Dan. 7:2, AMP). I'm thinking it's not one man but a *system*, the New World Order, which God *has* already exposed. The Lord had me put it together on a timeline I've called *Satan's Reign*.

Joel 2:23, KJV Be glad then, ye children of Zion, and rejoice in the LORD your God: for he hath given you the former rain moderately, and he will cause to come down for you the rain, the former rain, and the latter rain.

2 Thessalonians 2:2-3, KJV Be not soon shaken in mind, or be troubled...as that the day of Christ is at hand...for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first.

She Savors Her Wine. Babette doesn't eat any of the food she prepared. What she does do is thoroughly enjoy her wine. Because, it represents the covenant she has with Christ. It represents all things good while nullifying *all* the bad. Unlike the others, she *understands* "that all things work together for good to them that love God" (Rom. 8:28, KJV). Ironically, in the real world this is a passage Christians love to quote when they obviously don't actually *get it* since they blip over the part that says "to them that love God." If they actually *loved* God they'd honor Christ. As He says, "Whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent him" (John 5:23, NIV). And as a group the body of Christ has *not* honored Him. In other words, all things work out for our best when we *genuinely* love the Lord. God still works it out for us when we don't, but it doesn't work out for our best, neither during this life nor for the coming age. Unlike the rest, Babette has given *her all* to both God and man, just like some of us in the real world. Therefore, she can *thoroughly* enjoy her wine—which God is revealing I'm doing through these biblical interpretations. While I have regrets just like everyone else (if you don't you're either totally blind or a liar), mine aren't as big as most people's, especially among professing Christians. While most born again don't yet feel that regret, they will. Sooner or later.

And, strangely, the more enlightened we get the more regret we feel while—at the same time—the more joy in the Lord we have. Because, we *know* without a doubt that no matter how much we've messed up or how badly or for however long, "the Lord's mercies...are new every morning" (Lam. 3:22-23, KJV). Because of the work Jesus did on the Cross, "if we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9, KJV). But genuine confession isn't something we just do with out lips. It's a way of life. We actually *change* our ways. We've been told to "take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, KJV). However, it's impossible to take every single thought captive to Christ every moment that we're awake! Therefore, getting in the habit of asking the Lord to "search [us]...[to] See if there is any offensive way in [us], and lead [us] in the way everlasting" (Ps. 139:23-24, NIV), being in earnest and knowing God's Word well, we'll get convicted about areas where we've fallen short. Therefore, we *can* "produce fruit in keeping with repentance" (Matt. 3:8, NIV), as required.







The General During the Feast

As he dines at the table served delicacies from the kitchen by the Chef's *faithful* servants, the general wakes up to "the truth" (John 14:6, KJV).

His Mind is in a Quandary. Getting enlightened, the revelation is so extreme that the general feels overwhelmed. And that's how it's going to be for most when God finally opens up this ministry and they realize what they did and didn't do. They're going to feel like Isaiah when he said "Woe is me! for I am undone" (Isa 6:5, KJV). But, not really. Because, they *know* the Gospel message in that "if the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed" (John 8:36, KJV) and "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9, KJV). So it's more positive than negative no matter how negative it might be for those who

genuinely repent. Still, it's pretty overwhelming because we've been so outrageously unfaithful both as individuals and as a group. When you see everything God is saying about what we've done it blows the mind that we've been so evil! So while we feel this intense sorrow we, at the same time, feel this overwhelming relief. So it's exactly as he says in the movie.



And God helped us out by letting us know He knows how we've feel, in the following lyrics from Hotel California:

My head grew heavy and my sight grew dim...
And I was thinking to myself,
This could be Heaven or this could be Hell...
Some dance to remember, some dance to forget...
Last thing I remember,
I was running for the door
I had to find the passage back
To the place I was before

That will be the reaction especially among those who've done the most damage, people like Kerry Bowman, the elect hirelings.

The Others Don't Believe Him. As he's experiencing the feast before him, so excited about it, he tries to share his revelation with the others who don't believe him. But it's more like they don't *understand* him. That's how it is in reality because "the person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit" (1 Cor 2:14, KJV). They're not actually born again. I'm not speaking of everyone in at the table but of those he was addressing, just like those the Lord has had me address over the past two decades. And it's not just the lost who don't understand but the carnal. Carnal born again Christians also cannot understand what the Spirit is saying because they have beams blinding their eyes for being hypocrites (Matt. 7:5 below). And spiritually it works just like when we don't have our glasses on. Everyone who wears glasses *knows* that when we don't have them on we can't hear as well either. So, spiritually speaking, carnal born again Christians are both blind and deaf, which makes them pretty dumb.




Matthew 7:5, KJV Thou hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye.

He Realizes Everything was Given to Us. Reflecting on his life and what God has actually said and done, he finally gasps the fact that the god in his back pocket all of these years, the One he'd used for his advantage, has been none other than God Almighty for whom "all things are possible" (Matt. 19:26, KJV). And since He says "apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5, NIV), the general realizes that everything he'd accomplished wasn't actually because of his effort or intelligence but because of God's grace. Today's Christians don't really seem to *get* that. Because when you get it pride goes *completely* out the window.

He Realizes We Get Back Even What We Rejected. Having walked away from the Lord as the young Lorenz and pursued his own interests, yet now enlightened to what he'd done and the One he'd actually rejected even though he had lied to himself and others that he honored God, he realizes that even so he hasn't been abandoned. This ties in to the false doctrine many Christians preach, that you can lose your salvation when the New Testament clearly does not teach that. What you can do is waste your life away once you've become born again. So what you get back having been an apostate born again Christian is another opportunity to have close fellowship with the Lord your God. As James wrote to the believers, "Come near to God and he will come near to you. Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded" (James 4:8, KJV).

It also ties in to the false doctrine of hell. *Everyone* who has rejected Christ will one day get back the One they rejected so that while "in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive" (1 Cor. 15:22, KJV).

And we don't just get Christ whom we've rejected back, we get *everyone* we've rejected back (and even those we didn't reject). Because, according to Scripture, when it's *all* been said and done at the end of the ages, it will be like this graphic, which I walk through in *God's Plan: A Vision for the Body*.



Lord, thou hast been favourable unto thy land: thou hast brought back the captivity of Jacob. Thou hast forgiven the iniquity of thy people, thou hast covered all their sin. Thou hast taken away all thy wrath. thou hast turned thyself from the fierceness of thine anger. Turn us, O God of our salvation, and cause thine anger toward us to cease. Wilt thou be angry with us for ever? wilt thou draw out thine anger to all generations? Wilt thou not revive us again: that thy people may rejoice in thee? Shew us thy mercy, O LORD, and grant us thy salvation. I will hear what God the LORD will speak: for he will speak peace unto his people, and to his saints: but let them not turn again to folly. Surely his salvation is nigh them that fear him; that glory may dwell in our land. Mercy and truth are met together: righteousness and peace have kissed each other. Truth shall spring out of the earth; and righteousness shall look down from heaven. Yea, the LORD shall give that which is good; and our land shall yield her increase. Righteousness shall go before him; and shall set us in the way of his steps. Psalm 85





Fully Enlightened He Makes a Speech. Transformed by the meal (Rev. 3:20 below), the general gives a speech grounded in Psalm 85.

Revelation 3:20, KJV Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.

While the body of Christ has trampled God's Son, the Father is being merciful to those who will take Him seriously as He revives them with a fresh outpouring of His Spirit so that mercy and truth *will* merge and righteousness and peace *will* finally "kiss." While this happened 2000 years ago, it will happen again in a much more complete manner since it's being preached with more clarity as with the material covered in *Satan Exposed*, for example.

And when born again hirelings finally get fully enlightened they too will 'make a speech' in that they'll start speaking the truth. I'll know when God's "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV) has finally arrived because Christians will "run" with "the vision" (Hab. 2:2, KJV). They'll be so on fire for God they'll no longer be proud but humble and no longer ignore me but eager to communicate. They also won't be able to shut up about what God has revealed to them. To *run with the vision* means the same as when they saw the risen Lord in the following passage:

As it began to dawn toward the first day of the week, came Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulchre...And the angel answered and said unto the women, Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified...go quickly, and tell his disciples that he is risen from the dead...And they departed quickly from the sepulchre with fear and great joy; and did run to bring his disciples word (Matt. 28:1-8, KJV).

Had anyone tried, there's NO WAY you could have made those women shut up about it.

The Savior's Suffering. Take note of the general's closing remark about the Savior's suffering. Most born again seem to think of Jesus' suffering as having ended at the Cross. Except "he...lives" (Heb. 7:25, NIV). When we finally stop *grieving* Him (Eph. 4:30 below)—at least among a decent sized remnant—His suffering will finally be over. And that's what this ministry is about, getting us there. Place yourself in His shoes for a moment. If you had given *your* life for humanity suffering as brutally and shamefully as He did to do it—hanging there stark naked—and even those who were given Your Spirit ignored you, it would *deeply* hurt your feelings. And that's how it is. We have *sorely* grieved the Lord.


Ephesians 4:30, KJV Grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption.

All Beams Removed. At this point in the movie, at the end of the feast, the general's hypocritical beams have been removed (Matt. 7:5 below). He *finally* gets it. God is real and exceedingly good—better than he deserves since "He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities" (Ps. 103:10, KJV). The general finally understands that Jesus is Master of all and orchestrating all things all of the time as Scripture says. "All things were created by him, and for him" (Col. 1:16, KJV). Life *finally* makes complete sense. And that's how it will be for those who take God *seriously*. The more material you read which God has had me provide, taking Him seriously, the more enlightened you'll get as you remove the beams you've had in your eyes. And I'm not saying everything I'm saying is 100% correct. I'm pretty sure it's **not.** I address it elsewhere. The point is that God has had me reveal many of the beams members of the body of Christ currently have in their eyes. Remove those and then we'll finally be able to communicate and function as God meant for us, "submit[ting] to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Eph. 5:21, NIV).

Matthew 7:5, KJV Thou hypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye.

Part Four: After the Feast

Babette and Her Wine. This is when we see Babette savoring her wine. That's what I'll be doing when God finally opens up this ministry. I'll *enjoy* the fruit of my labor. So far it's been a long wait of sowing in tears as informed we *all* should have been doing (Ps. 126:5-6 in the graphic). Why? Because our goal is "to know Christ...[which we do by] participati[ng] in his sufferings" (Phil. 3:10, NIV). There's a huge difference between knowing someone as an acquaintance compared to knowing them like a good friend. And "there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother" (Prov. 18:24, KJV). The friend of Christ who sticks closer to Him than a brother is His Wife. For better or for worse, as Job noted when he rebuked his wife and said "Shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil?" (Job 2:10, KJV). And, again, it's not as if He causes evil. Rather, He allows it to build us up as we rely on Him to get us through it. So it doesn't mean we enjoy every minute of it. We *rely* on Him and *trust* Him to carry us through. All who rebuke me for not trusting God have NO CLUE as to what they're talking about because I've been trusting Him to come through for me for over two decades. If I'd stopped trusting Him I would have stopped praying for the body and reaching out to them, so I wouldn't now be working on this interpretation. In the end God *will* sort it out. "For there is nothing hidden that will not be disclosed, and nothing concealed that will not be known or brought out into the open" (Luke 8:17, NIV).



Admired by the Lost. We're told that when the body of Christ honored the Lord two thousand years ago, even the lost admired them, as we see in the following passage:

At the hands of the apostles many signs and wonders were taking place among the people; and they were all together in Solomon's portico. But none of the rest dared to associate with them; however, the people held them in high esteem (Acts 5:12-15, NASB).



You can see that esteem in the carriage driver's face as Babette admires the One who provided the wine. I discern the people will again hold the faithful in high esteem while also having a fear of God for a short time during the last of the last days soon coming upon us—during the peak of the "latter rain" (Joel 2:23, KJV).

Deserving God's Grace. The words in the subtitles and actual translation don't match. In the audio she says "You deserve God's grace." And that's how most Christians actually seem to think—considering some of the things they say, do and sing—totally missing the point! According to Scripture, no one deserves God's grace. Jesus made that clear when He rebuked the man saying "Why callest thou me good? there is none good but one, that is, God" (Luke 19:17, KJV). And our 2000 year history of apostasy nails the point. It's like the last thing we deserve is God's grace, but because God is gracious and loving, the apostate body of Christ is getting another dose of His overwhelming grace. That's the very meaning of grace, receiving what we DO NOT deserve.



Speaking the Truth. Even though they've dined at the table—spiritually referring to having become born again and dined with Christ (Rev. 3:20 below)—you still see lying influences lingering as one tells Christopher, who is obviously slow. He says "You're so intelligent, Christopher." This was neither a true or nice thing to say because lies honor "the devil...[who] is a liar, and the father of it" (John 8:44, KJV). A *positive* statement isn't noble if it's not true. And this is what Christians do, constantly lie to each other just like the lost. The very nature of institutional Christianity is centered on lies. It's a system of unwritten rules that must be obeyed or you'll be rejected by those people, just like Babette is rejected by them in the movie. Yet God says the following:

Such regulations indeed have an appearance of wisdom, with their self-imposed worship, their false humility and their harsh treatment of [members] the body [of Christ], but they lack any value in restraining sensual indulgence (Col. 2:23, NIV).

Revelation 3:20, KJV Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.

That's why there are so many "ministries" about pornography or money management, for example. Most so-called ministries are about improving your life in this world when God says "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him" (1 John 2:15, KJV). Today's version of Christians is mostly grounded in "self-made religion" (Col. 2:23, ESV) and false humility so that it lacks the ability to restrain sensual indulgences.

In contrast to that lie spoken to Christophe, as they leave the house someone tells him "Christopher, you're a prince." This comment is true and edifying. It's true since every born again soul is a child of the King and, therefore, a prince or princess. And it's encouraging because it reminds us of what's in store. Rather than honor Satan the "liar" (John 8:44, KJV) it *honors* our "King" (Rev. 19:16, KJV), Jesus. Scripture says "if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin" (1 John 1:7, KJV). But if we lie to one another we're walking in darkness and don't have genuine fellowship with each other and run the risk of not

actually having been cleansed by the blood of Christ. Since lying honors Satan it makes it highly questionable if that person is actually born again.

The Hymn in the Sitting Room. Phillipa—representing the fully enlightened and empowered body of Christ—sings about our rest being near, the sand in the clock running out, something's going to happen to the glories of this world. It sums up what God has said and is saying, in fact *yelling* when you consider all the signs of the times. And that's because "now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is [y]our salvation nearer than when [you] believed" (Rom. 13:11, KJV). We are nearly out of time.

So while many professing Christians knows and say the right words—just like Lorenz when he was younger as he set out to live for the world even though he'd become born again, the majority don't actually know God. Most professing Christians aren't actually born again and the few who are live like Lorenz, for *themselves*. They're just barely acquainted with the Lord. In turn, He continues to say "My people are fools; they do not know me. They are senseless children; they have no understanding. They are skilled in doing evil; they know not how to do good" (Jer. 4:22, NIV). Today's Christians haven't progressed beyond the disciple's level BEFORE they were born again! That's evident in many ways and clearly with the doctrine of hell. Because this is what transpired back then:

When his disciples James and John saw [that the people rejected Jesus], they said, Lord, wilt thou that we command fire to come down from heaven, and consume them, even as Elias did? But he turned, and rebuked them, and said, Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of (Luke 9:54-55, KJV).

Even though they literally walked with the Lord, they didn't really *know* Him. Likewise, by preaching the doctrine of hell—that God is going to burn most of the people He created, and do it forever—God is revealing how little even the born again have known "what manner of spirit [w]e are of." Because, "God is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV). He does not torture anyone and certainly isn't going to do that to most of the people He created and for whom Jesus died a brutal death! Unlike us, God is no hypocrite.



Going Back for the Wine. After all have left the table we see Erik going back to finish off the wine. That's what the more faithful are going to do in the last of the last days, *fully* appreciate the blood of Christ. "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ?" (1 Cor. 10:17, KJV). Communion with Christ is found in serving Him not yourself—something revealed by Erik's character. The only time he strayed was when tempted by the lost carriage driver. However, walking closely with the Lord he *immediately* heard the rebuke and got back on track.





And he wasn't tempted with something bad, it just wasn't the right timing for him. And that's how it is for the faithful. Having developed a great disdain for the things of this world, we mostly get tempted with good things which can derail us from fulfilling the "works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in" (Eph. 2:10, KJV).


Moreover, the Sisters would have harshly rebuked Erik had they seen him finish off the wine—as they do in real life when we give Jesus our all (even though that's what they preach we *should* do). By finishing off the wine Erik was honoring God who created those grapes (John 15:1 below) and provided that wine (Matt. 26:28-29 below) which someone else *didn't* appreciate. Discerning boy, he simply *couldn't* let that Treasure go to waste!


John 15:1, KJV I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman.

Matthew 26:28-29, KJV This is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.

Addressing His Beloved. In the last scene with Martina and the General, spiritually, he's speaking as the Lord to "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV). Though apart for a lifetime, He has always been 'with' His Beloved. In real time God's elect "the vessels of mercy...he had afore prepared unto glory" (Rom. 9:23, KJV) so that the Father has been drawing the elect to Christ our whole lives as summed up with the Elect Opportunity Line graphic and this verse (John 6:44 below). "He hath [also] said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee" (Heb. 13:5, KJV).

John 6:44, KJV No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him.





The fact is that they've both thought about each other plenty, *especially* Him about Her "seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for [Her]" (Heb. 7:25, KJV). Now—having supped together at the Table (Rev. 3:20 below) through this ministry since He's called me to "feed" His "sheep" (John 21:17, KJV) and function like Babette—it all it becomes clear. Lorenz, this soldier (2 Tim. 2:3 below), having wasted his life away, representing apostate born again Christians, especially those in leadership, finally fully understands the Father's Plan and begins living up to his calling.

Revelation 3:20, KJV I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.

2 Timothy 2:3, KJV [Christians were called to] endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.

However Martina is still *very* foggy since it's as Scripture says, "it is hard to make it clear to you because you no longer try to understand" (Heb. 5:11, NIV) But she eventually does come around. Essentially, the born again along with many lost elect will finally wake up to the truth behind God's Word and all that this means—speaking of a remnant (those who take Him more seriously)—and begin actually living life as God intended for us to live it, enjoying a spiritual love affair with the Lord Jesus Christ. We'll finally actually "live by faith" (2 Cor. 5:7, NIV). I discern that will happen in stages: first with born again in "leadership" positions, then with other born again souls, then with the lost elect, and finally with genuine descendants of the Israelites when the "the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled" (Luke 21:24, KJV) right before the Lord's return. I walk through it, at least somewhat, in *God's Plan: A Vision for the Body*.

Addressing Martina, the general/Jesus is speaking to each of the born again, His Queen(s) and asks Her/us for confirmation that we've known He's been with us every day of His life, which born again Christians *do* know since "all things were created by him, and for him" (Col. 1:16, KJV), for example. The problem is that we haven't *really* believed Him, like Martha at Lazarus' tomb. She *professed* to believe the truth, but when push came to shove she revealed that she didn't *really* believe it as we're informed in the following account:


Then said Martha unto Jesus, Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died. But I know, that even now, whatsoever thou wilt ask of God, God will give it thee. Jesus saith unto her, Thy brother shall rise again. Martha saith unto him, I know that he shall rise again in the resurrection at the last day. Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this? She saith unto him, Yea, Lord: I believe that thou art the Christ, the Son of God, which should come into the world...Jesus said, Take ye away the stone. Martha, the sister of him that was dead, saith unto him, Lord, by this time he stinketh: for he hath been dead four days. Jesus saith unto her, Said I not unto thee, that, if thou wouldest believe, thou shouldest see the glory of God? (John 11:21-27 & 39-40, KJV).

This is exactly what's happened with the body of Christ. As a whole we have not seen the glory of God manifested in the world because we've historically professed to believed the truth while proving by our actions that, like Martha, we haven't *really* believed Him. The difference is that unlike Martha the born again have had not only the completed Word of God but the Spirit within!

And, like Martha, the born again—whether we entirely believe Him or not—will see the glory of God displayed because we'll all get raptured at His coming as we're told in the following passage:

The Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever (1 Thess. 4:16-17, NIV).

Again, I walk through it in God's Plan and summed it up with this graphic.




He further speaks of the future, telling Her/us that we'll be dining together from now on, not physically but in spirit because He is our Lover (Isa. 54:5 & Jer. 3:14 below), and Friend (John 15:15 below). Having been both the worldly man in uniform and worldly Martina (and Phillipa), a born again remnant will, like the general in the movie, have *learned* that God is "the Word" (John 1:1, KJV) and that all things *are* actually possible through and for Him since "with God all things are possible" (Matt. 19:26, KJV).

Isaiah 54:5, KJV For thy Maker is thine husband; the LORD of hosts is his name.

Jeremiah 3:14, KJV Turn, O backsliding children, saith the LORD; for I am married unto you.

John 15:15, KJV I have called you friends.

Moreover, being that "his name is called The Word of God" (Rev. 19;13, KJV), Jesus is a man *of* His word. Not only does He "not lie or change his mind" (1 Sam. 15:29, KJV), He "cannot lie" (Titus 1:2, KJV). In other words, He keeps all of His promises, good and bad. So if you want to be on His good side, you'll admit that you've been living mostly for yourself and change your way of life. You'll stop going with the flow and, instead, start "bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, KJV) and go against the grain of this world including that of most professing Christians. It's essentially how Babette walked alone in the movie and I've done in real life—summed it up with this graphic.




The reason "few" find the way to life (Matt. 7:14 in the graphic) is because it's as narrow as a tightrope. Since we've been born into a world ruled by Satan the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV), we have to PAY ATTENTION when God reaches out to us so that we can become born again (John 6:45 below). Then we have to "continue to work out…our salvation with fear and trembling" (Phil. 2:12, NIV) so that we can escape the mess that our unfaithful ancestors made of Christianity.

John 6:45, KJV Everyone who has heard the Father and learned from him comes to me [says Christ].

Walking by faith I know that a faithful remnant will finally genuinely appreciate the truths of God's Word in increasing measure as we repent and rid ourselves of all offensive material from minds, hearts, and homes, having abandoned the institutional churches and all forms of fake worship and false doctrines. The more we discard, the more we'll see, the more the world will see. It's how God has *always* worked as we've been informed throughout the Bible. And He says "Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth" (Ps. 46:10, KJV)—and so He will. But, as always, it will only be a remnant that *fully* turns to God because humans are super self-absorbed. *That's* the point.

The General Leaves. Love renewed, the general/Jesus leaves His Beloved. What it means spiritually is that the body of Christ will move forward still on this earth unlike what many Christians believe, that we'll get raptured outta here before things get really bad. As someone else summed up with this graphic, the popular view of the timing of the rapture is a Jesuit lie.




Pre-Trib is false prophecy, based on a Catholic Jesuit lie.

However, like Martina who sees off the general without too much heartache, knowing that they *will* be together for all of eternity though physically apart for the rest of our lives on earth, those who take God seriously will also get empowered by God as never before since "God gives the Spirit without limit" (John 3:34, KJV) when we honor Him as required, "submit[ting] to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Eph. 5:21, NIV).

And knowing that no one is going to eternal burning hell or even *eternal* punishment of any kind, the remnant will finally be fired up about sharing the Good News since it *is* actually **Good** News! So the way I see it playing out is like these graphics.

Everything God has me saying through these biblical interpretations is all the same stuff God has repeatedly told us in the Bible, especially in the New Testament, but refreshing to hear it by a new means. All the broken relationships we've had over the course of our lives are *not* over. We just barely got acquainted! All the best is yet to come, which can begin now if we repent and ask forgiveness from God and each other. Scripture says "Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The



prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective" (James 5:16, NIV). A righteous person is someone who honors Christ. After death, our relationships will continue to improve and nothing will ever part us again—and that's *especially* true for "the household of the faith" (Gal. 6:10, YLT). The New Testament says:

Blessed [is] the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who, according to the abundance of His kindness did beget us again to a living hope, through the rising again of Jesus Christ out of the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and unfading, reserved in the heavens for you, who, in the power of God are being guarded, through faith, unto salvation, ready to be revealed in the last time (1 Peter 1:3-5, YLT).

The Song at the Well. This next to last scene in the movie represents Jacob's well where Jesus met the adulterous Samaritan woman–forerunner of Christianity, the BRAT, who pretty much totally ignores Him.



In the same way that the Samaritan woman went to town and told them about her conversation with Him, I'm doing this to my town, the world through the material He's had me put together since our technology has made the whole world reachable as if it was our whole town. Therefore, like the Samaritans, the discerning will look into it at God's appointed time and discover for themselves that the One I've been talking with *is* the Lord and the One she's been serving is not only herself but Satan. Here's the account:

The hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him. God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth. The woman saith unto him, I know that Messias cometh, which is called Christ: when he is come, he will tell us all things. Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am he...And many of the Samaritans of that city believed on him for the saying of the woman, which testified...And many more believed because of his own word; And said unto the woman, Now we believe, not because of thy saying: for we have heard him ourselves, and know that this is indeed the Christ, the Saviour of the world (John 4:23-42, KJV).

Part Five: When the Guests are Gone

Faithful Service. Besides Babette, Erik, the boy (a *child*), is the only one who does everything he's told wearing himself out without bickering, whining, or even a hint of back stabbing. He's the picture of the humble servant all elect were meant to be since Jesus says "Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein" (Mark 10:15, KJV). Nice shot of him too when the guests are leaving and he'd done everything required of him. *There* is a true Christian who's pleasing and acceptable unto God—asleep AFTER all the hard work has been done, and done well. This person will hear the Lord say "Well done, thou good and faithful servant" (Matt. 25:21 KJV).



In contrast, right now what Christians need to do is "Wake up!" (Rev. 3:1, NIV) because "night cometh, when no man can work" (John 9:4, KJV) and you're almost out of time.

Babette. Having spent all she had on the feast for the super slow sisters/professing Christians, Babette explains to them how and why she did what she did, so that she's *not* poor as they were thinking. And it's the same with me. Like the sisters, Christians have been super slow to understand because it's taken 22 years to get through to them (so far!). While all have considered me to be quite the loser, I'm quite the winner according to God. Even though I have no one with whom to even have a real conversation, not in my immediate or extended family, no friends, no fellowship, no paid job, no money, in fact, 'no life,' eating my meals all by my self just like Babette, I too am hardly poor in a very real sense, a sense that will far outlast the life for which nearly everyone else has been living. As He says:

Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you (Matt. 5:11-12, KJV).









Delighting the Angels. While it's true that we'll live up to our full potential in Paradise, the born again should have lived up to it during this life. But because our hearts are *so* "desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV) we've stifled one another and grieved the Lord, hardly delighting the angels. Because, Jesus informed us that "there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth" (Luke 15:10, KJV). But by standing in the way of those whom God has gifted with a higher calling, we stand in the way of sinners repenting so that what is and what *should* be can be summed up with these pie charts. I walk through them in another document. The point is that right now there is a HUGE lost harvest!

A God of Second Chances. While God's elect have been intensely **un**grateful, *especially* the born again, God is giving all of His elect the same opportunity as these fictional character, because He is the God of the seventy times seven second chances as we've been informed through His conversation with Peter who "said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times? Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven" (Matt. 18:21-22, KJV). God doesn't require *anything* from us that He hasn't been willing to do Himself.

Therefore, during these last of the last days, as professing Christians take God more seriously, a move of God—the full blown "latter rain" (Joel 2:23, KJV)—will spread around the world so that God will fulfill His purpose for His Church during this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT), as revealed in the following passage:

Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it; That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish (Eph. 5:25-27, KJV).

May you be a part of that glorious group!
