
The Bible's Message

This is what I discern is the actual message of the Bible—and it really *is* Good News for all of humanity. Obviously Christians haven't had it right since much of what "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, ESV) has been saying and doing doesn't line up with the teachings of Christ. I'm summing up my understanding of it on this video and cover it throughout my channel on videos which are typically also presented as PDF files. I back up every point with Scripture in relation to the "new covenant" (Luke 22:20, NIV) Jesus made for humanity on the Cross since "truth came through Jesus" (John 1:17, ESV) so that we've been told to "take every thought captive to obey Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, ESV). As of June 2024, this is my understanding of what God has done as relayed to us in the Bible.

God's Plan. According to the Bible God is in the process of creating a society that will be made up of people like Christ, a person who loved God and people—even those who brutally tortured Him to death since He prayed for them as He was dying that the Father would "forgive them" (Luke 23:34, ESV). He's creating a society where people are NOT self-centered, as we are. I summed it up with the first graphic using a picture I found online tweaking it to make it more biblical.

Since Scripture says that God "works all things according to the counsel of his will" (Eph. 1:11, ESV), and there is nothing out of His control being that it's as He says, "The world and its fullness are mine" (Ps. 50:12, ESV), I discern He split like a cell so as to end up with two identical daughter cells, two identical versions of Himself, which He refers to as Father and Son. I summed this up with the second graphic.

The last graphic sums up what He did through Christ, His Son. He placed His Spirit into Mary just like doctor's do today through in vitro fertilization. Mary was Jesus' *surrogate* mother who raised Him.



The Bible also tells us that the Father gave Jesus "all authority on heaven and on earth" (Matt. 28:18, ESV) so that "all things were created through him and for him" (Col. 1:16, ESV). And as already noted and summed up with the first graphic, He's in the process of creating a "new humanity" (Eph. 2:15, NIV).

Why a New Humanity is Needed. As history and the daily news reveal, the human "heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV). In turn, God says "I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you" (Ezek. 36:26, ESV). This promise wasn't just for the Israelites/the Jews since the Bible is a book for all of humanity so that "salvation is from the Jews" (John 4:22, ESV). It's from the Jews because God placed His Spirit into a Jewish community.

Why Not Just Create Us "Right" in the First Place? I discern the Lord went about it this way in order to end up with a kingdom of people who would genuinely appreciate Him and one another—a society of people like Christ. It's because our hearts are so deceitful and wicked that He went about it this way. The only other option would have been to create a kingdom of robots, people programmed by Him to love Him and one another. But that would hardly have been as satisfying for Him—or for us! He was willing to put Himself and us through all the pain and suffering because of the vision He's had in mind. "For the joy that was set before him [He] endured the cross" (Heb. 12:2, ESV) and has told us to follow His lead comparing it to a woman giving birth. "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are but the beginning of the birth pains" (Matt. 24:7-8, ESV). "You will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy. When a woman is giving birth, she has sorrow because her hour has come, but when she has delivered the baby, she no longer remembers the anguish, for joy that a human being has been born into the world. So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice" (John 16:20-22, ESV). While this second passage is speaking specifically of His death and how the disciples would feel, connecting all the dots we can see that it applies to all of humanity and the whole Plan of God as I'm explaining.

This Life is a Test. God informed us through the Israelites that this life is a test (Deut. 13:3 below), and since what He said lines up with the greatest commandment (Mark 12:30 below) we can see that this test was for all of us. The test is for *us*, so that *we* can see that our hearts really are as He says "deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV). Instead, we all think we're "good people." I watched a documentary decades ago where they asked inmates in jail for life having committed brutal crimes against people and during their interview at some point each one of them said something like "I'm really a good person at heart." We all think that about ourselves and Jesus has informed us in the Bible that it's just not true. And we've proven it throughout history as with Nazi Germany. Under the right circumstances we'd all do whatever it takes—be brutal to others—in order to save our own skin. They even proved it with the 1971 Stanford Prison experiment, merely given power over others makes us behave like dictators in no time. God Placed Satan as Our Ruler. To prove to us how deceitful and wicked we are, Jesus made Satan "the ruler of this world" (John 12:31, YLT) to whom He gave "all authority" (Luke 4:6, ESV). It's why He says that His "kingdom is not of this world" (John 18:36, ESV) and tells us to "come out" of it (2 Cor. 6:17, NIV). And He informed us in the the Old Testament that Satan set out to "be like the most High" (Isa. 14:14, KJV). He's also told us how Satan has been doing this, being like the most High. "Satan disguises himself as an angel of light" (2 Cor. 11:14, NIV).

How to Discern God's Voice. Jesus savs

"You must be born again" (John 3:7, ESV)—which I summed up with the graphic—because that's the ONLY way to be able to tell the difference between the voice of God—Father or Son—and the voice of Satan or any of the other angels who rebelled against God with him, as we're told in the following passage: "The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit" (1 Cor. 2:14, NIV). Having God's Spirit within and "tak[ing] every thought captive to obey Christ" (2 Cor. 10:4, ESV) we can discern whether what's being said or done is coming from God or from Satan, both of whom use people.



And we were informed that Satan has been lying to us "from the beginning" since that's all he can do. "When he lies, he speaks out of his own character, for he is a liar and the father of lies" (John 8:44, ESV). Jesus also modeled for us what we needed to do (Matt. 5 in the graphic) since he's been lying to us throughout history, so that the New Testament says "be diligent to present thyself approved to God -- a workman irreproachable, rightly dividing the word of the truth" (2 Tim. 2:15, YLT). But it's not what Christians have done so that we've given God the reputation of being The Fire and Brimstone God in the Old Testament and somewhat different in the New Testament, but then again when He comes back He's going to—supposedly—revert back to being that horrific being to those who rejected Him. Not having taken Jesus seriously enough, even the born again have not discerned the difference between God's voice and Satan's voice in the Bible. Historically, we haven't "rightly divid[ed] the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15, YLT). The reason we have to do this is because, technically, all three—Father, Son, and Satan—can be called Lord God so that the Lord of the Bible isn't always God Almighty, as with Jeremiah 13:14 (in the graphic). "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Heb. 13:8, ESV) so if something being done or said by the Lord doesn't line up with Jesus' life and testimony, it wasn't Him. Again, God has been testing us. And we have seriously failed His test, as He knew we would.





Being a Believer is

NOT Enough. While today's Christians focus on being believers, that's not enough because "devils also believe" (James 2:19, KJV). Jesus didn't just call us to become born again believers. He says "Follow me" (Matt. 4:19, ESV) which we do by obeying Him and walking in the spirit. In fact, it's only when we "walk by the Spirit, [that we] will not gratify the desires of the flesh" (Gal. 5:16, ESV). But, historically, most born again have not followed Him either at all or not very closely, landing the Church and



the world in the mess we're in today. Like the angels who rebelled against Him (Rev. 12:7-9 below), born again Christians have also rebelled against Him as He said we would before His return to earth (1 Thess. 2:2-3 in the graphic).

Revelation 12:7-9, ESV War arose in heaven, Michael and his angels fighting against the dragon. And the dragon and his angels fought back, but he was defeated, and there was no longer any place for them in heaven. And the great dragon was thrown down, that ancient serpent, who is called the devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world—he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.

I know the body of Christ's downfall began early on because of how Peter handled the situation with Ananias and Sapphira, summed up in the graphic. Rather than honor Jesus and bind up demonic spirits, he dishonored Jesus and let those demonic spirits loose (Matt. 16:18-19 below) when he—above all others—should have been able to forgive them considering that he had betrayed the Lord during His darkest hour (Luke 22:60-61 below) and the Lord had immediately forgiven him and entrusted him with a very important ministry (John 21:17 below). But this is the main point I discern God is making to humanity, that "the heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV). Even born again Christians have historically proven how true this is of us. Matthew 16:18-19, YLT I also say to thee [Peter], that thou art a rock, and upon this rock I will build my assembly, and gates of Hades shall not prevail against it; and I will give to thee the keys of the reign of the heavens, and whatever thou mayest bind upon the earth shall be having been bound in the heavens, and whatever thou mayest loose upon the earth shall be having been loosed in the heavens.'

Luke 22:60-61, NIV Peter replied, "Man, I don't know what you're talking about!" Just as he was speaking, the rooster crowed. The Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word the Lord had spoken to him: "Before the rooster crows today, you will disown me three times."

John 21:17, NIV The third time [Jesus] said to [Peter], "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep.


Why Angels Rebelled. I discern a third of the angels rebelled (Rev. 12:4 & 1:20 below) because before creating the universe, God—Father and Son—informed them of The Plan, the vision they had in mind, which involves humans being *greater* than angels. "Do you not know that we are to judge angels?" (1 Cor. 6:3, ESV).

Revelation 12:4, ESV His tail swept down a third of the stars of heaven and cast them to the earth.

Revelation 1:20, ESV Stars are the angels.

Why Jesus Made Satan Our Ruler. Jesus is proving His point that our hearts are deceitful and wicked since we'd rather have Satan, a "liar" and "murderer" (John 8:44, ESV) rule over us than submit to Him. And born again Christians, "the body of Christ" (1 Cor. 12:27, ESV) as a whole, have proven this truth better than anyone—so far—because He told us to "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you" (James 4:7, ESV). Instead, we've also rebelled. And the Lord has used me to reveal that today's born again Christians are no different than the lost since this graphic sums up my walk of the last 26 years. I haven't been able to get through to even *one* born again

Christian! While admonished throughout the New Testament to "love one another" (John 13:35, ESV) that's hardly what we're doing! And the main people the Lord used in my life for this testimony were those who are educated and well respected in this world: doctors, entrepreneurs, engineers, for example. While clearly born again, they've been ice cold. He also tied my testimony to RZIM which was considered to be one of the best worldwide serving the Lord, until Ravi was exposed in 2021 as a wolf in sheep's clothing. And, having been so deceived, these born again Christians still refuse to even acknowledge that I've contacted them and that the Lord is trying to speak to them! Today's born again have extremely hardened hearts. The body of Christ is in the worst shape we've ever been in for not taking Jesus seriously enough and letting Satan continue to rule over us.





God and Satan Use

People. Since Satan is "the ruler of this world" (John 12:31, YLT) and our hearts are "deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV), we are all being used by Satan. It's only when we become a born again follower of Christ—the closer the better—that we get used more by God than by Satan. We are like pawns in this war between Jesus, "the Christ of God" (Luke 9:20, ESV) and Satan, the leading "antichrist" (1 John 2:18, ESV). He warned us that "our struggle is not against flesh and



blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph. 6:12, NIV). So while we've all mostly been serving Satan historically, since Jesus is in full control, "work[ing] out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will" (Eph. 1:11, ESV), the war has already been won. It was won even before Satan rebelled since Jesus "declar[ed] the end from the beginning and from ancient times things not yet done, saying, 'My counsel shall stand, and I will accomplish all my purpose" (Isa. 46:10, ESV). But we still have to do our part if we're going to be among those who "gain an even better resurrection" (Heb. 11:35, NIV).

Hell. According to Scripture, the doctrine of hell is false doctrine and one of the *many* lies born again Christians have believed for not being close followers of Christ historically. Because of the deceitful and wicked condition of the human heart (Jer. 17:9), the Bible translators have historically added and taken away from the truth which is why the Lord has had me use the Concordant and Young's literal translations as my baseline. If it lines up with those translations I then use a more common version, whichever is clearer or comes to mind—just as long as it doesn't contradict the literal. I don't typically use a literal translation since they don't often flow smoothly.




Is there anyone who is not a part of all mankind (CLT) or of all men (YLT & KJV)? No. There is only one race. It's called human, as in mankind, also known as "all men." Therefore, according to Scripture Jesus is the Savior of all. But "especially of believers" (1 Tim. 4:10, CLT, my emphasis).



is there anyone who's not dying? No. It's an: ratio. You live: You Die. Is there amone who is not included in all? No. All, which is put in the Greek, is defined as "each, every, any, the whole, everyone, all things, everything." Therefore, according to Scripture everyone will be made alive through the work Jesus did on the Cross.

Again, is there anyone not included in all or the whole? No. According to Scripture everyone will come to believe, some during this age, others during the millennial reign of Christ, and others during the "second death" (Rev. 2016, K.V.).





The Ages. I discern there are three ages, as I summed up with the graphic. When these are over everyone will be like Christ. He lowered Himself to become like us in order to elevate all of us to become like Him in His resurrected form, both mentally and physically so that all of humanity, the "new humanity" (2 Tim. 2:15, NIV), will be pure and holy having supernatural abilities. We will all love and honor the Father and one another, as Jesus modeled with His life on earth. So there's the "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT), the next age, which I called the Age of Christ (Rev. 20) but the Bible refers to as "the day of the Lord" (Acts 2:20, ESV), and the last age which is referred to as "the second death" (Rev. 2:11, ESV) and I've called the Age of Judgment since that's what it's about.

I discern that through this age and the next the Lord is revealing to us our desperate need for Him so that everyone He created will, at some point during one of the ages, bow the knee and admit two things:

- 1. That our heart is "deceitful above all things and desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9); and,
- 2. That He is God and wholeheartedly thank Him for what He did for us.

In fact, our generation of born again Christians will have done this twice. They first did it so that they became born again, and they'll do it again when God finally opens up this ministry that He's entrusted to me to "write the vision" (Hab. 2:2, KJV). But it won't be until His "appointed time" (Hab. 2:3, KJV) because we're under "judgment" (1 Pet. 4:17, ESV). He hasn't enabled anyone to see what He has me saying because we've been so unfaithful. It's a judgment against us. In any case, since the Lord has promised a "latter rain" awakening, a "downpour" (Joel 2:23 ESV & CLT), the body of Christ will finally repent and fulfill our commission to "make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28:19, ESV) actually walking in the truth and teaching the truth as revealed in Scripture and not as revealed by men—as we've historically done. We will finally worship Him as required. Jesus says "God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth" (John 4:24, ESV). We'll worship Him as born again Christians who will finally walk in the Spirit (Gal. 5:16. ESV) by honoring the Truth, Jesus, who says "I am...the truth" (John 14:6, ESV).

Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross is a blessing for all of humanity because He is "the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe" (1 Tim. 4:10, ESV). But, according to Scripture, by the end of the ages everyone will become a believer and do it by their own free will.

Sanctified. While the born again have been given His Spirit, we will not receive His heart—a heart that is NOT deceitful or wicked—until He returns to earth. He had Paul write the following:

Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed (1 Cor. 15:51-52, ESV).

The Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord (1 Thess. 4:16-17, ESV).

The Bible doesn't say *when* everyone else will receive their new heart and spirit but my guess is that it'll be when they finally start obeying Him, whether that's during the next age or the last age. I'm thinking the "torment" (Rev. 18:7 below) people will suffer during the "second death" (Rev. 2:11, ESV) will be either mostly or entirely due to their guilt since they'll finally be enlightened to what Jesus did for all of us and admit what they've done. And for some that's going to be pretty hard. At some point everyone will be *overcome* with guilt because we were *all* made in the image of God who is love (Gen. 1:26 & 1 John 4:8). And born again Christians are going to be feeling some of that torment pretty soon, which will finally move them to actually become faithful to Christ.



Revelation 18:7, ESV As she glorified herself and lived in luxury, so give her a like measure of torment and mourning, since in her heart she says, 'I sit as a queen, I am no widow, and mourning I shall never see.'


Genesis 1:26, ESV God said, Let us make man in our image.

1 John 4:8, ESV God is love.

In any case, Jesus modeled for us what He did for all of us, both before and after His resurrection.

Before His Resurrection: During His life on earth Jesus revealed what a person with a pure heart and pure spirit would live like. Unlike everyone else who has ever lived, Jesus honored the Father and loved all people, no matter how cruel. It's how Christians *should* have been living. But we haven't because while we have His Spirit inside of us, helping us, we're still stuck with our heart that is "deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked" (Jer. 17:9, KJV). It's the reason the New Testament repeatedly admonishes us to "work out...our own salvation with fear and trembling" (Phil. 2:12, ESV) and "fan into flame the gift of God" (2 Tim. 1:6, NIV), "tak[ing] every thought captive to obey Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5, ESV) so that we "do not deceive...ourselves" (1 Cor. 3:18, NIV), for example. Not having taken Jesus very seriously, historically, we've deceived ourselves in many ways. I'm covering over 30 of them on a playlist I'm calling *Lies Christians Peddle*.

After His Resurrection: After He resurrected from the grave and before He ascended back to heaven, Jesus spent 40 days revealing to us what He's done for all of us, given us eternal life with incorruptible bodies and hearts and minds that are pure and holy. He could walk through walls and still eat (Luke 24:36-43 & John 20). And He was (still) focused on God's kingdom (Luke 24) I discern that's what the resurrected saints/born again will be doing during the next age. Instead of 30 days we'll be doing it for 1000 years, or longer since the literal translations say "they shall reign—to the ages of the ages" (Rev. 22:5, YLT) and "they shall be reigning for the eons of the eons" (Rev. 22:5, CLT).



The Length of the Last Age. I'm thinking that last age will last a pretty long time since Jesus says "I am making everything new!" (Rev. 21:5, NIV) which includes Satan. And many humans will be loaded down with guilt they'll have to work through. And they only did a *few* years of damage whereas Satan has done 6000 years worth of damage! (It's a lie that the universe is billions of years old. It's 6000 years old and God broke it down to days of 1000 years each so that it resembles a week. The graphic is tweaked from Messiah 2030 - YouTube who point to 53 prophecies in the Bible clearly revealing that Jesus will return in 2030. And the Berisheet prophecies makes it 54 prophecies all pointing to the same year. Is the End of Days Prophesied in the First Word of the Bible? (youtube.com).



A Controlled Experiment. To run His test, Jesus divided the people He created into two groups, non-elect and elect, vessels of wrath and vessels of mercy (Rom. 9:22-23 in the graphic).



In the Old Testament days God did everything for the Jews and they still rebelled against Him so that He said "What more could have been done for my vineyard than I have done for it? When I looked for good grapes, why did it yield only bad?" (Isa. 5:4, NIV). This is the same way it's played out with the body of Christ. Given even more than the Jews-Gods Spirit within for those who initially obeyed Him and the completed Bible—vet we've still yielded only bad fruit. It's only bad fruit because even the most enlightened, like the Messiah 2030 person or group, for example, are still steeped in some major lies so that while they're teaching truth they're also promoting lies. So how could there be any good at all coming out of Christianity—as there is, though not much? Because, "if we are faithless, he remains faithful-for he cannot deny himself" (2 Tim. 2:13, ESV). It's only because of God's grace that there's any good at all coming out of our corrupt version of Christianity. In any case, everyone the Lord has used to give me further understanding on some point is still involved in the institutional churches that do NOT represent the Church Jesus is building, as revealed by Scripture which He had me sum up on the table, and as revealed by the book *Pagan Christianity: Exploring* the Roots of Our Church Practices which came out in 2001 a year born again Christians in the United States, and the world, should have been very open to being corrected by God because of the 9/11 attacks. But, while many have come out of that system, the houses churches are really just replicas of the same unbiblical mess.

I discern God has been using the vessels of wrath something like the control group and the vessels of mercy as the experimental group. Since Jesus says "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him" (John 6:44, ESV), during this "present evil age" (Gal. 1:4, YLT) God is only drawing people from the Experimental Group/Vessels of Mercy/Elect. These people had their name written in the book of life. However, if they don't become born again during this life—as Jesus said we "must be" (John 3:7, ESV)—they'll have their name erased from the book (Rev. 3:5 below). They won't Go to Hell since that's not a real place. But they won't get to participate in the next and best age either AND rise to experience judgment (John 5:29) along with all the vessels of wrath who never even had the opportunity to come to Christ since the Father didn't draw them to Him (John 6:44). While they could have believed in Jesus "there is none righteous, not even one" (Rom. 3:10, YLT) which is WHY the Father has to draw us to Christ. Left to ourselves, none of us would EVER be interested in Him, in the truth—because, again, our hearts are "deceitful above all things" (Jer. 17:9, KJV). God's test proves that our human nature is so deceitful and wicked that given the opportunity and all the information, even the Spirit within, even heaven on earth/Paradise, we still choose Satan—a liar and murderer (John 8:44)—over Christ! I discern those people of the next age who will "war against Him" (Rev. 20:7-8 below) will believe Satan's lies that God s been keeping something from them, that's He's NOT really good even though they'll have experienced His goodness for centuries, literally, since that's how long most people will live during the next age (Isa. 65:20 below). They'll fall for Satan's lies since that's what deceitful wicked hearts do.

Revelation 3:5, ESV The one who conquers will be clothed thus in white garments, and I will never blot his name out of the book of life. I will confess his name before my Father and before his angels.

Revelation 20:7-8, ESV When the thousand years are ended, Satan will be released from his prison and will come out to deceive the nations that are at the four corners of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them for battle; their number is like the sand of the sea. And they marched up over the broad plain of the earth and surrounded the camp of the saints and the beloved city.

Isaiah 65:20, NIV the one who fails to reach a hundred will be considered accursed.

Still, eventually, everyone who has ever lived will fully understand our deceitful and wicked nature as well as *genuinely* appreciate what Jesus did for us. "Then the end will come, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has" (1 Cor. 15:24, NIV) "made useless all rule, and all authority and power" (1 Cor. 15:24, YLT). I used both translations because the NIV is clearer up front but Young's literal is more accurate. Jesus is not *destroying* anyone but *humbling* everyone—including all the fallen angels since He's "making everything new" (Rev. 21:5, NIV). *All* of our so-called authority and power will be made useless by the Truth.

And it's not as if God has been unfair to the vessels of wrath/non elect by not leading them to Jesus (John 6:44) during this age since they've been living it up and God didn't make *anyone* sin. "Each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire" (James 1:14, ESV). And if we lack self-control, we'll act on it. So they'll be "hurt by the second death" (Rev. 2:11, ESV) just like the born again have been hurt by it during this life having died to self, having given up our own will opting for God's instead as Jesus modeled when He prayed "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will" (Matt. 26:39, ESV). "We who live [and are



faithful to the Lord] are always being given **over to death** for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh" (2 Cor. 4:11, ESV). The faithful born again are constantly dying 'the second death' during this life. And the more faithful we were to the Lord as a born again believer, the better our outcome for the next age (Heb. 11), which I summed up with the graphic. We all suffer the consequences of our own actions, and of the actions of others. But because of what Jesus did for us, we will all also benefit for the rest of eternity far beyond any of our wildest dreams. "No eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him" (1 Cor. 2:9, ESV)—and eventually everyone *will* love Him.
