



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
On this tract (and video) I cover what God has revealed to me, at least my understanding of how God became a Man.



As with everything else concerning the Lord—so that "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) isn't even hitting the target when we should be hitting the bullseye—Christians haven't given it much thought.



On top of that, they scoff when taught something different than what they believe or what Christians have believed for centuries.




And one of the problems with scoffing is that it places a *barrier* between you and God because scoffers "walk after their own lusts" (2 Pet. 3:3, KJV). Moreover, we've been living **in the last days** for 2000 years because Scripture, written way back then, says "in these last days" (Heb. 1:2, KJV). What we're now in is the very *last* of the last days. In other words, He's coming back soon...and we're not ready!




Clearly, "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) has **HISTORICALLY NOT** obeyed the Lord so that we have fulfilled the prophesied "falling away" and "rebellion" (2 Thess. 2:3, KJV & NIV). The body of Christ as a whole is far from God today, further than we've ever been and probably ever will be—speaking of the body of Christ, not the world. And He says "I am...the truth" (John 14:6, KJV). As a group the body of Christ is FAR from the Truth—as far as tens of thousands of unbiblical denominations and their false doctrines place us! So, pretty far.




Paying attention to what God says, He's informed us that we need to "be quick to listen" (James 1:19, NIV) "bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of the Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, YLT) if we want to get at the truth. It's not about any one person being 100% correct but about each person lining up their thoughts and life with Christ who is "the truth" (John 14:6, KJV). So I'm definitely not saying that I think I've got it all correct. I'm pretty sure I don't! Make that certain I don't. What I'm doing is sharing what I've understood from the Lord—so far—having been called to "write the vision, and make it plain" (Hab. 2:2, KJV).




Unlike most Christians who are super busy playing at Church, the Lord set me apart—quite drastically, as shared throughout my material—so that I've been able to hear His voice more clearly, most obvious through my playlist *Joy While Waiting* where I reveal God's hand hidden in plain sight through biblical interpretations of songs, books, and movies.



Rather than listen to and submit to "the hireling[s who Jesus warned us]...care...not for the sheep" (John 10:13, KJV), we need to listen to and submit to Him and His "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV).




There are plenty of Scriptures telling us that Christ existed *before* coming to earth. This graphic just reveals two of them.



While "born again" (John 3:7, KJV) Christians know the Word, since they haven't actually given Him that much thought, most can't biblically explain the most basic aspects of the Christian faith and scoff when you try to wake them up to the truth! While the born again do *know* Christ, they don't know Him *very well*. They know Him much more like an acquaintance than a really close friend which is what He calls the believers having said "I have called you friends" (John 15:15, KJV). Hardly knowing Him at all, as a group we've historically believed most of the same lies that the enemy has fed the lost.



Since the New Testament says that God was "without father, without mother, without genealogy, having neither beginning of days nor end of life" (Heb. 7:3, YLT) and Jesus prayed to the "Father" (John 17:5, NIV) we know that Hebrews 7:3 is speaking of God, the Father, as opposed to the Son. He's the One without a father or beginning of days. We also know it because Jesus, while on earth, had "end of life" at least for three days.



And three decades of earnestly seeking God and studying His Word as a born again Christian, has taught me that He didn't just "create...man in His own image" (Gen. 1:27, KJV) but everything to one degree or another. You see that, for example, with the many parallels He's revealed in the Bible and in the world, as with the Church being "a brazen prostitute" (Jer. 3:3, KJV). He is our "husband" (Isa. 54:5, KJV) so that I, called as a prophet (Matt. 23:34 & Eph. 4:11 below), am like Hosea who was called to love Gomer, the prostitute.

Matthew 23:34, KJV Behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall...persecute...from city to city.

Ephesians 4:11, YLT He gave some [as] apostles, and some [as] prophets, and some [as] proclaimers of good news, and some [as] shepherds and teacher.

What animals can reproduce without a mate?


Greenflies, stick insects, aphids, water fleas, scorpions, termites and honey bees are all capable of reproducing without males, using parthenogenesis.






So what God did with His Son parallels what He's done in the world. There are some creatures which can reproduce without a mate, as with aphids, honeybees, and rattlesnakes.




I discern it's what the Father did with the Son—like cell division. This is why Scripture says Christ is "the only-begotten God" (John 1:18, CLT) and "only begotten Son" (John 3:16, KJV). God begat One Son and that's the only time He'll ever do it. It's also the reason Jesus said, having been sent to earth, "Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father" (John 14:9, NIV).




The only difference is that when He was here, He was "in bodily form" (Col. 2:9, NIV).




And, again, many passages of Scripture inform us that Jesus was *sent* to earth. In other words, His life didn't begin in Mary's womb like it does for us in our mother's womb.




When God sent the angel, His "messenger" (Luke 1:28, YLT), to Mary so that she became pregnant, God was using her just like some couples use a surrogate mother.



Mary was just a "carrier." She was a 100% sinful human being (Rom. 3:10) which is why we shouldn't worship her as Catholics and many others do. God did with Mary—and with all born again—what we do with a pack or gum or bag of chips. We don't even give it a *second's* thought as to which one we're going to chew or eat since they're all the same. Mary, just like all born again, was "favore[d]" (Luke 1:30, KJV) by God in the same way that I favored the piece of gum I picked out of the pack. It had absolutely **NOTHING** to do with that piece!



It's what Jesus told the disciples when they got proud because their names could NOT have been written in heaven (Luke 10:20, KJV). Everyone who has been called during this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT) was called out of *grace* (Eph. 2:8-9, KJV)—including Mary.




Rather than be proud as Christians are, exceedingly proud—made super clear through my testimony and material for those who can't see that—we need to be humble because "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble" (James 4:6, NIV). In other words, He uses the humble, the ones who humble themselves before Him, which is actually very much like getting chewed up since others will treat us like they treat Him, "hated...without a cause" (John 15:25, KJV).



And since "all things were made by him, and for him" (Col. 1:16, KJV), in Star Trek: The Next Generation in the episode The Child, God reveals what He did since it's a perfect parallel. In that episode a supernatural being/God inserts himself into Troy/Mary doing it to see what life would be like from this other perspective. In reality, God did it to reveal to us that He knows what our lives are like since He went through it—and much worse than all of us. While some people have actually suffered more brutal deaths, they didn't do it by choice as He did since no one took His life from Him but He "lay it down of [His] own accord" (John 10:18, NIV). He willingly suffered a brutal and humiliating death to reveal His love for us.




As Scripture says "we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are" (Heb. 4:15, NIV). Except He walked through it "apart from sin" (Heb. 4:15, YLT).




Since "holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was, and is, and is to come" (Rev. 4:8, NIV), Jesus wasn't even *able* to sin. So while He had that advantage over us, He nevertheless SUFFERED and suffered brutally on the Cross to prove His love for us. Again, it's not as if the Jews or Romans crucified Him without His consent, as He said "Therefore doth my Father love me, because I lay down my life, that I might take it again. No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This commandment have I received of my Father" (John 10:17-18, KJV). It was a command from the Father out of love for all, including His Son, as I cover elsewhere in my material.




In short, God has allowed "the forces of evil" (Eph. 6:12, NIV)—along with every single one of us to do every evil thing we do—because He 's developing a kingdom of people (and supernatural beings) who understand what exactly He's done for us.



And what He's done—is in the process of doing from our perspective—is create a "new humanity" (Eph. 2:15), one that is actually loving all the time, like Him.



All will understand this by the end of the ages (not by the end of this age or even the next one). But, by the end of this age the born again—a core group at *least—will* finally understand how "desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV) we are since **we** have been so outrageously unfaithful to Him for the past two thousand years even though we had both the knowledge and power to be like Him instead—selfless and loving rather than self-centered and hateful, again, as my material reveals the body of Christ has been.




Since "the Holy Spirit...God has given to those who obey him" (Acts 5:32, NIV)—obeyed Him initially at least—and we "receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on [us]" (Acts 1:8, NIV), the born again have—and have historically had—the power to also live apart from sin. But we've historically been like a BRAT living in defiance of our Father, therefore, lacking the power of the Holy Spirit to one degree or another. Mostly, to a very high degree.




As for traveling around without a teletransporter, we're told the following:


They came unto a certain water: and the eunuch said, See, here is water; what doth hinder me to be baptized? And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him. And when they were come up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught away Philip, that the eunuch saw him no more: and he went on his way rejoicing. But Philip was found at Azotus (Acts 8:36-40, KJV).




Likewise, since the early disciples were faithful as individuals and as a core group, unlike today, they could even raise the dead. "Turning toward the dead woman, [Peter] said, "Tabitha, get up." She opened her eyes, and seeing Peter she sat up" (Acts 9:40, NIV).



In contrast, most of the "miracles" done by "Christians" today are "lying wonders" (2 Thess. 2:9). Not all of them since some professing Christians are actually born again, and even though we're apostate as a group God "sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matt. 5:45, KJV). In a way it's like God's blessings have worked as a curse for the born again since they've helped us deceive ourselves that we're right with God when that's the furthest thing from the truth. But it's not God's fault. It's ours for not having taken Him seriously.



Scripture says that "the Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being" (Heb. 1:3, NIV) which is why Jesus said what He said (John 10:30). Father and Son are one in mind and Spirit. And He prayed for us, the believers, His "body" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV), to be united so that the rest of the lost elect (Acts 13:48) would have no problem seeing that the Father did actually send Him. Jesus prayed "That they also in us may be one, that the world may believe that Thou didst send me" (John 17:21, YLT). This is a prayer the Father will answer when a decent number of born again actually *obey* the Lord's teachings (John 13:34-35), which we're not yet doing as clearly revealed by the New Testament, by the state of the Church, and by my life testimony which He has me sharing in free books.



As a group, we're the *furthest* thing from walking in obedience to the Lord! Born again Christians need to at least acknowledge when someone is speaking for Him, not chase them away! Yet the body of Christ has been chasing me away for over two decades. More importantly, we've been chasing Him away for most of the past 2000 years! And we've been doing it while bragging about how much we love Him and want to experience His presence! We're the worst hypocrites who've ever lived!
