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
For starters, having gotten super proud, today's professing Christians—including the born again—talk about having "accepted Christ" when that is **totally** unbiblical.




Speaking of seeing humans as leaders among God's people, He says "Let these also first be proved, then let them minister" (1 Tim. 3:10, YLT). Likewise, we have to prove ourselves to God. He says "Prove the sincerity of your love" (2 Cor. 8:8, KJV). In fact, He tells us to prove ourselves to *ourselves*. He says "Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves" (2 Cor. 13:5, KJV). Because, we might not actually be born again when we think we are! Proving our sincerity to God over a season of time, He *then* places His Spirit inside of us.




It's not as basic as today's Christians teach—focusing almost exclusively on our need to believe—since loads of people who claimed to be believers during this life will hear Him tell them they have no place in His kingdom (Matt. 7:22-23). Unsaved souls can "cast out devils" and do "many wonderful works" (Matt. 7:22) because their "coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders" (2 Thess. 2:9, KJV). This occult manifestation of "lying wonders" goes by many different names Kristian Jyoti - Demon Magician Performance: Levitation, Yoga, Change Eyes, juggling — YouTube and you see it throughout the institutional churches Kundalini Warning (FULL) -- Andrew Strorm — YouTube.



Being born again isn't just about "getting into heaven." As Christians *profess* to know, it's much more about getting to know the Lord during this life, having a close personal relationship with Him. And without being born again we can't clearly hear His voice (1 Cor. 2:14) or see His hand in the world around us. We also easily get deceived by "the forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph. 6:12, NIV).



Loads of people hear a voice they think is God's when it's Satan and/or "his ministers" (2 Cor. 11:15, KJV) deceiving them.




Most born again are like Unitarians who think that every prayer that gets answered has been answered by God when that's what Satan does since he's "a liar and father of it" (John 8:44, KJV). The only way to know that our prayer's have been answered by God is by being "born again" which Christ said we "must be" (John 3:7, KJV) AND by "bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, KJV). Meaning, it has to line up with the "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV). For instance, asking God if it's OK to be a lesbian I might hear the OK through a sermon or in loads of different ways. However, the New Testament/new covenant makes it very clear in Romans 1 that homosexuality is a sin, specifically in the following verses:


Dishonourable affections, for even their females did change the natural use into that against nature; and in like manner also the males having left the natural use of the female, did burn in their longing toward one another (Rom. 1:26-27, YLT, my emphasis).




Again, even born again Christians get deceived by "the spiritual forces of evil" (Eph. 6:12, NIV) when we don't "take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV).



And to do that—to be able to take every thought captive to Christ—you have to know the Bible well so that you can tell if what was said in the Old Testament was actually coming from Lord God and not Lord Satan "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV). Since God has said "I the LORD do not change" (Mal. 3:6, NIV) if something doesn't line up with the gospel books (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John)—the character of Christ—it can't have come from God. Therefore, we can't use it to back up our case as so many professing Christians do as with "eye for [an] eye" (Lev. 24:20, KJV). We are under the "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV). The Lord's life, presented in the gospel books, is what everything has to measure up to.




God gave Lord Satan, "the god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV), authority (Luke 4:6-7) because He's proving to humanity—especially "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) during this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT)—just how unfaithful and "desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV) we actually are, as He informed us throughout the Bible.




Even the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) has taken God increasingly less seriously with time landing the world in the mess we're in today. Yet all we had to do was "submit...to God. Resist the devil, and he w[ould have had to] flee" (James 4:7, NIV).




God says "Whatsoever is not of faith is sin" (Rom. 14:23, KJV) because if we're not serving the Lord we're serving Satan. It's **always** either one or the other, every day with every action. That's why we're supposed to "take captive **every thought** to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV, my emphasis). Yet Christianity for most of Christian history has been a religion when God made it clear in the New Testament that He doesn't live in temples made of stone (Acts 7:48, KJV).



Speaking to the born again today who call those buildings the temple of God, He continues to rebuke us as He had Paul rebuke the early disciples (1 Cor 6:19 & 3:9).



Even born again Christians have been deceived which is exactly what God said about the next age, that during this one Satan deceived us (Rev. 20:3). Again, we've been deceived because even the born again haven't taken God as seriously as we should have—not even close.




By becoming born again, it's like God gives those who "earnestly seek Him" (Heb. 11:6, NIV) a blood transfusion, removing our sinful blood and replacing it with His holy blood, swapping out our sinful nature for His holy one. However, given this new blood, new nature, we still have to "work out...our own salvation with fear and trembling" (Phil. 2:12, KJV) as we're taught **THROUGHOUT** the New Testament. It takes effort.




Christ *chose* to go to the Cross (John 10:18). He did it out of love both for the Father and for humanity having a vision of the ultimate outcome, "a new humanity" (Eph. 2:15, NIV). Likewise, since we were "bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:20, KJV), we need to choose to be "crucified with Christ" (Gal. 2:20). But the born again will only do it if they have a vision of what God has actually done. And "where there is no vision, the people perish" (Prov. 29:18, KJV).




Perishing is exactly what's been happening historically in increasing measure, the born again dying outside of God's ultimate will for their lives not having fulfilled the "good works, which God ha[d] before ordained that we should walk in" (Eph. 2:10, KJV). Most born again Christians today don't even know what those good works are that God has been waiting for them to accomplish!




Like the Lord, we'll die to self out of love—for the Father, for Him, and for humanity.



Since we haven't died to self as a group historically, the Lord gave me this vision and calling, as shared through my material. It's been to help the body of Christ actually live like they're born again and fulfill the "good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in" (Eph. 2:10, KJV). Not having taken God seriously we've believed many and monstrous lies about what He has actually said and done.




Being "crucified with Christ" (Gal. 2:20, NIV) means earnestly seeking Him, believing Him, and most importantly, **OBEYING** Him, not in a general way but personally as He leads because it's all about having a *personal* relationship with Him. Whatever He puts His finger on, showing us how it doesn't line up with His "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV) and/or with His specific purpose for our lives, we have to make the choice to let go of that and follow Him. But historically, most born again Christians have chosen to hold on to those things rather than follow the Lord's leading.




Every time we ignore the Lord and participate in something that we know dishonors Him, we have become a hypocrite placing a beam in our eye which blinds us (Matt. 7:5). And since born again Christians have been ignoring Christ's teachings for centuries, today's typical born again Christian has loads of blinding beams in their eyes and calls evil good and good evil (Isa. 5:20).






While today's Christians focus on *believing* in Jesus, He says "You must be born again" (John 3:7, KJV) and "Follow me" (Matt. 4:19, KJV)—the closer the better. Yet even born again Christians, rather than focus on being pleasing and acceptable to God (Ps. 19:14), focus on keeping up with the "Christian" Joneses. It's like they're *Demas*.



What we've done as born again is what Jesus rebuked Peter about when He wasn't born again. We've loved people—ourselves and others—more than the Lord and God's will. Not only are the born again behaving like the lost, we're behaving like Satan! (Matt. 16:22-23).



Peter flipped the commandments around, and it's what the body of Christ has done historically in increasing measure—just like the lost. And just like Satan who said in his heart "I will be like the most High" (Isa. 14:14, KJV). It doesn't work. Not for our own good or the good of others.



My free books reveal how I've followed the Lord over the last 30 years, summed up in *Listen!* and detailed in my testimony books. It is as He says, "Whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:27, NIV). It's cost me everything and everyone. While you might be born again—as is the case for many professing Christians though not *most* of them—without becoming a **close** follower of Christ you'll end up "saved; yet so as by fire" (1 Cor. 3:15, KJV) to one degree or another. That's hardly ideal—especially considering the times we're coming up against, "great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be" (Matt. 24:21, KJV).
