


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
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Having been given this calling (Hab. 2:2-3), the Lord had me develop two tests for professing Christians.




Everyone, including those who aren't born again, pass this first test with flying colors. All you have to be able to do is tell the difference between what God made and man made. And since even preschoolers can tell the differences, humanity is "without excused" (Rom. 1:20). However, while we all pass the test of KNOWING there is a God, we all fail at honoring Him as such. Therefore, "while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8 KJV).




For over two decades professing Christians have gotten mad at me for telling them they need to repent—and I was obeying the Lord. We need to repent as a group, speaking of "the body of Christ," a group made up of individual "members" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV). By having raised me up with this ministry, God was expressing His love. And by rejecting me, the body of Christ has rejected Him, just as He told Samuel when He said "They have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them" (1 Sam. 8:7, KJV). Even born again Christians haven't wanted the Lord to reign over them! Yet they profess to *love* Him.




If you're not letting Christ reign over you, you're letting Satan do it since he is the "ruler" (John 12:31, YLT) and "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV).



The second test the Lord had me put together, quite a few years ago, makes it clear that most who think they're born again, probably aren't. While this test has only ten questions which aren't hard to understand, most *born again* Christians have historically barely made a passing grade on it! My free material nails the point.




Those who take the test while finally taking Christ seriously through this tract and video playlist, along with the rest of my material which fleshes it out, will realize that they haven't been as faithful as they thought they'd been. Not hardly. Being honest while going through my material, they'll get increasingly convicted so that they'll finally appreciate what God has been saying for centuries (Rev. 3:1) and which He's had me walk through for more than two decades as He's had me speak up on His behalf to professing Christians.




This test is like an open book test, with help since I'm walking you through it. While you'll be tempted to lie to yourself since we're dealing with "the invisible God" (Col. 1:15, KJV)—what the born again have been doing for most of Christian history—since our standing with God is between us and God, lying to ourselves about what we've done or are currently doing, or lying to others, doesn't work well for us. That's especially true if we've gotten away with it for years. What we really did was waste **our** time—our God-given opportunities to store treasure in heaven which we'll want for the Lord's kingdom reign (Matt. 6:19-20)—and we can't get that time and opportunities back. However, we can move forward making the most out of the time we have left. That's a big part of the purpose of the ministry the Lord has entrusted to me, to help the more earnest lovers of God—those who'll take Him earnestly now—make the most of the time they have left.




At God's "appointed time" when He finally opens up "the vision" (Hab. 2:3, KJV), there will be "weeping and gnashing of teeth" by many born again and professing Christians for having been such outstanding hypocrites. They'll finally experience "godly sorrow" which "brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret" (2 Cor. 7:10, NIV). Many who only *thought* they were born again will finally *become* born again as Christ says we "must be" in order to "see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3 & 3:7, KJV). And nominal born again Christians who give Him little more than lip-service, will finally also get right with God and allow Him to use them for His purposes, to serve as "fishers of men" (Matt. 4:19, ,KJV).




Getting convicted, many professing Christians will finally experience and *appreciate* the full meaning of this "great salvation" (Heb. 2:3, KJV).




So here's the first question on the test. If only a fraction of "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) had genuinely loved God—loved Him *more* than all else—we would not have fulfilled the "falling away" and "rebellion" God prophesied would take place before the Lord's return (2 Thess. 2:3). It's not something that's coming or which recently began. It's been a snowball effect taking place over the course of the past two thousand years so that today this snowball/our apostasy is HUGE. We've hit the bottom of the barrel. Christianity today is in the worst shape it's ever been. In other words, today's body of Christ is made up of the worst hypocrites the world has ever had—and that in those who are supposed to be the most noble and honorable people on earth!



Since most Christians still attend those pagan institutions we've historically called church, even though God had Frank Viola and George Barna publish Pagan Christianity over two decades ago, the majority of "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) is walking in the flesh rather than in the Spirit. Unless there's hardly anyone in those "churches" who are actually born again—and the remnant is **SUPER** small. Either way, there's no way Pagan Christianity went unnoticed by those "church" leaders since George Barna is pretty well known in the Christian community. Part of the problem is that "the hireling [paid 'spiritual' professionals]...careth not for the sheep" (John 10:13, KJV) which means they don't really care for the Good Shepherd either. They're just like the Israelite leaders of whom God said "Woe be to the shepherds of Israel that do feed themselves!" (Ezek. 34:2, KJV). But they're not the only ones at fault. Every born again and professing Christian has a Bible, which they should have been reading and obeying in relation to "the new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV). Christian leaders are just more guilty.




The moment the Lord points out something we're doing that doesn't line up with the "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV) we need to *stop* doing it. Otherwise we've not only hardened our heart to God (Heb. **3:15**), we've become a hypocrite and placed a "beam" in our eye which blinds us spiritually. And since "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) has HISTORICALLY hardened their heart to God, as soon as we became born again we **immediately** started placing beams in our eyes as we chose to go with the flow of pagan Christianity rather than "take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, NIV). It was inevitable since newly born again souls hardly know the Scriptures much less understand them. Therefore, when we became born again it was impossible for *us* to take every thought captive to Christ. It's what the more mature Christians should have been doing—and haven't historically.




What the body of Christ has historically done—which is what the Hebrew Israelites have historically done—God modeled for me with my marriage, just like He modeled what the Jews were doing with Hosea's marriage to Gomer (Read Hosea). Except with us it's flipped, I'm Hosea the prophet representing the Lord as His "ambassador" (2 Cor. 5:20, KJV) and my husband is playing the role of Gomer, the prostitute, representing "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) who has "left [her] first love" (Rev. 2:4, KJV) and has "a whore's forehead" (Jer. 3:3, KJV).



When I became born again I'd been living with a professing Protestant Christian who wanted to get married and who was sinning against the Lord by having unmarried sex with me, just like the body of Christ is sinning against Him in many ways. I became born again during that time and God immediately made it clear to me that this was the man I was supposed to marry as opposed to the others I'd dated some of whom had also had marriage in mind. And since this man claimed to have become a Christian when he was 15 and he was now in his mid twenties, when we were living together unmarried, and fairly bright with a degree in aerospace engineering, he shouldn't have been sinning against the Lord with me. But since he was, instead of helping me honor Christ, he helped me dishonor Him by placing a stumbling block before me which God tells us not to do (Rom 14:13). This is exactly what the body of Christ has been doing for centuries, placing stumbling blocks before the lost, before those who are seeking Him, and before babies in Christ—helping them dishonor rather than honor Christ.



All things considered, I discern there are many born again souls in those "churches" who've hardened their hearts to God and who are blinded by **many** spiritual beams in their eyes (Matt. 7:5). That's my 22 year testimony—excruciatingly hardened hearts among professing Christians so that I haven't been able to get through to even one in over two decades! And the Lord is clearly saying that if we don't come out of that pagan system *and* worship Him as required (John 4:24) we'll suffer some brutal consequences (2 Cor. 6:17 & Rev. 18:4).



Attending those "church" services is much easier than walking in the Spirit, especially in our day when we've fulfilled the prophesied "rebellion" (2 Thess. 2:3, NIV). Professing Christians have lied to themselves, especially in America, that going to church is going against the grain since most people don't go. But those "churches" are Satan's decoy. They don't actually represent the Church Jesus is building. For one thing "the most High dwelleth not in temples made with hands" (Acts 7:48, KJV). By attending them—even if you're born again—you are still headed down the "broad...road that leads to destruction" (Matt. 7:13, NIV). Rather than "walk in the Spirit, and...not fulfil the lust of the flesh" (Gal. 5:16, KJV) "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) as a group is fulfilling "the lust of the flesh." Sure, God still shows up in those pagan institutions because it's what He does. "He maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matt. 5:45, KJV). It's called grace, which works against us if we're not genuine.




Considering that every single prayer meeting I ever attended had only a handful of people or less even though they came from a so-called church or group of hundreds of people, and that even the most mature Christians can't discern God's obvious intervention, and that Christian prayers are seldom focused on building God's kingdom but on improving our lives here in this world which is ruled by Satan "the god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV), it's probably safe to say that you are *not* a prayer **warrior**. This is likely the one question on the test the majority of professing Christians would be honest about. We are not a people of prayer, much less biblical prayer, when that's how we get to know the Lord best of all, praying His Word in relation to the "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV) and His kingdom purposes (John 18:36). While God cares about every single aspect of our lives (Matt. 6:8), He cares most about building Christ's kingdom since that protects the people He created from Satan's influence (James 4:7).




If you were genuinely committed to the Lord—which means being a prayer warrior since He's our Role Model and He spent "all night in prayer" (Luke 6:12, KJV)—you would not be in the pagan institutional church system AND you would be able to discern God's hand in the world around you as He's revealed through an aspect of my ministry, what I've called biblical interpretations. Like Joseph of the Old Testament who interpreted dreams, the Lord has given me the discernment to interpret secular resources from beginning to end in relation to what He's saying to and about "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV). I haven't come across anyone doing this when **every** mature born again Christian should be doing it! (Col. 1:16). He is using everything and everyone for His purposes, to "build [His] church" (Matt. 16:18, KJV)—having tied it to our personal lives! The more faithful you are the more you *see* His hand on everything.


*Matthew 15:16, NIV Are you still so dull?



If you're part of the pagan so-called church system and/or not a prayer warrior, you have definitely NOT been fighting the good fight of faith! Again, Jesus is our Role Model and He "continued all night in prayer to God" (Luke 6:12, KJV) and called us to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5:17, KJV). The Sword of the Spirit, God's Word (Eph. 6:17) is our only official weapon and we won't even know how to use it unless we've got a strong relationship—through biblical prayer—with God! Because, He is our Commander in Chief.




The Lord modeled for us what we were supposed to be doing. It's like fencing since we use "the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God" (Eph. 6:17, KJV) and Satan *also* uses it, however twisted (Luke 4:9-10). If you don't know God's Word well IN RELATION TO THE "NEW COVENANT" (Luke 22:20, NIV) you're no competition! You are DEAD in the water!




The way we win each 'match' is by *engaging* our brain (2 Cor. 10:5, KJV), like tightening our abs when we work out. And there are countless matches to win since Satan comes at us again and again and again and again—relentlessly—always waiting for "an opportune time" (Luke 4:13, NIV) "prowl[ing] around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour" (1 Pet. 5:8, NIV). The only way to even begin to take our thoughts captive to Christ is by knowing Him well, Him who "is called The Word of God" (Rev. 19:13, KJV).




Rather than "fight[ing] the good fight of the faith" (1 Tim. 6:12, NIV) as *good soldiers of Christ* (2 Tim. 2:3), the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) today is like Cage (Tom Cruise) in *Edge of Tomorrow (2014)* at the beginning of the movie—a soldier who wasn't *really* a soldier and who tried hard to get *out* of serving! Granted a special opportunity, he BECAME a powerful soldier willing to repeatedly die. Likewise, "we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, **so that** his life may also be revealed in our mortal body" (2 Cor. 4:11, NIV, my emphasis). In the movie they won the most difficult war of the history of the world because they worked *together*, which is what the body of Christ has been called to do (Eph. 4:13) against the brutal "forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph. 6:12, NIV). And we *are* coming up on the most difficult war in our history, "great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be" (Matt. 24:21, KJV).




Is the work you do, work to which the Lord clearly called you or just work *you* decided you wanted to do? If you think God called you to do it, do you recall the Scripture He gave you leading you to do that work, and does it line up with the new covenant? Is your spouse, if you have one, clearly one to whom the Lord led you? Do you spend your free time **primarily** doing things that honor Christ *and* which He has called you to do? Considering the times we're living in, having fulfilled "the rebellion" (2 Thess. 2:3, NIV), being concerned over the things that concern Christ your life should be like mine, *extremely* isolated and ridiculed by both the lost and professing Christians because we live in a time when even the born again do "not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts...heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears" (2 Tim. 4:3, KJV). Again, that's my 22-year testimony, and it's the history of Christianity, of "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV).




Most Christians today can't even define what it means to be "born again" (John 3:7, KJV) since they focus on the need to "believe" in Jesus and having "accepted" Him when He says "You have not chosen me, but I have chosen you" (John 15:16, KJV). And it's not about believing since even the "devils...believe, and [they] tremble" (James 2:19, KJV). It's about *following* Him. The better you know Him, the closer you can follow. And the closer the better!




Not having paid attention, much less do most of today's Christians understand the difference between the old covenants and the one we are now under, the "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV).



Most Christians still focus on the "Law of Moses" (Luke 24:44, NIV) when that was a "ministration of death" (2 Cor. 3:7, KJV). And that's because it came from Lord Satan "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV). "Him that had the power of death, that is, the devil" (Heb. 2:14, KJV). Moses and the Israelites "received the law by the disposition of angels" (Acts 7:53, KJV). And it had to be *fallen* angels because Christ "delivered [us] from the law" (Rom. 7:6, KJV) and He wasn't working against the Father or Himself. He delivered us from Satan's deception.



We are now under the "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV). The Law of Moses—613 laws summed up in the Ten Commandments—is what Lord Satan "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV) required of humanity which is why Jesus said "All things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me" (Luke 24:44, KJV). He did for us what we could never do for ourselves. Unlike the born again, **NONE** of the characters of the Old Testament had God's Spirit inside of them to help them discern the difference between Lord Satan's voice and the voice of the Lord our God. As WE have been informed, "the person without the Spirit...cannot understand [cannot discern correctly] because [the things of God] are discerned only through the Spirit" (1 Cor. 2:14). This is a pretty crucial point!




Another crucial point is that in order to have *genuine* love for others we have to love God (which is the first commandment). Since "God is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV), He's where we **get** genuine love from—and it works like a domino effect. Because of the work Jesus did on the Cross, all we need to do is *genuinely* love God. Do this ONE THING and it all falls into place from there like a domino effect. That's why the Bible refers to it as "the simplicity that is in Christ" (2 Cor. 11:3, KJV).

We DO NOT have to obey the 613 laws Satan has for us, which are pretty evil. For example, ignoring the fact that he's "the god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV) and the he's "a liar and father of it" besides being "a murderer" (John 8:44, KJV) the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) as a whole has believed that it was the Lord our God—who "is love" (1 John 4:8, KJV)—that would take delight in destroying us for disobeying Him. But it's Lord Satan who takes delight in destroying people for disobeying him! This is the problem of not taking God seriously, we get *deceived*.




If we genuinely love God we will also love people and not lie, or hurt others in any way. Simple. No, we won't do it perfectly 100% of the time, not even a fraction of the time, but we'll do a whole lot better than what the "body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) is currently doing! And "if we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9, NIV).



Since God has an amazing plan He's working out through the ages, not just this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT)—and which most born again Christians are oblivious about—He gave Satan the "authority" (Luke 4:6, KJV) to be "the ruler" (John 12:31, YLT) and "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV). God was testing us (Deut. 13:3) and we—especially "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV)—have thoroughly proven that we've failed the test. The human heart *is* exactly as He says, "Desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV) so that "there is none righteous, no, not one" (Rom. 3:10, KJV). And I'm NOT saying I'm more righteous than anyone else since I've also walked in many of the same sins, lies, and deceptions as the rest of the body. Again, there is NONE righteous, no, not one.




My life testimony, which includes over two decades of speaking up for Christ to professing Christians as led by the Lord, reveals that even the brightest people who are very likely actually born again, rather than produce fruit in keeping with repentance (Matt. 3:8) have spent their adult lives living for themselves and Satan's kingdom, this world. Again, it's what "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, KJV) has historically done in increasing measure. Therefore, God is saying that the body of Christ looks like this self-indulgent cold-hearted *prostitute*. And that's especially true for the church of the United States since we've been granted the most.




While God has promised a "latter rain" (Joel 2:23, KJV), the first one being Pentecost, the latter rain being a greater outpouring than that one since the former rain was given to us "moderately"—it's been withheld because the body of Christ is **super** unbiblical. We parallel Solomon and his hundreds of wives, except we're multiple times worse since we're supposed to be united as "one" (John 17:21, KJV) and we're divided by tens of THOUSANDS of denominations to go will all the lies and false doctrines that came into "the body of Christ" (1 Cor 12:27, KJV) through them. We're a mess! And, so far, have refused to "blush with shame" (Jer. 3:3, NIV) much less repent. But, because "if we are faithless [as we have historically been], he remains faithful, for he cannot disown himself" (2 Tim. 2:13, NIV). So in spite of our great rebellion" (2 Thess. 2:3, NIV), we're still getting the latter rain. Thank God!



While we should look like our Role Model, super strong and lean spiritually, the majority of the body of Christ has instead indulged in the pleasures of this world, Satan's world (James 5:5). It's "a day of slaughter" because Satan is the "god of this world" (2 Cor. 4:4, KJV) and he's a "murderer" (John 8:44, KJV). Rather than produce fruit in keeping with repentance the born again get *hostile* when held accountable—just like the Jews did when Christ held them accountable (read the gospel). And anyone who think fat is beautiful is seriously delusional.




Unlike all other nations the United States has been granted a combination of great wealth, great power, great freedom to worship, and the greatest taste of God's kingdom in that we are the most international mix of people in one nation—the melting pot. And "unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required" (Luke 12:48, KJV). Putting it in context, He says "The servant who knows the master's will [that would be professing Christians] and does not get ready or does not do what the master wants will be beaten with many blows. But the one who does not know [that would be the lost] and does things deserving punishment will be beaten with few blows" (Luke 12:47-48, KJV).




Again, God used my personal life to help me understand since I grew up (from 1st to 5th grade) in United Nations housing in New York since that's where my father worked before he died. This was a community of 635 families from around the world in 35 acres—and over which I was free to roam til dinner time. Like Joseph of the Old Testament who was trained by his father for the work he would do in the future as a slave and then as a leader in Egypt, my Father has been training me since I was a child, even decades before I was born again (which was in my 20s).



This ministry combined with the obvious "signs of the times" (Matt. 16:3, NIV), will finally move a decent number of professing Christians to get right with God so that we finally stop lying to ourselves and to others about Him and about what He's actually done, so that His Church finally matures (Eph. 5:25-27).




It's NOT as if the Lord is going to rapture an unfaithful people outta here while leaving behind those we were supposed to have helped, without having helped them! He's going to do what He set out to do, make His Church glorious and without blemish (Eph. 5:25-27). As He says "I will build my assembly, and gates of Hades shall not prevail against it" (Matt. 16:18, YLT). The reason God has allowed us to get this far from Him is because He wants us to thoroughly understand what He's done for us, something He's doing not just through this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT) but through the rest of "the ages" (Gal. 1:5, YLT) as well.




Since the "the forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph. 6:12, NIV) along with Satan's human "ministers" (2 Cor. 11:15, KJV) perform "signs and lying wonders" (2 Thess. 2:9, KJV), there are many people today who think they're Christian and aren't (Matt. 7:22-23). Therefore, the best thing to do is not *assume* we're born again but earnestly consider the very real possibility that we might **not** be born again. At best, nearly everyone who *is* born again is outrageously rebellious.



The "pagan roots of our church practices" (as pointed out by Frank Viola and George Barna) are **SATANIC** roots. We get delivered from Satan's deceptions when we *earnestly* seek the Lord (Heb. 11:6).



It's only by being honest with yourself that you'll be able to make the most of the rest of your time on earth and "obtain a better resurrection" (Heb. 11:35, KJV) for "the life that is truly life" (1 Tim. 6:19, NIV) which will last much longer than the few decades we typically get in this life.



I discern the time that we get to enjoy our rewards from this life will last at least 1000 years if not longer, as I explain in my free book *God's Plan: A Vision for the Body*. I'm thinking we'll be able to enjoy our rewards through the next two ages. Then when it's all been said and done, I'm thinking everyone will be at the same level. We'll all be one very big and very happy Family—"a new humanity" (Eph. 2:15, NIV).

Romans 5:19, NIV Just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous.

Colossians 1:19-20, NIV God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

1 Corinthians **15:22-25**, NIV As in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. But each in turn: Christ, the firstfruits; then, when he comes, those who belong to him. Then the end will come, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has destroyed all dominion, authority and power.

1 Corinthians 15:27-28, NIV For he "has put everything under his feet." Now when it says that "everything" has been put under him, it is clear that this does not include God himself, who put everything under Christ. When he has done this [destroyed all other authority and power by humbling the mess out of **everyone**], then the Son himself will be made subject to him who put everything under him, so that God may be all in all.

If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire. 1 Corinthians 3:15, KJV



Unless rebellious born again get right with God, they'll end up getting "saved; yet so as by fire" (1 Cor. 3:15, KJV) suffering Satan's brutalities he's got planned for this world, "great wrath, because he knoweth that he hath but a short time" (Rev. 12:12, KJV). Besides that, they'll have nothing to show for their lives, "reward[s]" (2 John 1:8, KJV) which they could have enjoyed for the millennial reign of Christ, at least. Getting saved "as by fire" means that all or most of your potential rewards went up in flames. And considering the history of the Church, it's clear that this is the best *most* born again have historically done.
